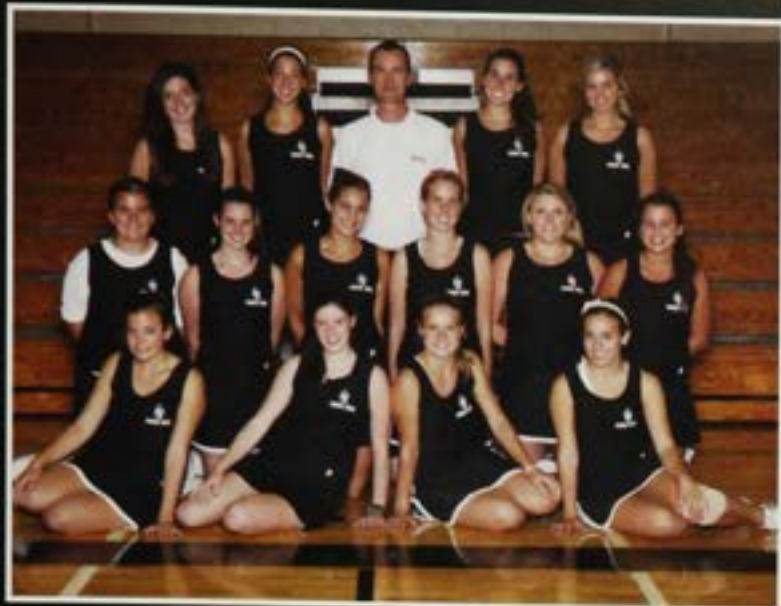

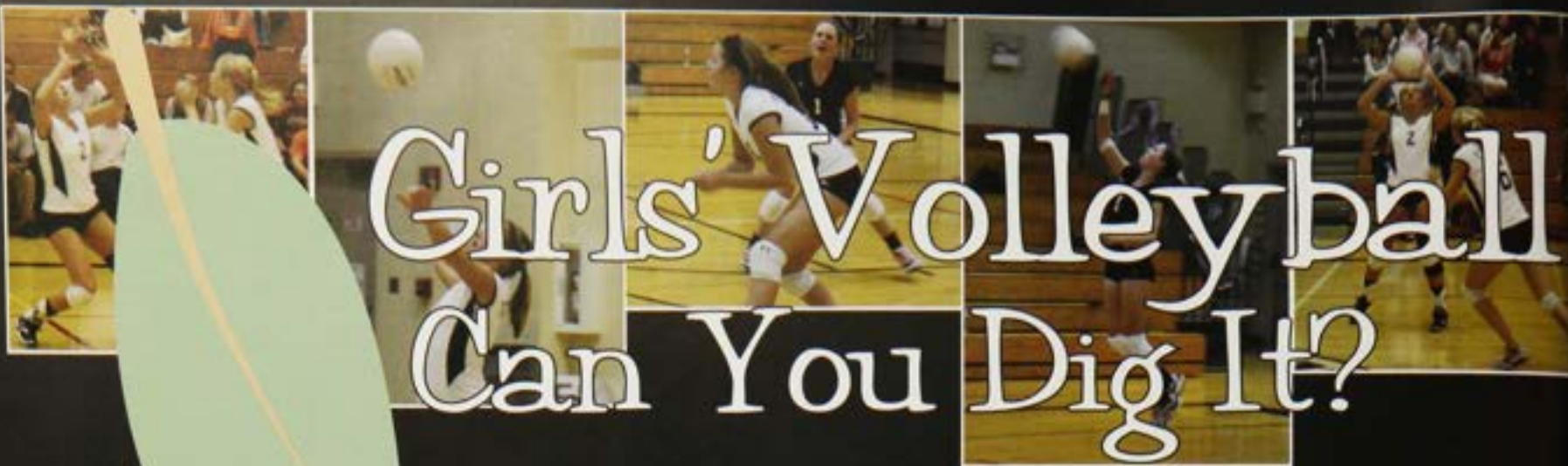

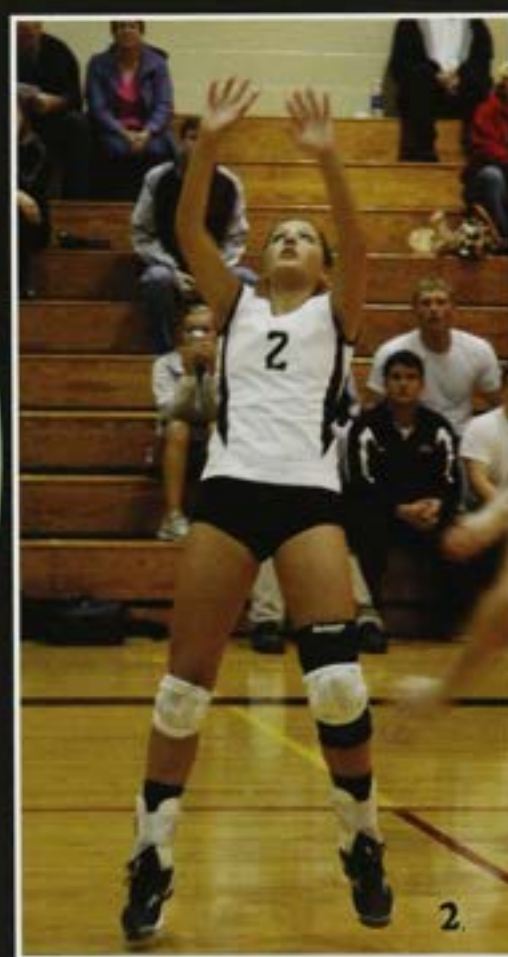

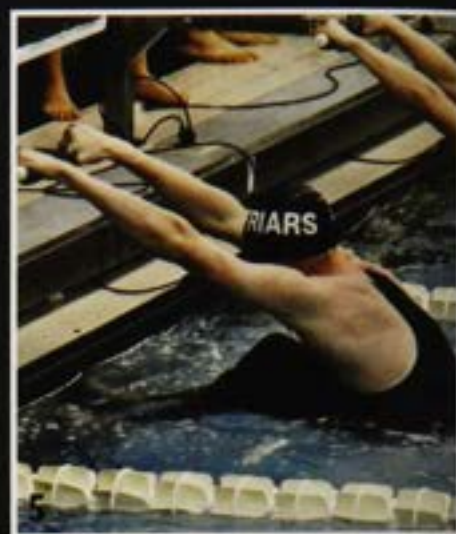

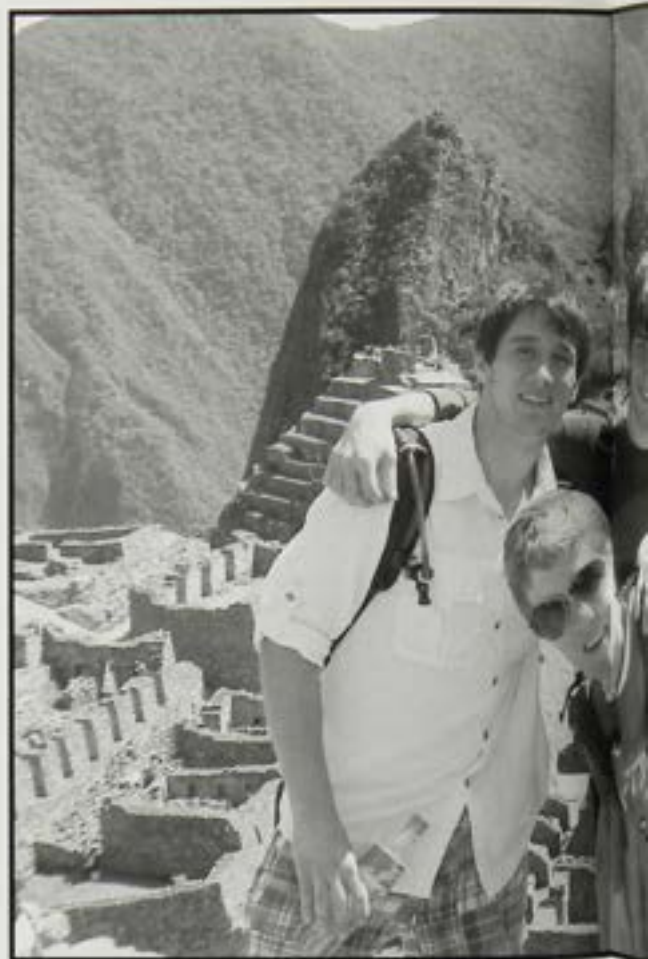

PERU

A very small percentage of the world's population has been to the Rainforest, and of that minute percentage, Fenwick students can say they have been. On July 24, 2008, approximately 40 sophomores, juniors, and seniors boarded a plane for Lima, Peru, where students then departed for Iquitos, Peru, one of the closest ports to the Amazon Rainforest. For one week, the students spent time in the different levels of the rainforest, ranging from the plant-populated floor of the rainforest, to the treetops of the canopy. In addition to making scientific observations and exploring the wildlife that the Rainforest has to offer (ranging from Anacondas to poison dart frogs), students performed service in local villages of the rainforest. After thatching roofs and painting classrooms, the volunteers were beat in a game of soccer against the children of the village. While half the group returned to the States after a week in the Amazon, the remaining group of twenty students went on to Manchu Picchu to explore the ruins of South America's ancient cultures.

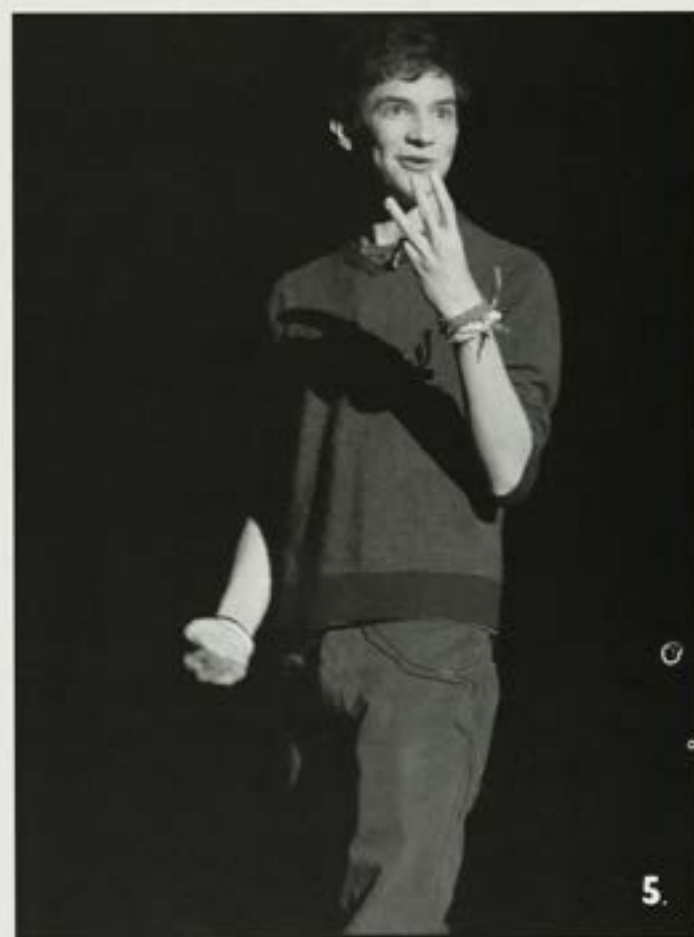

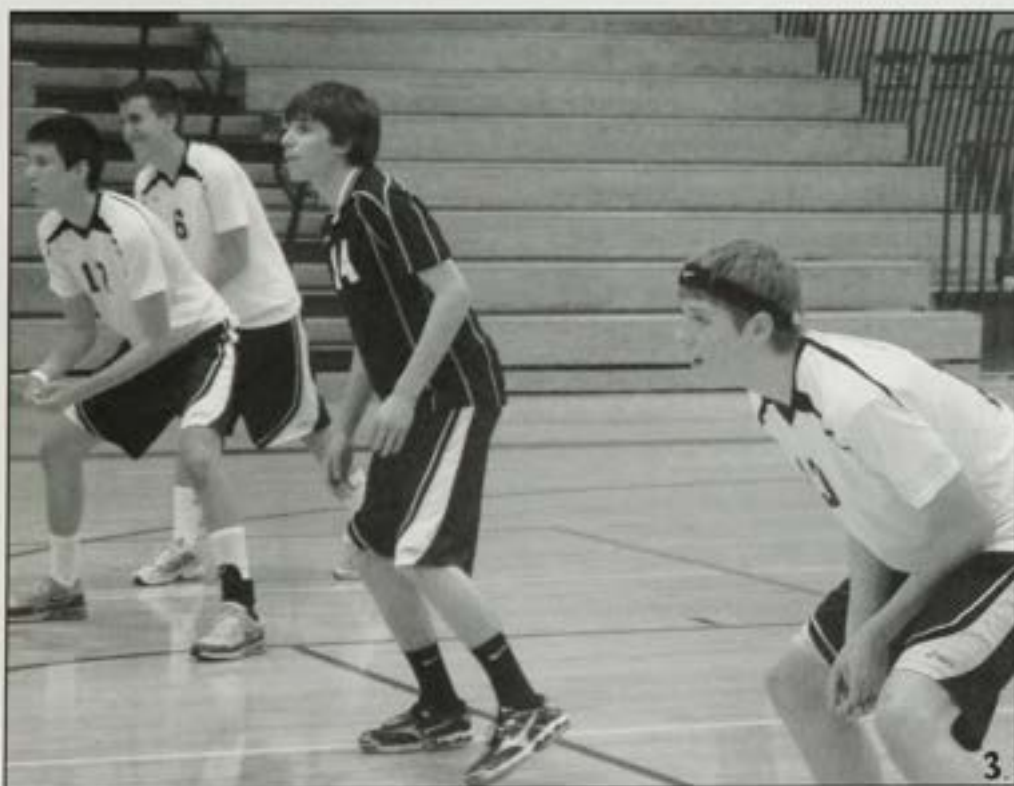

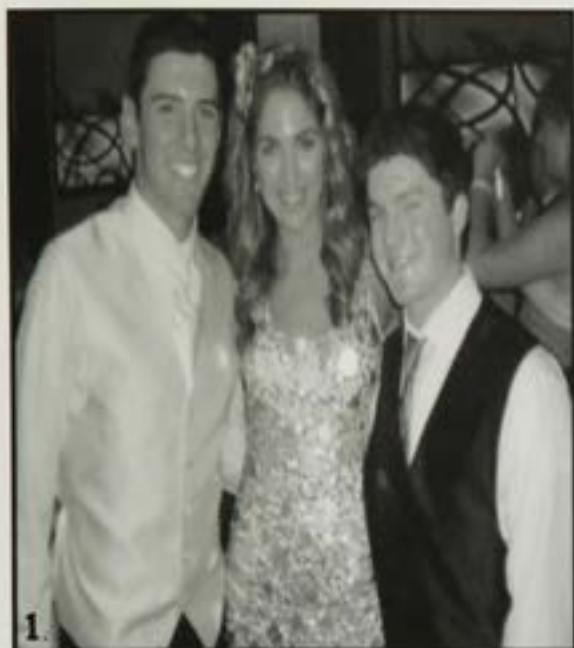

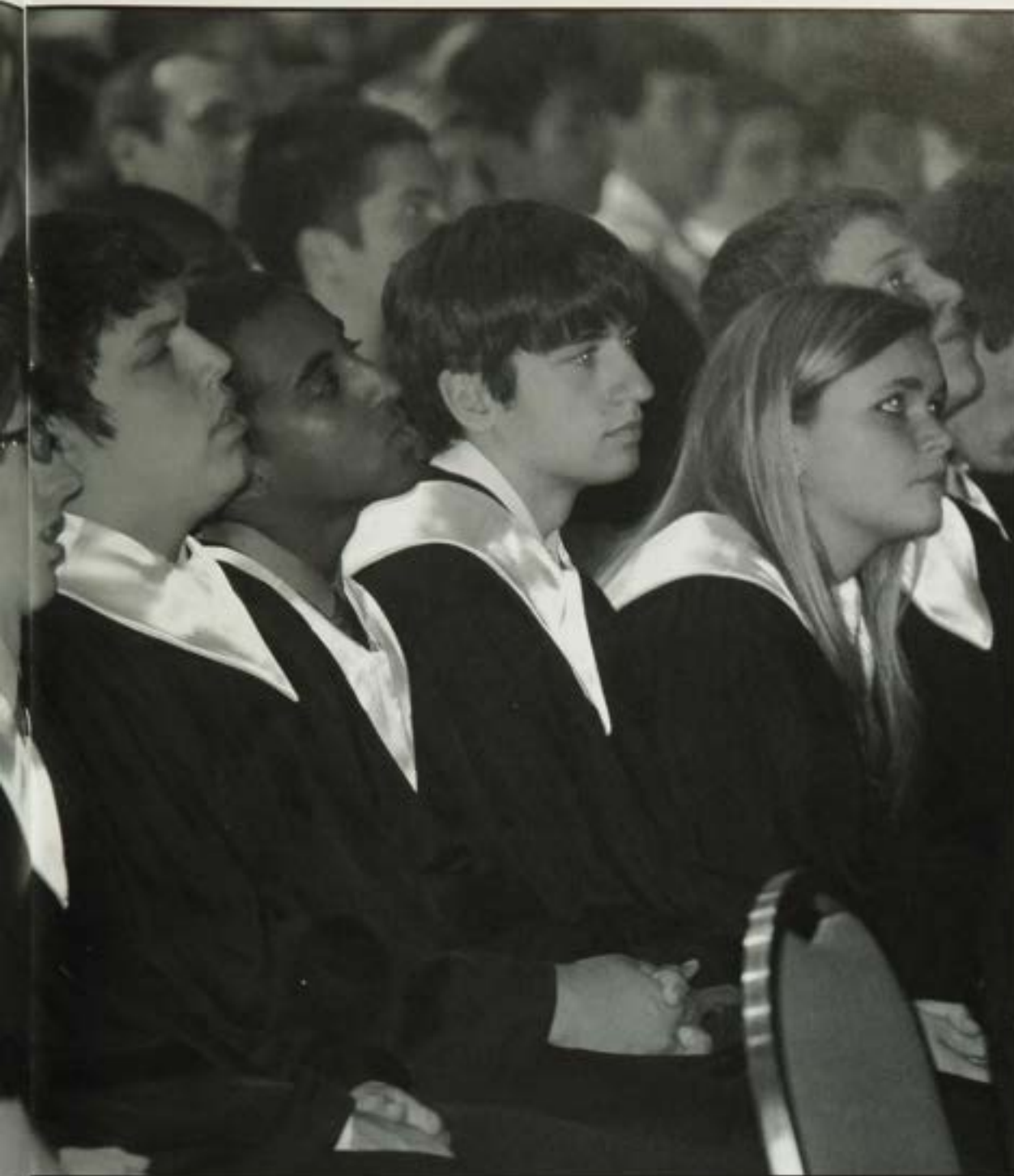
