


#### IN MEMORIAM

#### Edmund J. Galla

October 14, 1923 - September 1, 1979



FENWICK LOSES MR. GALLA by Bill Clements: Fenwick, until last month, had its own version of that venerable, beloved instructor of young students at Brookfield Prep-Mr. Chips.

His name was Mr. Edmund Galla. His students always joked about the sameness of his dress. But, as with Mr. Chips, Mr. Galla saw little importance in outside attire. He placed more emphasis on the inner qualities of the person. His students were treated accordingly. Mr. Galla saw his boys first as people, with feelings and problems, and second as mere Latin students.

Mr. Galla spoke often about his experiences in Europe during World War II. He served as Chief Signal Corps Officer for the United States Army in China. He also served time in India. Mr. Galla considered this period the high point of his life. He always stressed how Eastern cultures are so beautifully simplistic. Many times the beloved teacher stated that even though in this country we may be more economically and technologically advanced, in reality we are far behind Eastern civilization.

In Mr. Galla's class, we learned not only Latin, but also Greek, Roman mythology and insights into life in general. He considered of prime importance the time he spent studying Latin and Greek at Loyola University before World War II, and at the University of Chicago after the war. He frequently stressed to us the importance of learning, not just for the sake of earning an "A", but for learning's sake.

Mr. Galla often said that he wished he could teach a class that was not hemmed in by the conventional grading system. He repeatedly stressed this opinion because he wanted us to realize that each individual has a great potential and should take advantage of the chance he has to learn, an opportunity many people don't have, but desperately want.

The last time I spoke to Mr. Galla, he had fire in his eyes and an extra quick step to his walk. He was very excited about the oncoming school year. He told me, "Those kids better get the hell out of the way, because I'm coming!"


Our own Mr. Chips never missed a chance to add a little levity to his classroom. He often would joke about the perpetually sloppy appearance of a certain student, or about the class's performance on a test. Many times he would even make jokes concerning his family. Mr. Galla might put on a comically worried face and rhetorically ask us what to do about his son, Matthew, who was always being sent home with notes from his teachers dealing with his "disruptive behavior" in class. Or he would laughingly offer to pay any one of us to take his daughter Kathy to the prom. (After meeting Kathy, I would venture to guess that neither Mr. Galla nor his daughter ever had trouble in this area.)

One look beyond the jokes, however, reveals the deep love that Mr. Galla had for his family. Aside from teaching at Fenwick for the past 17 years, Mr. Galla worked for the Chicago Messenger Service the past four years. This side job consisted of delivering packages to various places. Every night after school he would make a delivery to O'Hare Airport. He also held a job as a social worker in the city for a brief period of time. In addition, Mr. Galla owned and rented out a four-flat apartment building. Because outside help was too expensive, he worked on rehabilitation of the building by himself.

Mr. Galla made tremendous sacrifices in order to provide the best for his family. His son, Matthew, is in the eighth grade at St. Helen's grammar school on the near Northwest Side. His daughter, Kathy, graduated from the Academy of the Sacred Heart last year, and hopes to enroll at the University of Illinois, Circle Campus, next semester.

Too few people in the world today selflessly sacrifice so much of their time, talent and effort for the benefit of others. When such a person does come along, he should be recognized as an exceptional human being. Mr. Galla was that sort of an exceptional person. Although he is gone, the memory of him will remain with all of us and influence us for as long as we live. He truly was our Mr. Chips. (The Wick, October, 1979)

#### Football Makes State Playoffs

Something special. This bests describes the 1979 Friar football season. After two successful seasons under Coach Badke, some may have thought things looked grim when he left. However, something special happened; Jack Derning came to Fenwick. This man ignited the team into a winning spirit seldom seen in the past. Of course, this could not have been accomplished without an excellent group of players. This spirited team displayed superb technique and comradery in winning the Catholic North Section and advancing to the State quarter-finals.

In Arlington Heights, the Friars put away highly ranked St. Viator 8-0. The following week, they fell victim to a Mendel squad 12-7. But Fenwick was one to learn from their mistakes, for the following week Fenwick defeated a favored Mt. Carmel team 6-0. The touchdown was scored by John Rooney who ran back a recovered fumble for the length of the field. After this, the excellent defense shutout Mt. Carmel for three quarters. The following Sunday at Oak Park Stadium, the Friars were to face their most difficult opponent thus far. This team was Brother Rice.










After a tough defensive struggle, Brother Rice downed Fenwick 7-0 in the final seconds. The Friars record turned to 2-2, not a promising feature. Then something special happened. Everything came together: the new coach, the new plays, and the new team. Their awesome spirit took over and they proceeded to finish undefeated in the North Section. Defeating Loyola 32-20, Gordon Tech 30-6, Weber 12-7, DeLaSalle 27-6, and Leo 21-6, they swamped their opponents 122-45 in five games and they accomplished their goal. Then the Friars defeated Schurz in the State playoff competition, but fell to state runner up St. Laurence.


Without excellent coaching, none of this would have been possible. Coach Derning assisted by Don Sebestyen, Dave Hogan, and Don Huber put forth spectacular efforts. This spirited squad of 1979 boasted many outstanding individuals. Quarterback John Rooney and linebacker Joe Farnan made the second team All-League and first team All-Area. Pat O'Bryan, the north section's leading scorer, made first team All-League and first team All-North Section along with Tom Fitzpatrick. Center Ed Paras and guard Bill George were named to first team All-North Section and second team All-League. Rob Bonaccorsi, one of the finest fullbacks around, made the second team All-North Section along with Dave Koeller. Coach Derning was named Coach of the Year by the Suburban press and was asked to coach the East team in the State high school All-Star game. Something special. This was the motivation for one of the finest teams in the state, and certainly the most spirited.

# Basketball Second Place In Regional


For the 1979-80 Friar basketball squad, the season was one of steady improvement. Their record, 12-14, shows a season of off and on games, but with constant effort and display of their talent, the season culminated in a very fine second-place finish in the Morton East regional tournament.

In his inaugural season, Coach Jim Krema, varsity head coach, guided the club through lean times until more prosperous ones came about later in the season. Coach Krema was ably assisted by Coach Mike Skowronski, also in his first year at Fenwick.

After a 1-5 start, during which the Friars suffered discouraging defeats to Proviso East (87-43) and St. Joseph (93-64) but did not lose heart, the squad began to jell and the results were impressive.







A five game winning streak was put together before Lyons Township snapped it in the second round of the Holiday Tournament (75-56). From then on, the Friars played solid basketball. A tough one-point loss to St. Rita a few weeks later did not discourage them, as they bounced back to win four of their next six games, including a 49-48 overtime win over Weber in their final home game of the regular season.

The finish in the Catholic League, 6-7, is truly not indicative of the very fine effort that was put forth. Indeed, the Fighting Friars made fine teams like St. Ignatius, Weber, DeLaSalle, Gordon Tech, and Brother Rice worry. Fenwick defeated St. Ignatius, Weber, and Brother Rice in very excellent games. Against DeLaSalle and Gordon Tech (both state quarter-finalists), the Friars provided great competition.

The season of non-conference games was also very exciting. The first game was against Westinghouse, who at the time was ranked in the top twenty. The Friars played along with them all the way, but suffered a disappointing loss in overtime. Against St. Patrick, also a top twenty team, the Friars performed well, but unfortunately lost. Against cross-town rivals, Oak Park, the Friars won easily.

The base of the superb talent lay in the following players: Jack Lattner, John Rooney, John Giannini, John Lynch, Fred Crockett, and Dan Cahill. Jack Lattner was clearly the outstanding player of the Friar squad in addition to being the fifth top scorer in the Catholic League. Jack was named All-Catholic League and All-Area.

For Coach Jim Krema, the 1979-80 season was a year of promise, as many excellent players will be returning next year.





## Swimming - Catholic League Champions






#### Student Council






#### German Club

# French Club




