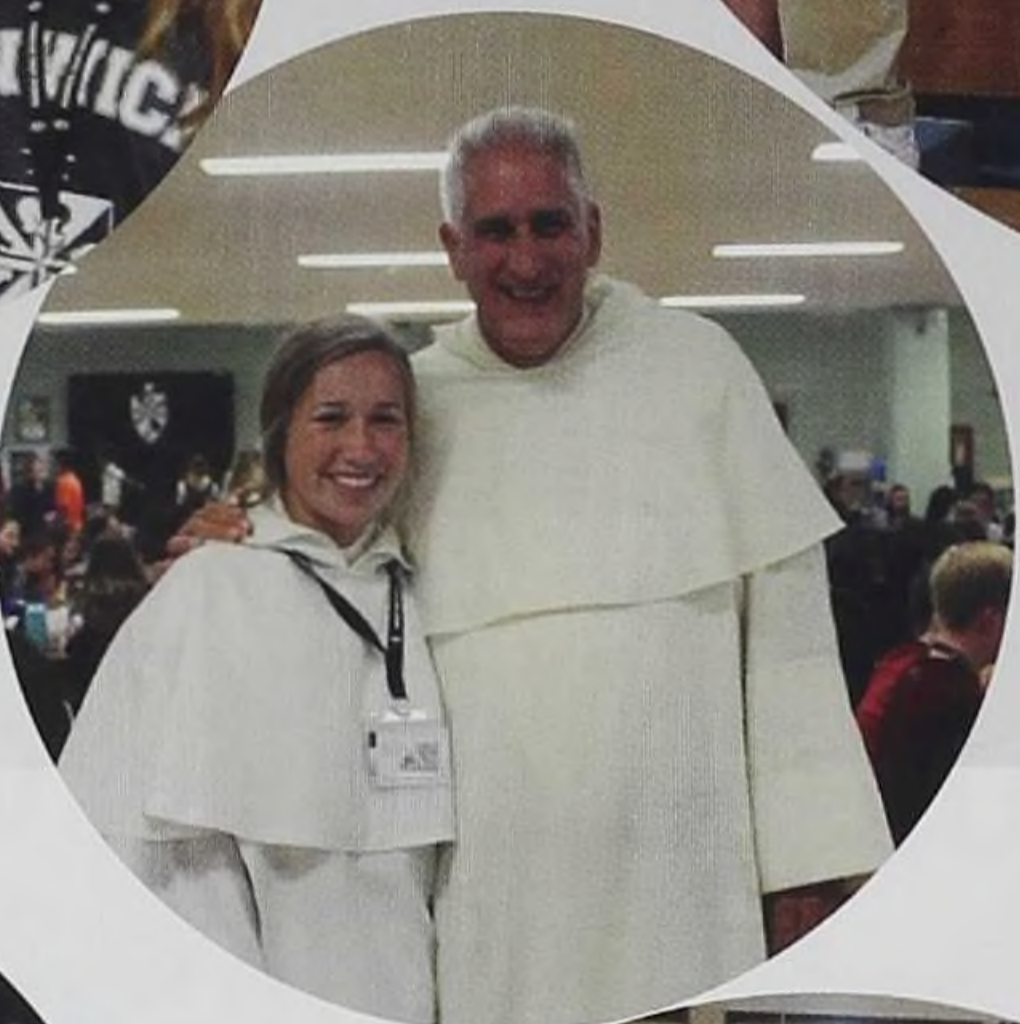

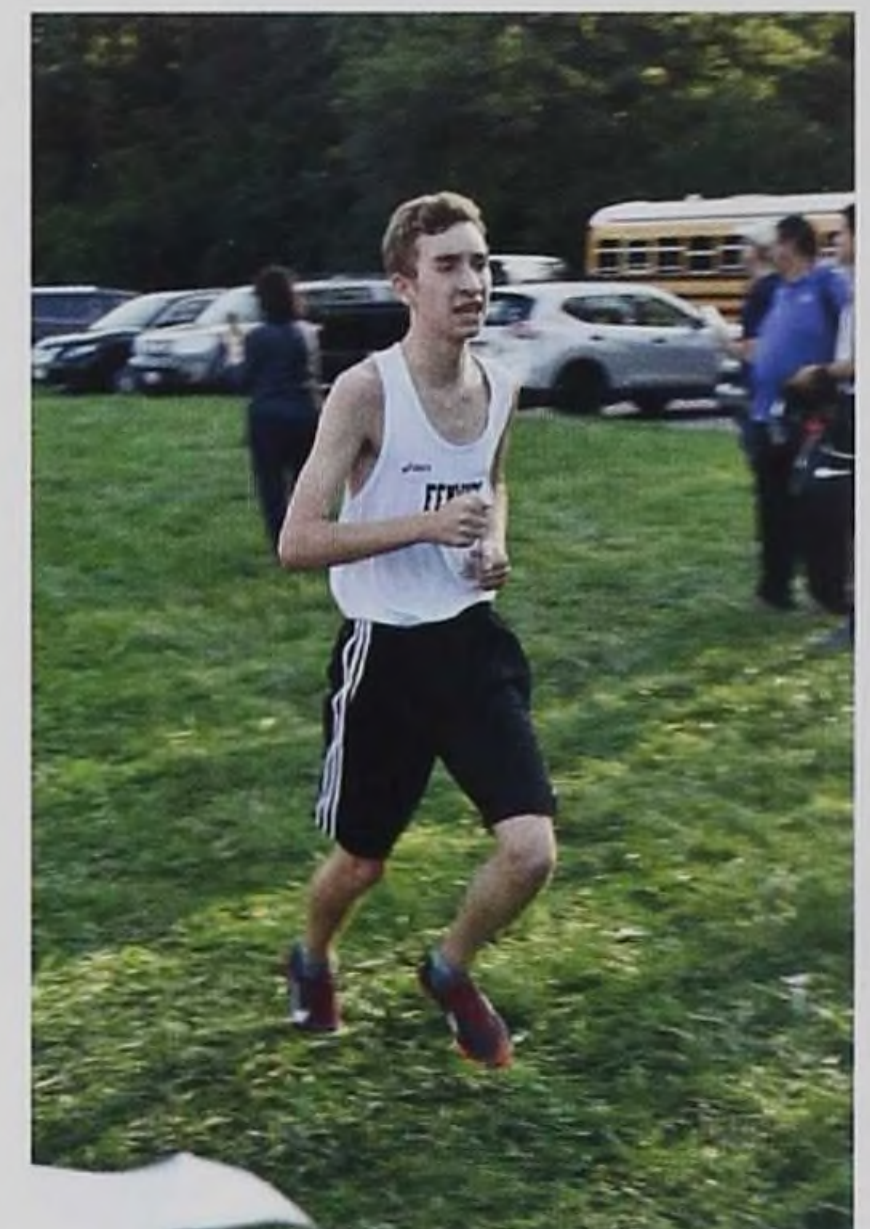

The Friars showed their athleticism at the Riverside-Brookfield Invite, where the team finished in 2nd place. Fenwick senior Joe Wermes recorded a time of 16:55.9 to finish 5th and senior Owen Filbin finished in 17:01.3, placing 9th. In October, the Varsity Team placed 4th at the Chicago Catholic League Championship. The Freshman runners placed 3rd in the CCL Championships, and freshman Lee O' Bryan finished in the top ten, running an almost 3 minute personal best. The Varsity boys went on to secure their spot for sectionals, placing 6th at the Hinsdale Central Regional. Senior Eric Janc finished especially well, coming in 23rd with a time of 16:28.4. The Friars' season ended with an 11th place finish at the Marist Sectional meet. Congrats on an impressive season, Friars!

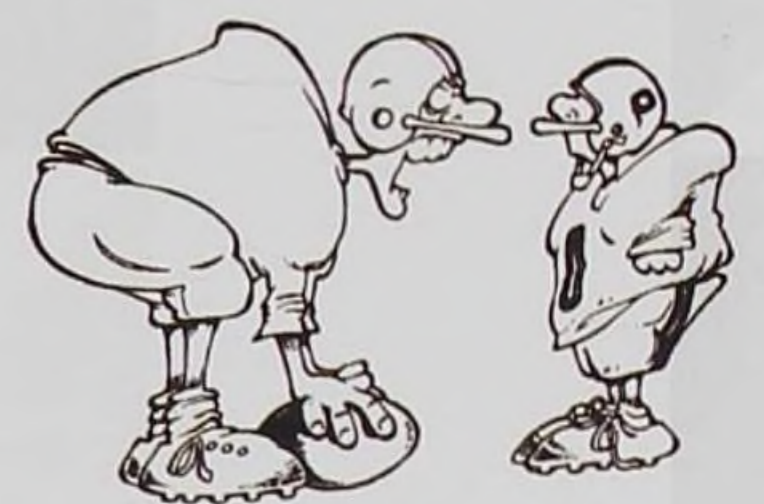

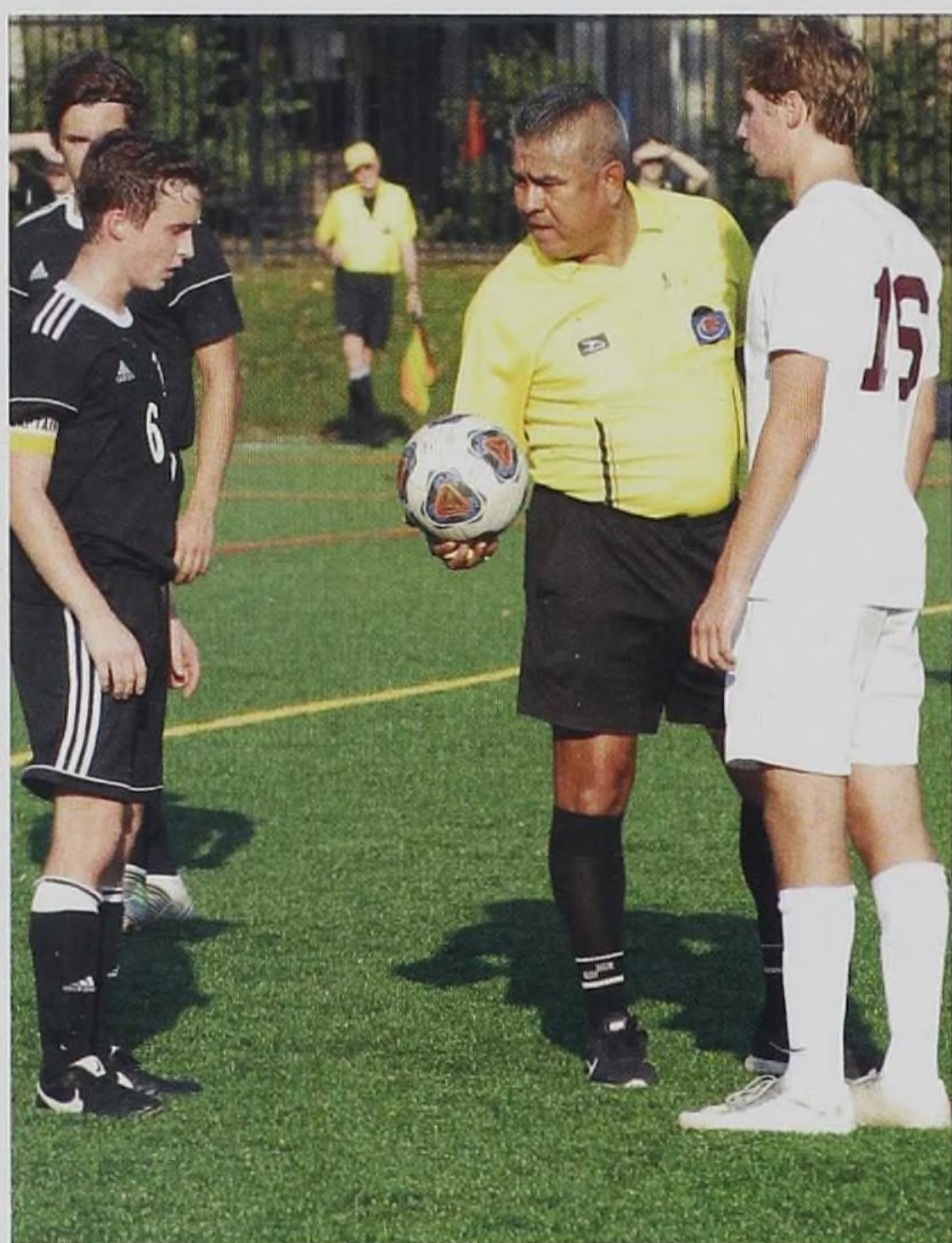

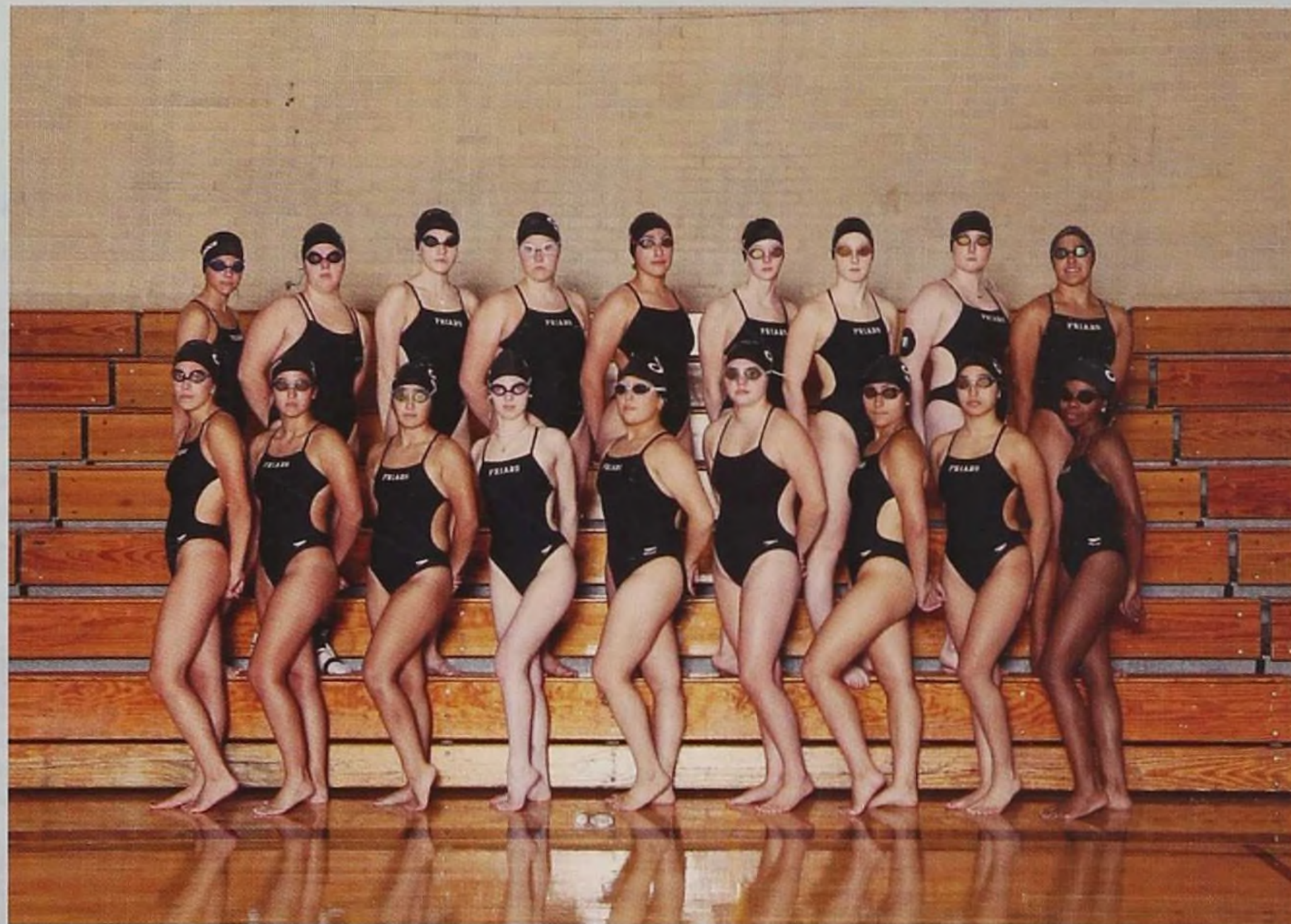


Just Keep Swimming

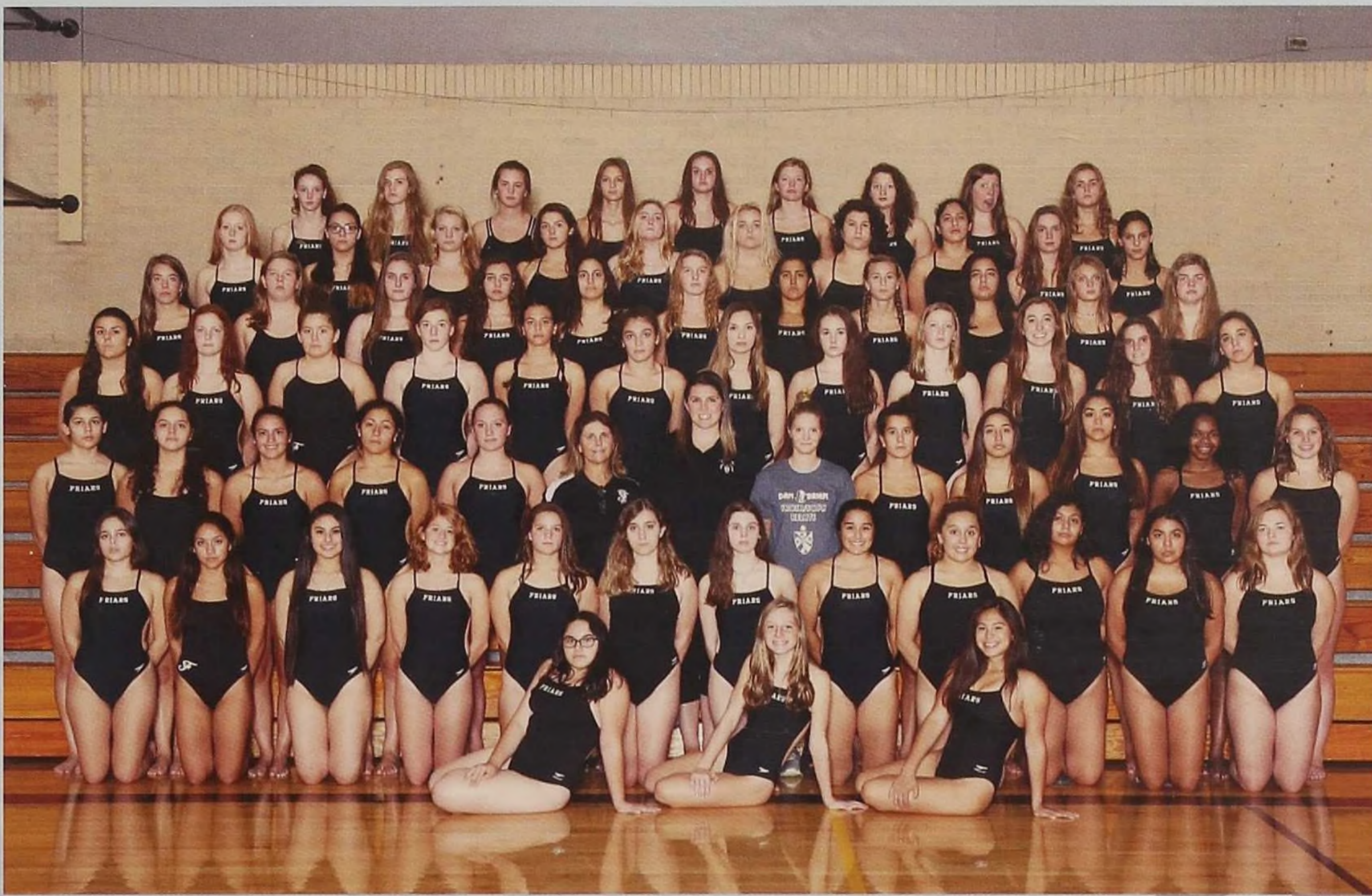

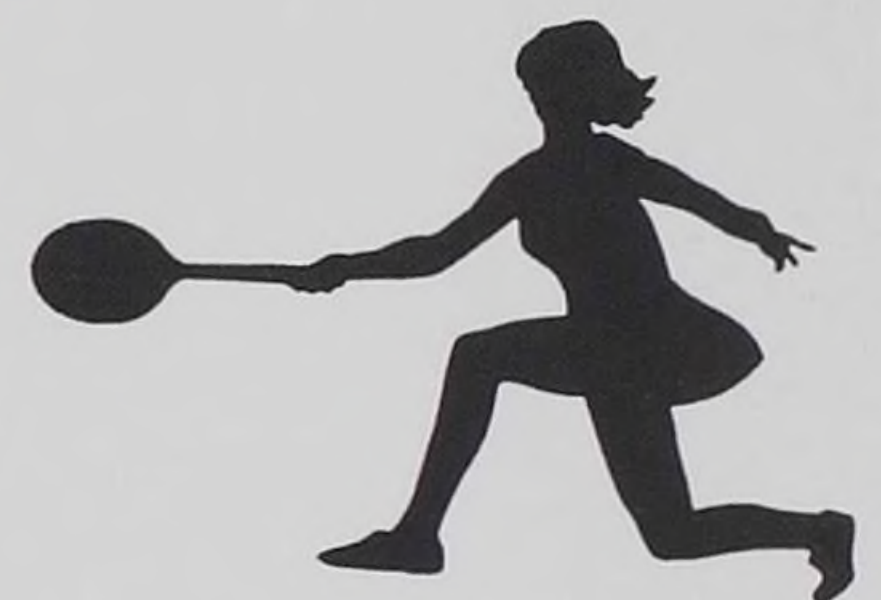

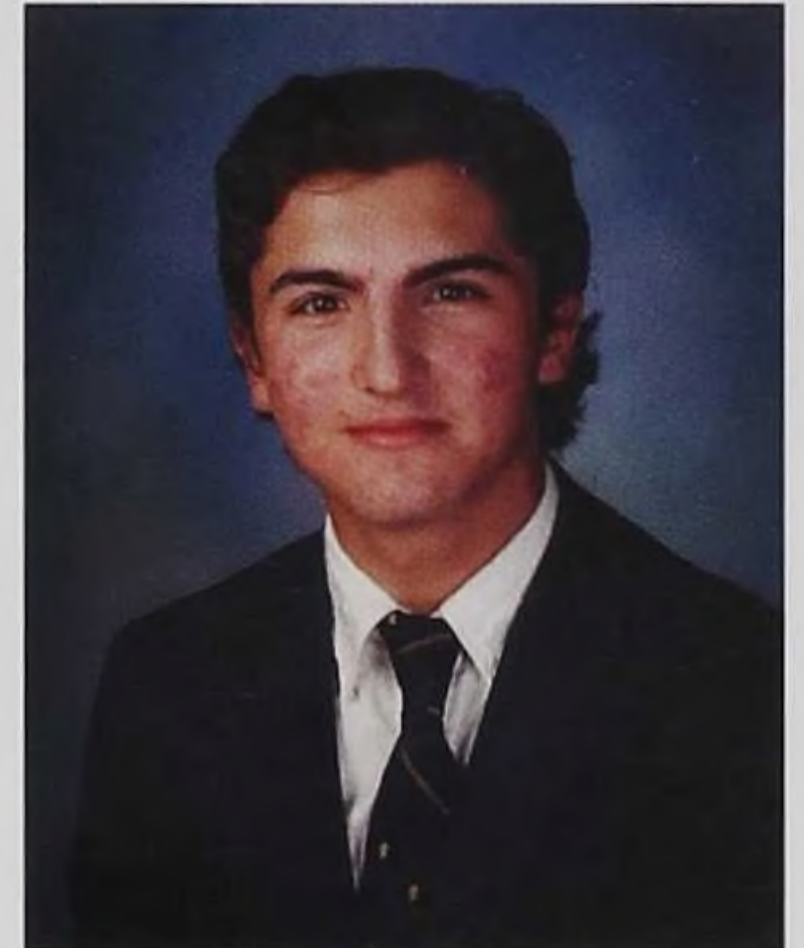

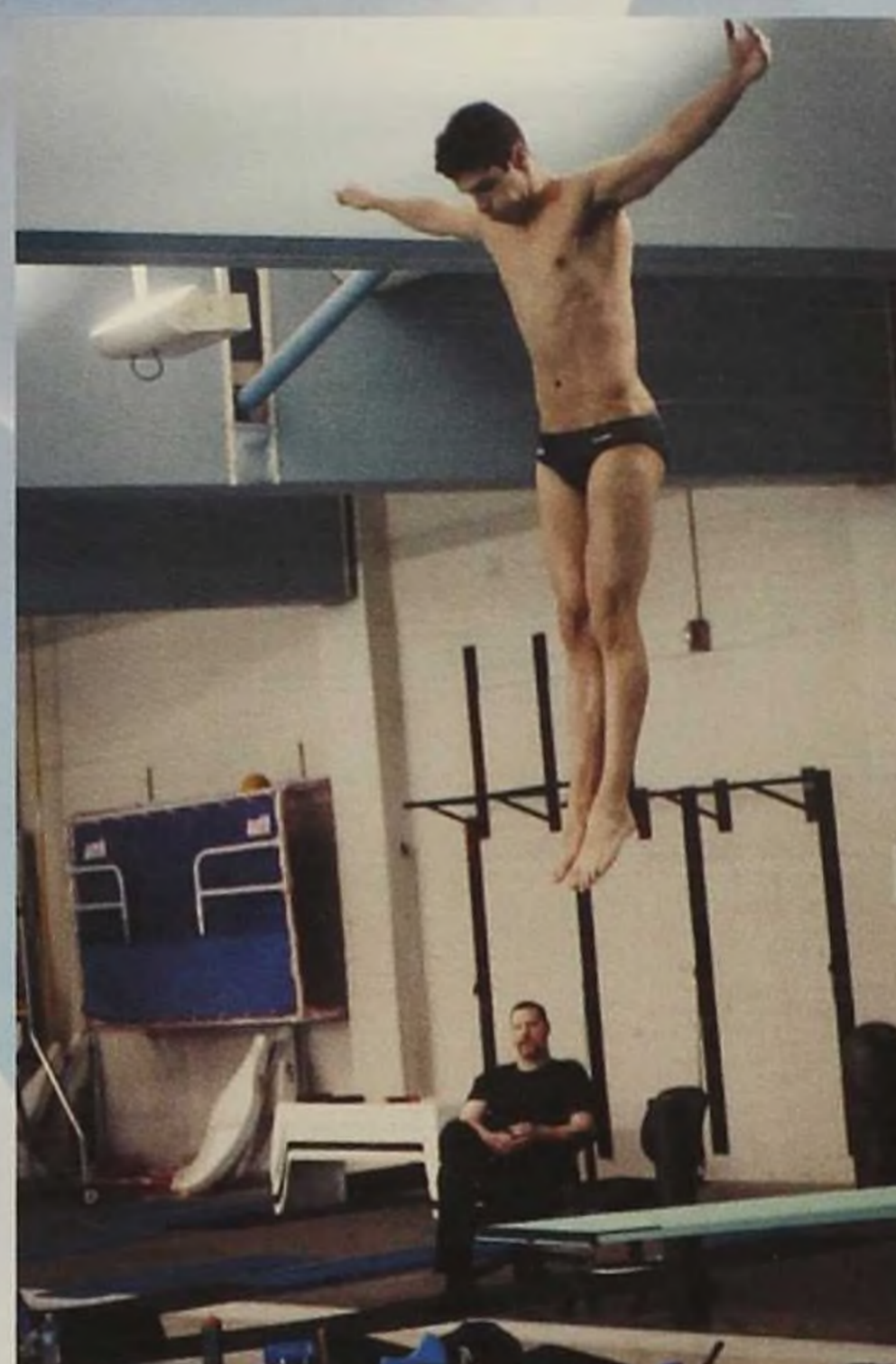

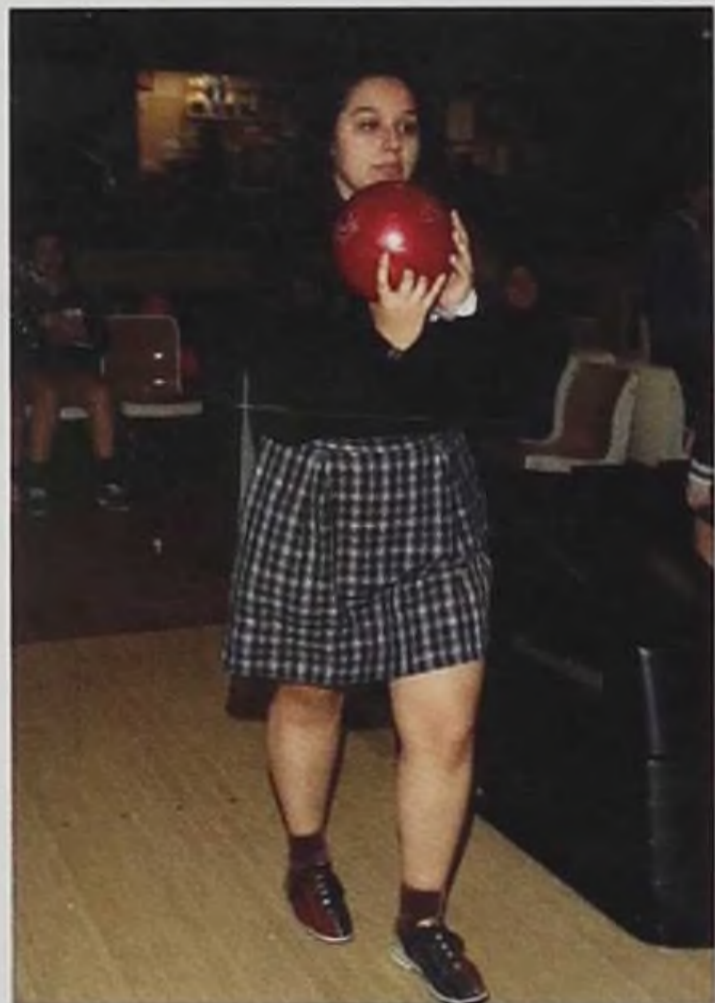

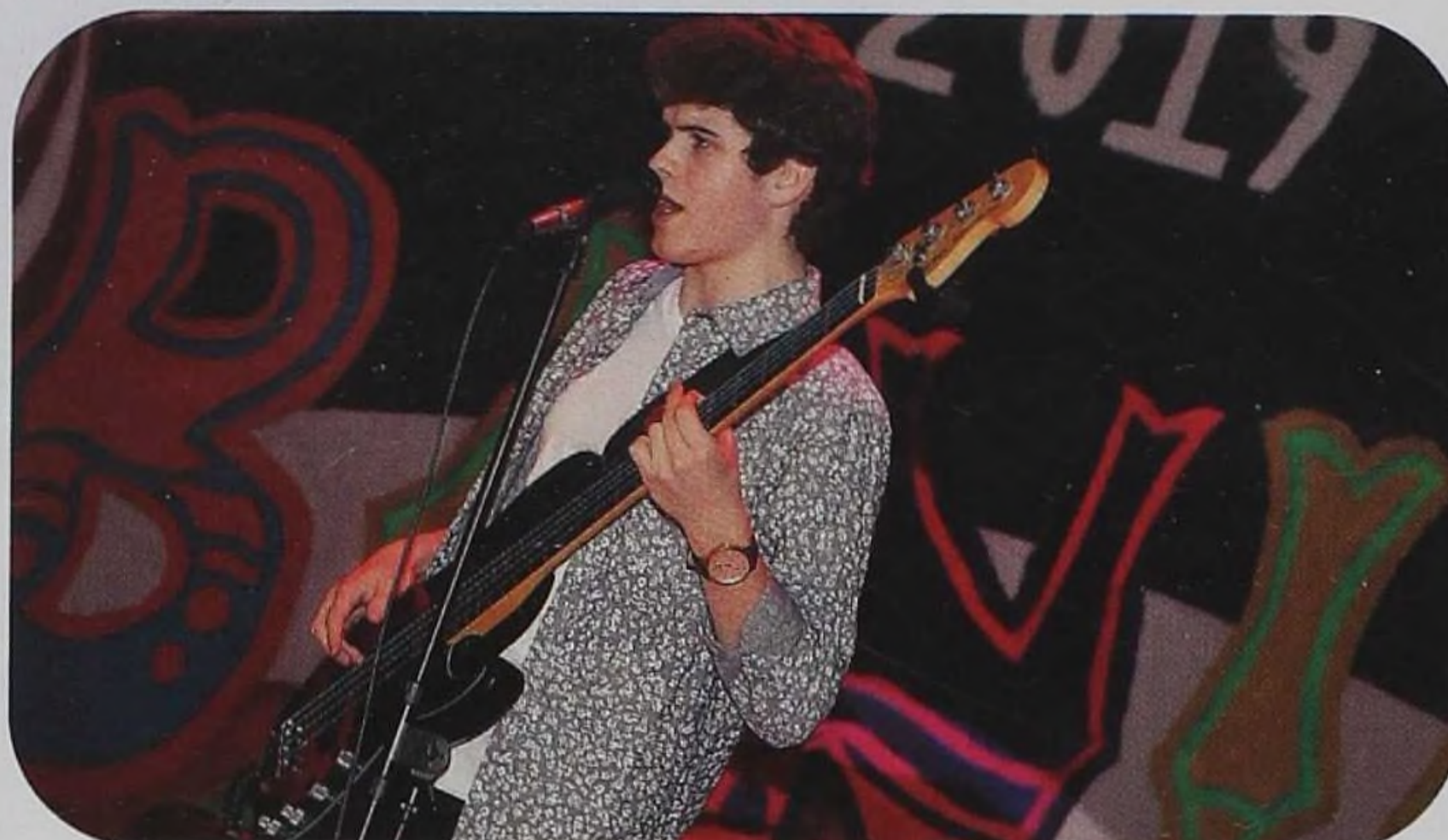

What would you say to someone who is considering watching or participating in Banua?

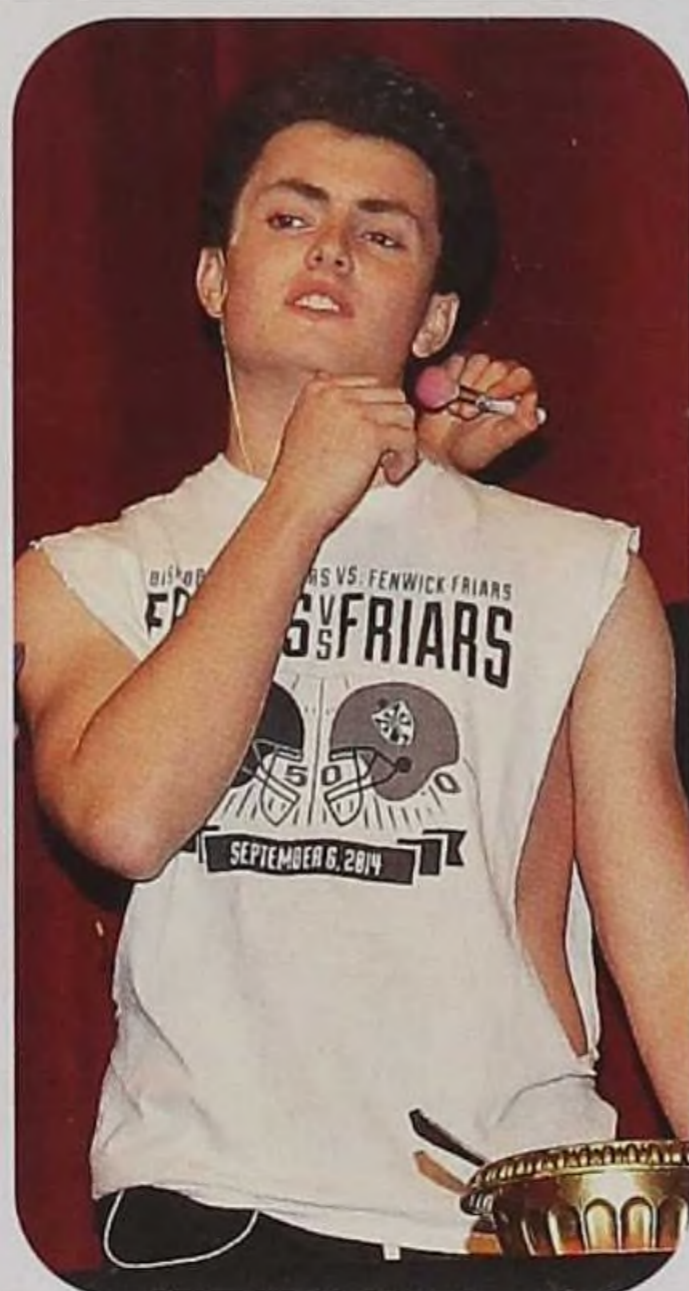
Absolutely do it! The long rehearsals are so worth it. If you don't think a solo act is your thing, join the chorus or skits! Everyone can find their place and their people.

The 2018 Winter Olympics

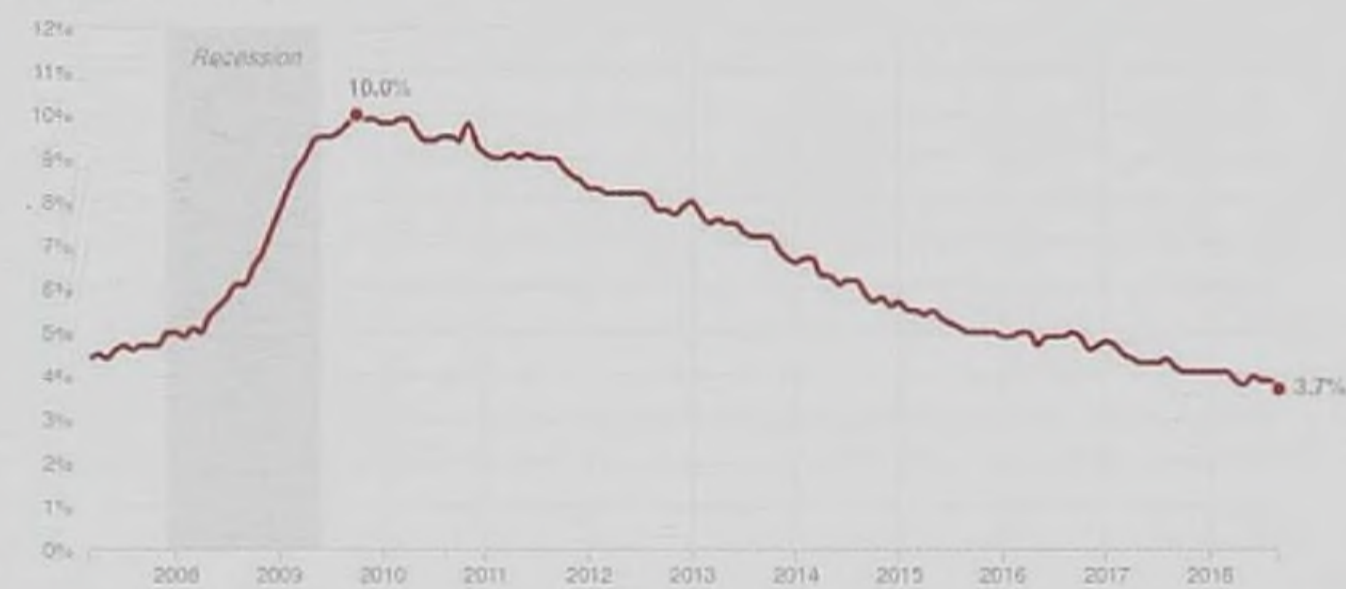
The 2018 Winter Olympics were held in PyeongChang, South Korea. Although less problematic than the 2014 Sochi Olympics, the Games were not without some controversy. Concerns were raised regarding security, due to the tensions between North Korea and South Korea and North Korea's recent missile and nuclear-related tests.

Additionally, the Russian Olympic Team was suspended from the Games following a doping controversy during the 2014 Olympics. Individual Russian athletes, who qualified and complied with the IOC's doping regulations, were given the option to compete at the 2018 Games as "Olympic Athletes from Russia."



Unemployment Dips To 3.7 Percent

The Unemployment Rate Falls to a 49-year Low

The U.S. unemployment rate dropped to 3.7% in September 2018, the lowest rate since 1969. This has been steady progress, as the economy has been adding jobs for the past eight years. However, although unemployment has decreased, wage growth has slowed.

World Leaders Discuss Climate Change

World leaders from over 200 nations gathered in Katowice, Poland for the 24th Conference of Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, or COP24. The conference, lasting two weeks, defined the rules that would implement the 2015 Paris Agreement, which aims to limit a rise in average world temperatures. The 256-page rulebook, known as the Katowice Climate Change Package, is split into thematic sections and details the ways in which countries should monitor and report their greenhouse gas emissions and the efforts being taken to reduce them. The U.S. was not represented at the conference after President Trump announced that the U.S. would cease all participation in the 2015 Paris Agreement.



Stan Lee Dies at Age 95

Stan Lee, one of the most influential writers and publishers in the comic book industry and the patriarch of Marvel Comics, died at age 95 on November 12, 2018. Lee was credited as co-creator of iconic superheroes, including Spider-Man, the Fantastic Four, and the X-Men.



National School Walkout

In February 2018, a 19-year-old man gunned down students and staff at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, killing 17 students and adults. In response, a group of students, rightfully outraged by the frequency of mass shootings, spoke out and inspired a national movement. In the Spring of 2018, hundreds of thousands of students in every state in America walked out of their classrooms in honor of those who lost their lives to gun violence, to talk about the real problems the country is facing, and to find solutions to the problems that political leaders have failed to address.

2018 Midterm Elections

The 2018 United States midterm elections were held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. 35 of the 100 seats in the United States Senate and all 435 seats in the United States House of Representatives were contested. 39 state and territorial governorships as well as numerous other state and local elections were also contested. The Democratic Party won control of the House of Representatives, and the Republican Party expanded its majority in the Senate. These elections marked the highest voter turnout since the 1914 midterm elections, with an estimated 50.1% of eligible voters

submitting ballots. The elections also marked several firsts: Jared Polis was elected the first openly gay Governor of Colorado; Ilhan Omar of Minnesota and Rashida Tlaib of Michigan became the first female Muslim women elected to the House of Representatives; Ayanna Pressley became the first female African-American woman elected to the House from Massachusetts; Sharice Davids from Kansas and Deb Haaland from New Mexico became the first Native American women elected to Congress; and

Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez from New York became the youngest ever female member of the House, at age 29.

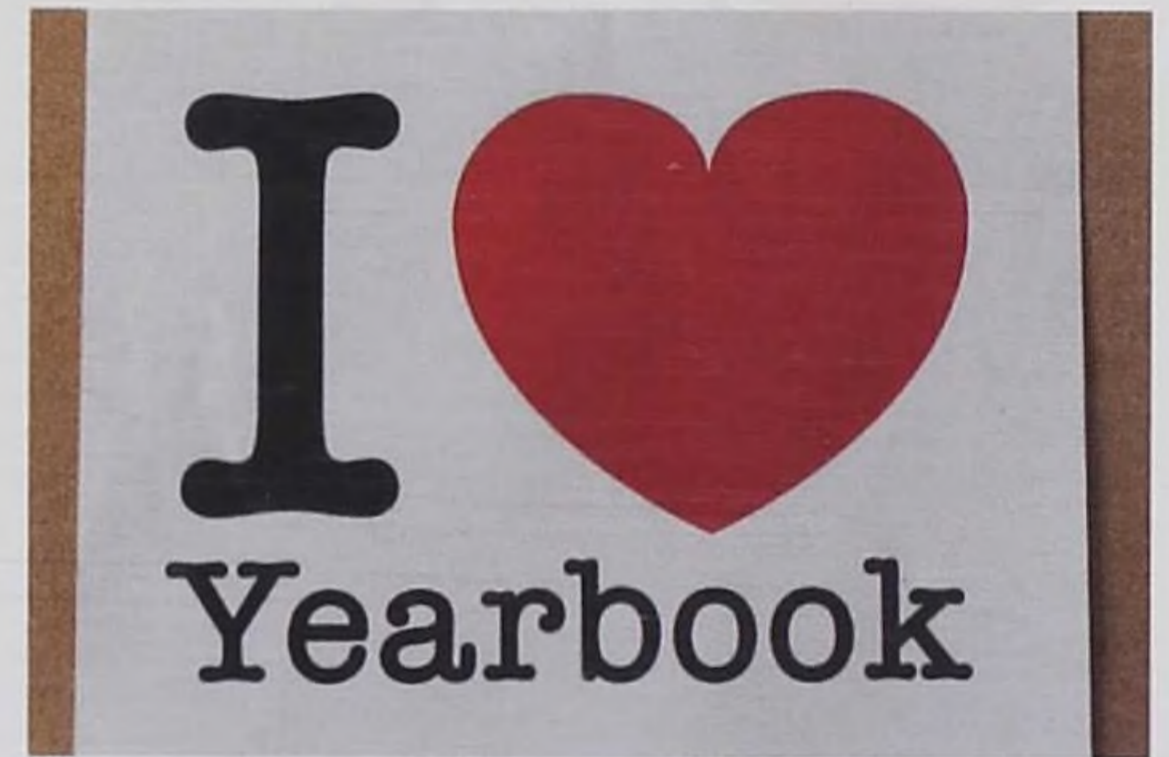
Yearbook

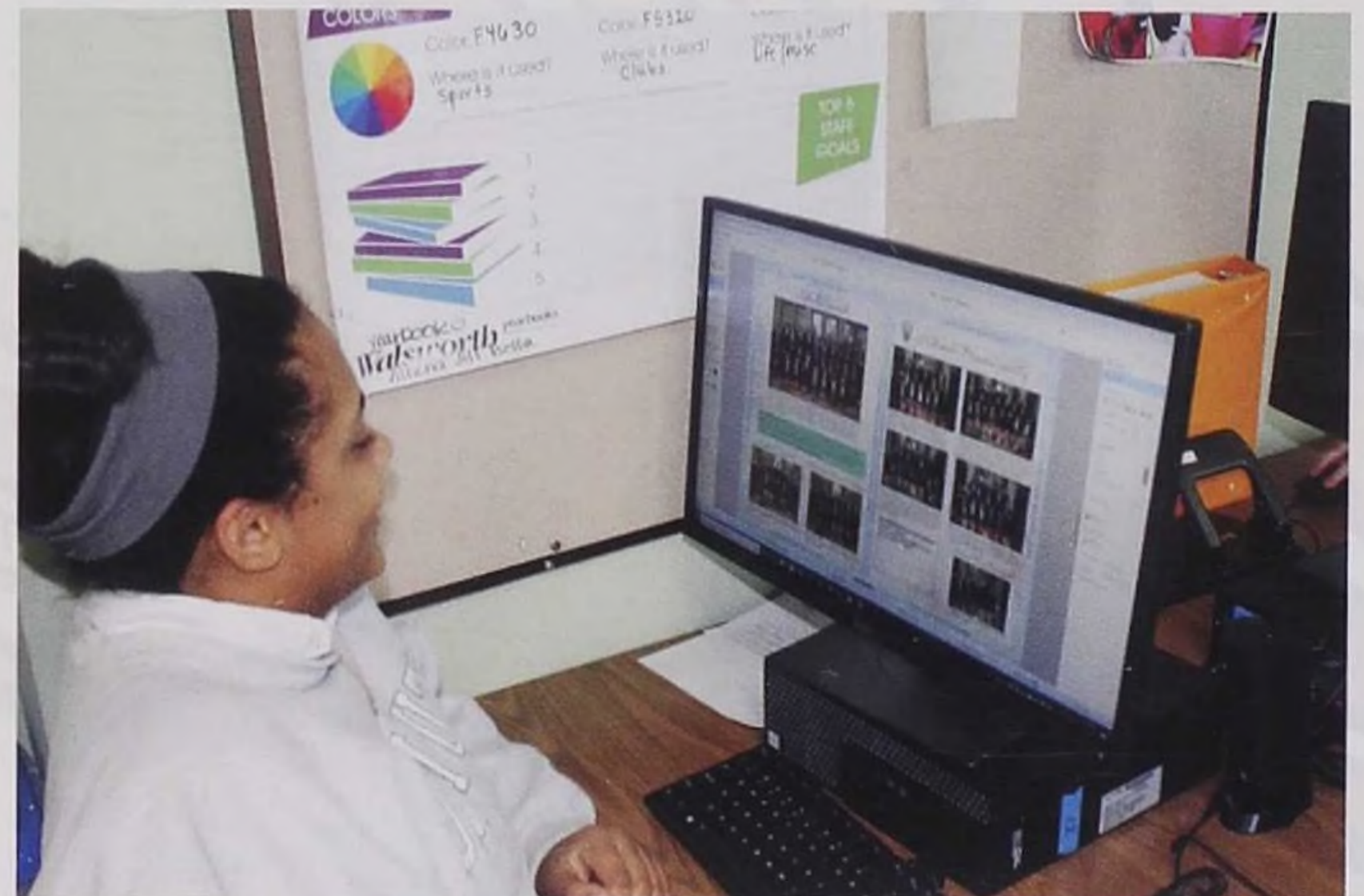

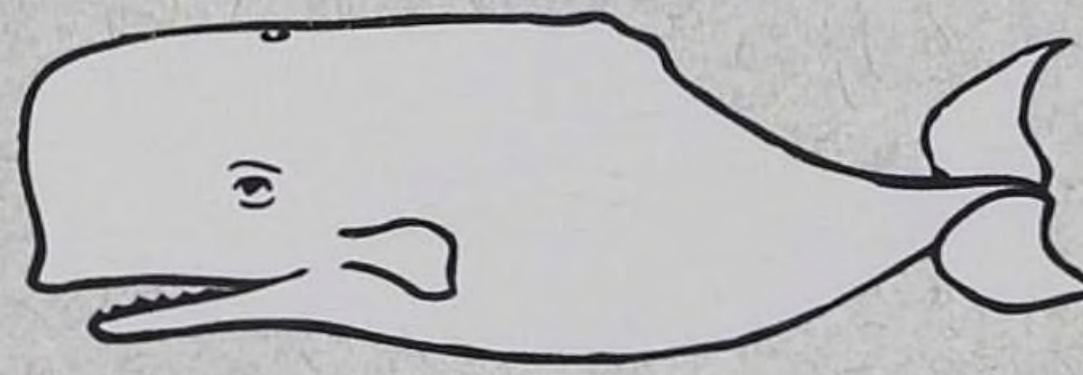

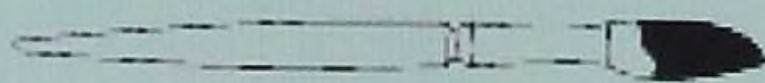

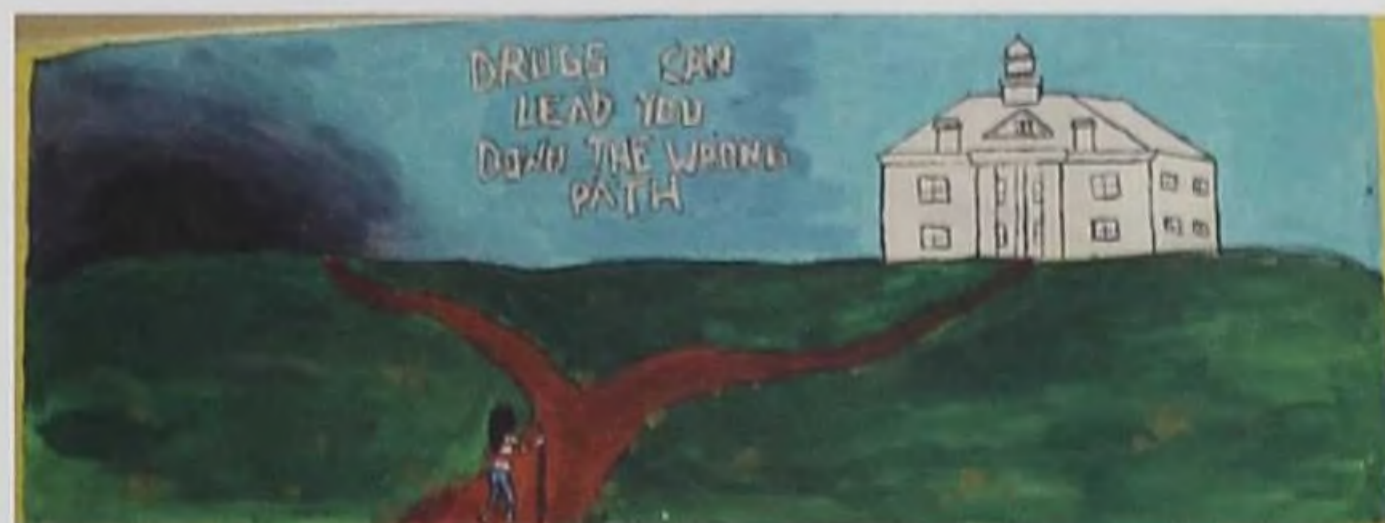

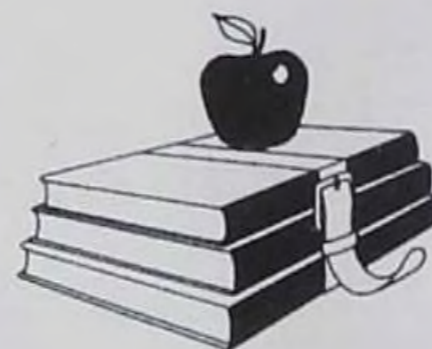

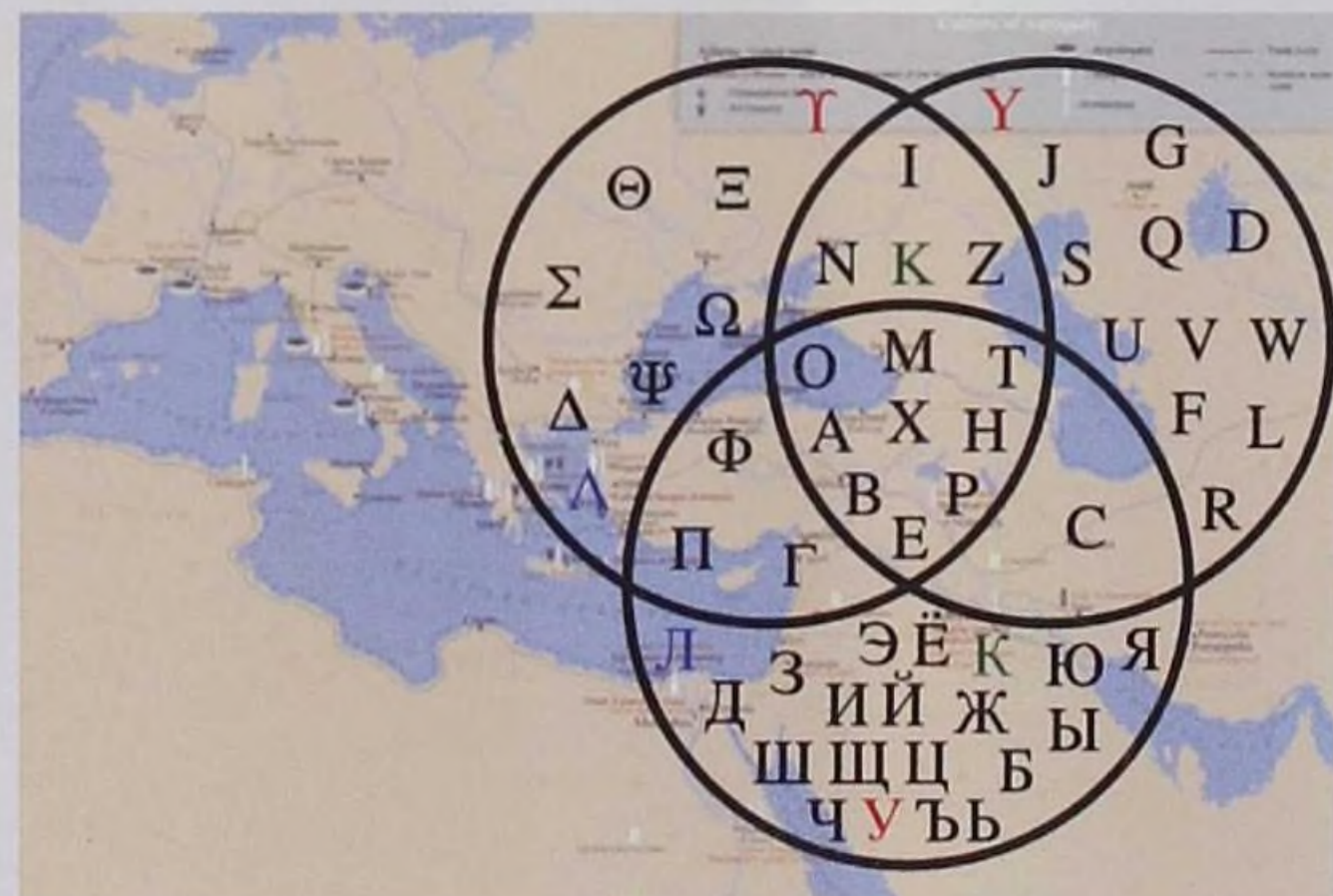

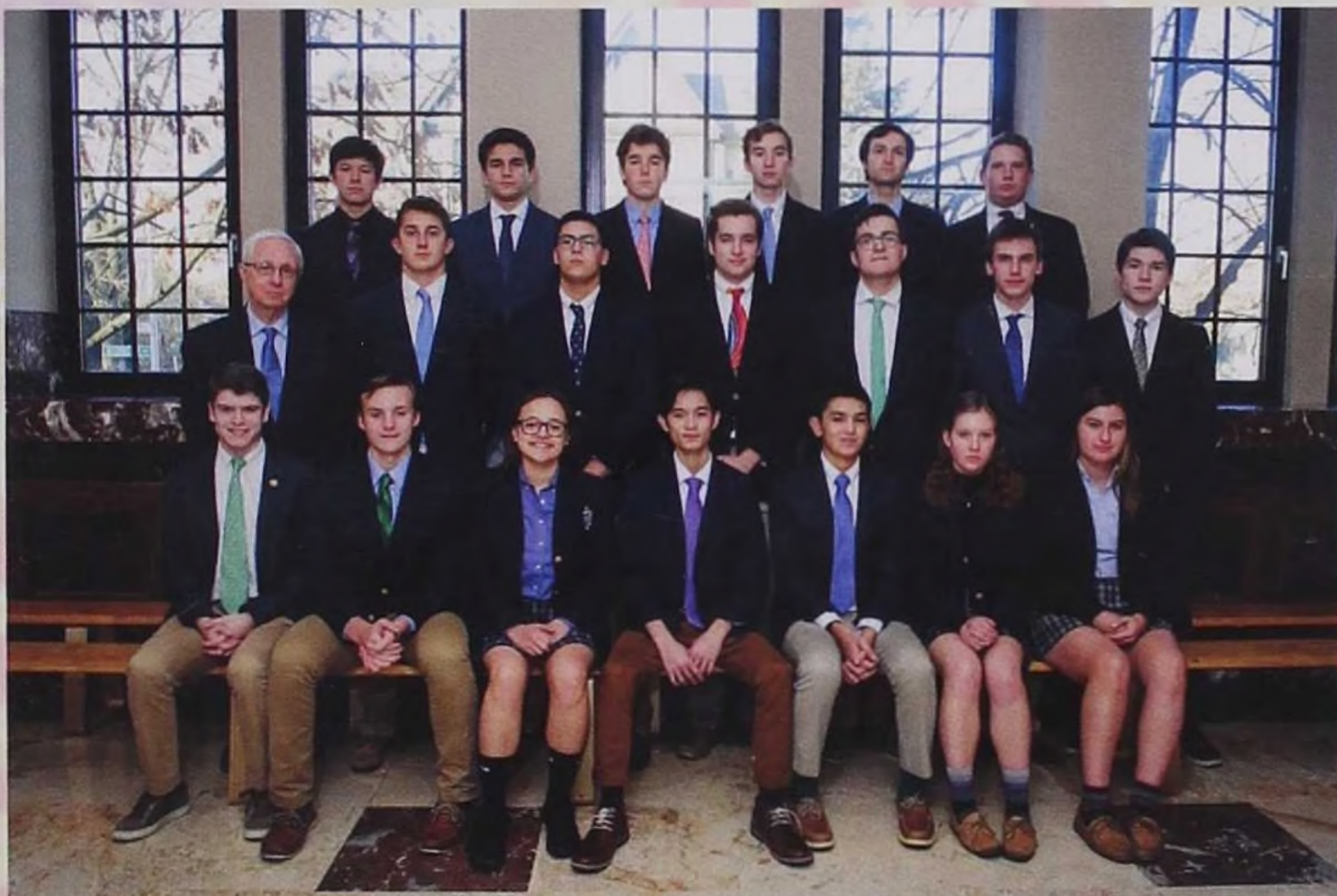

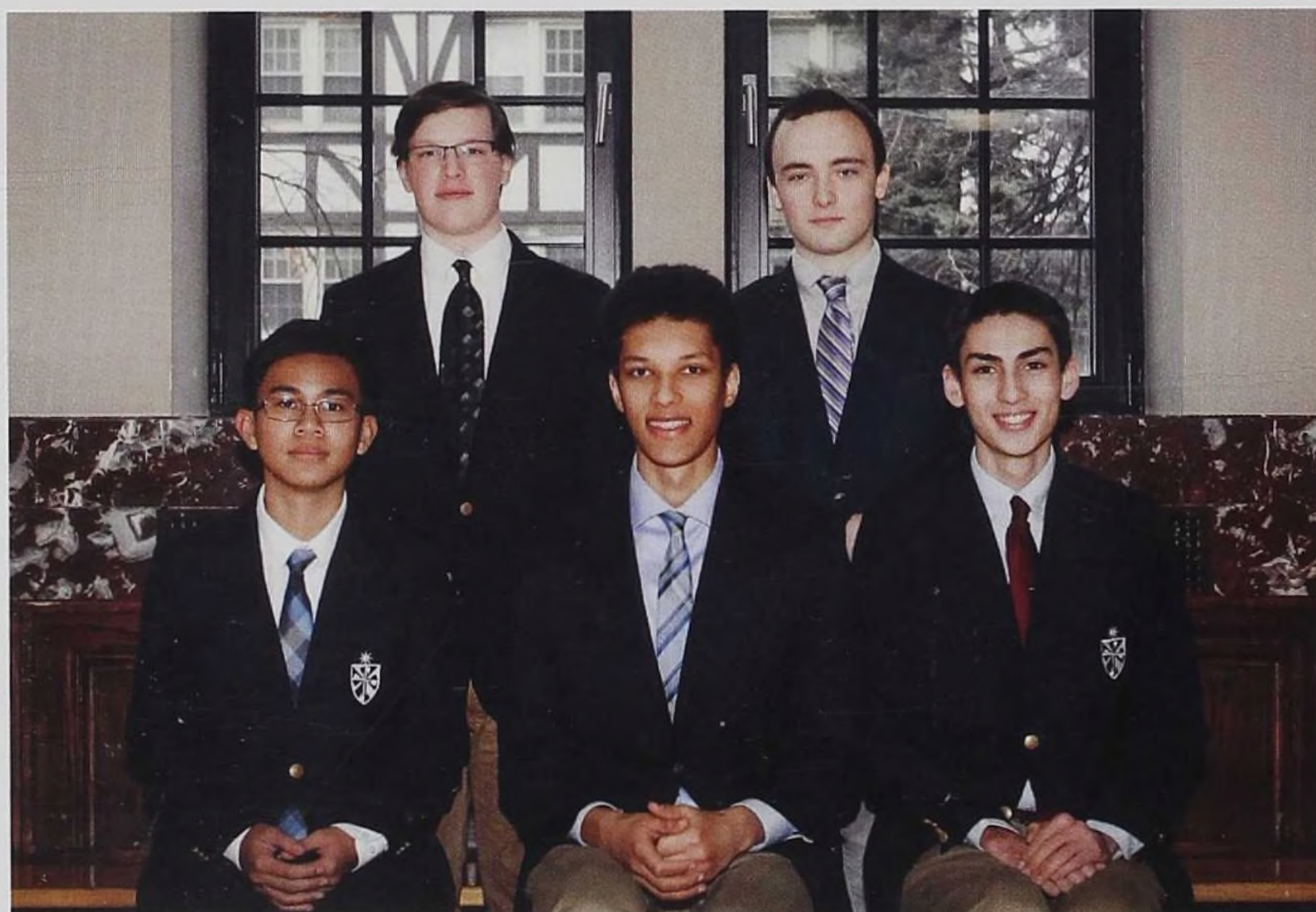

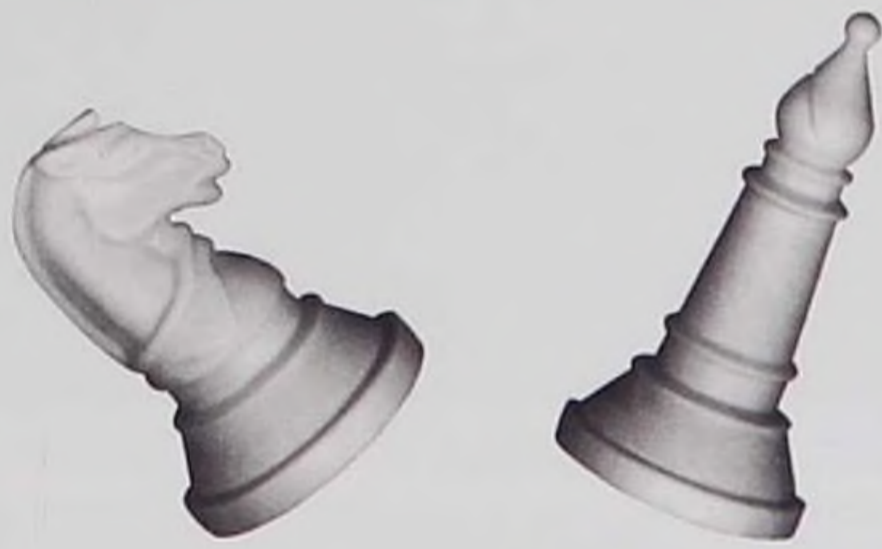

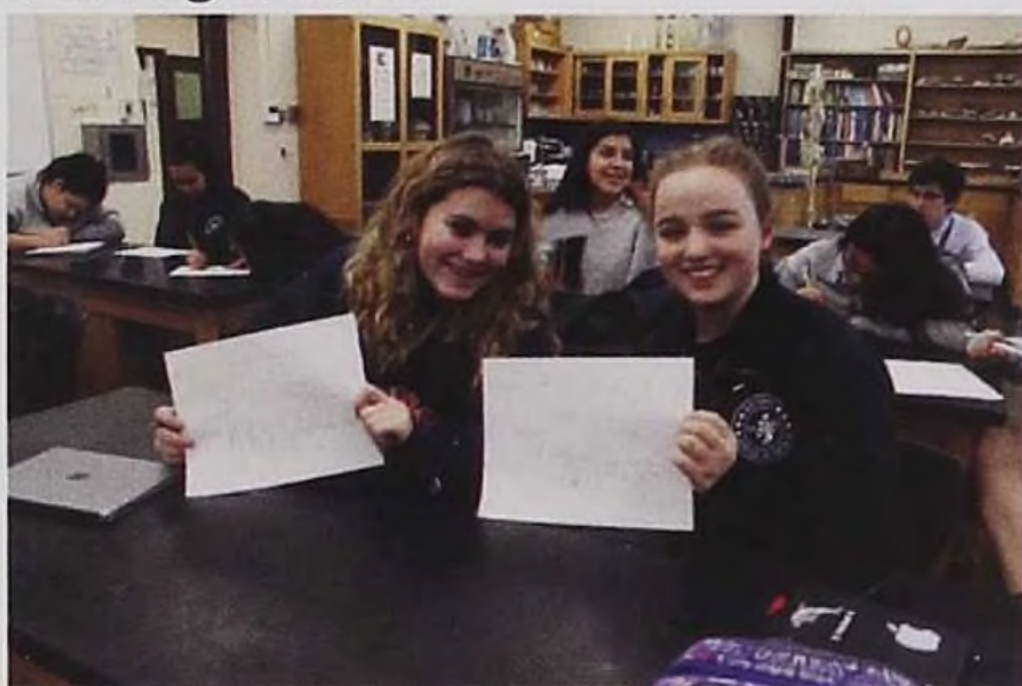

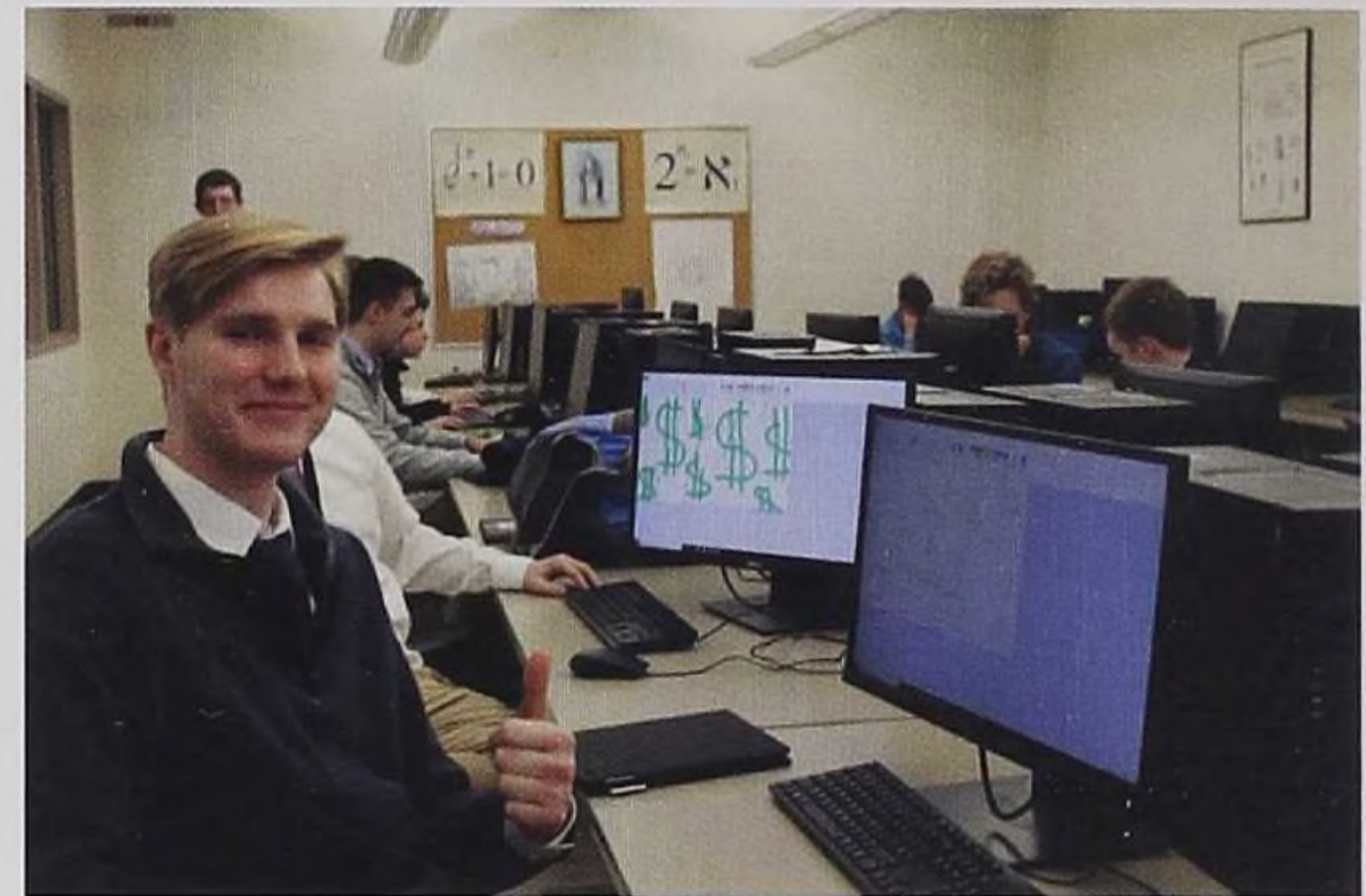

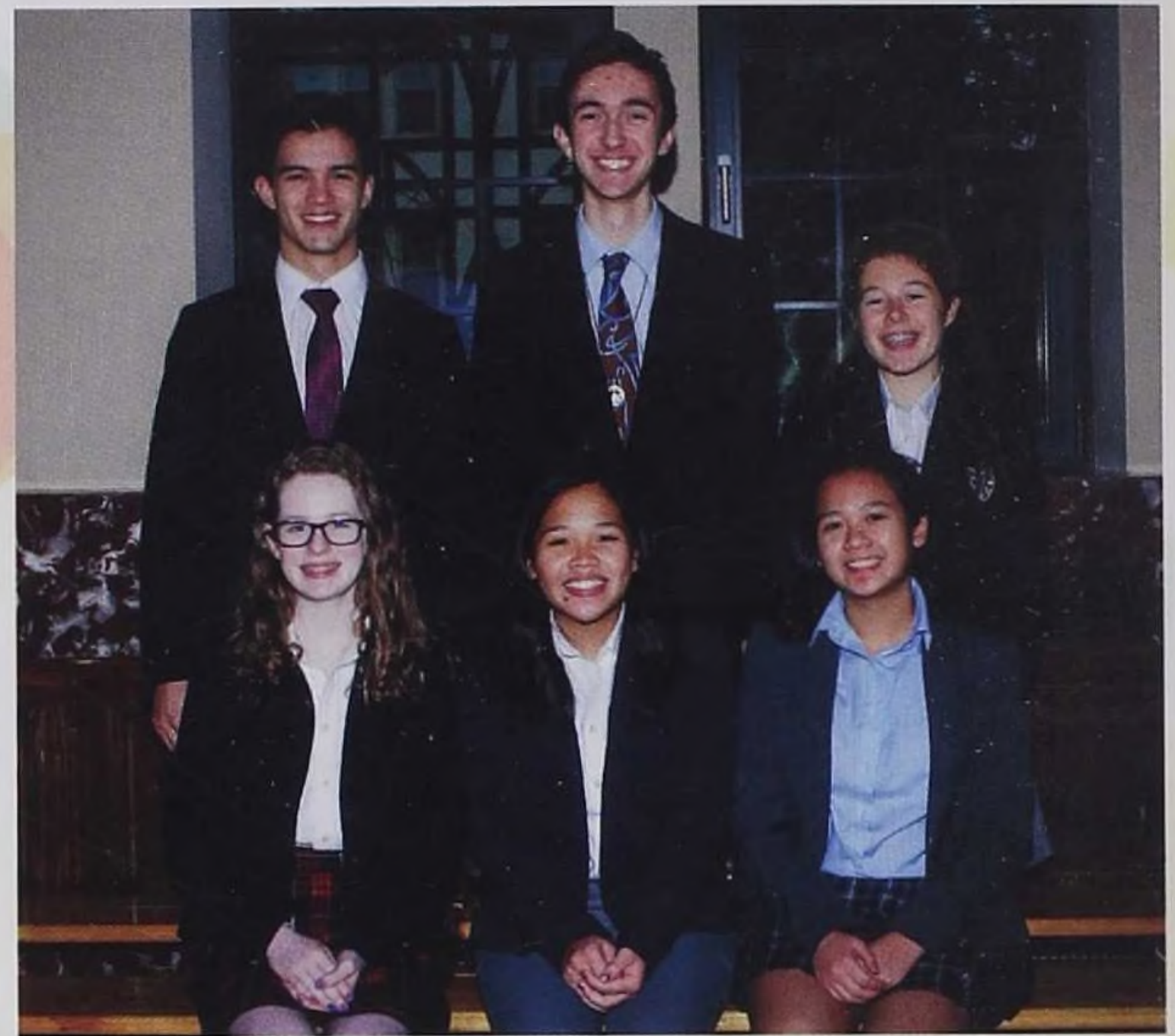
