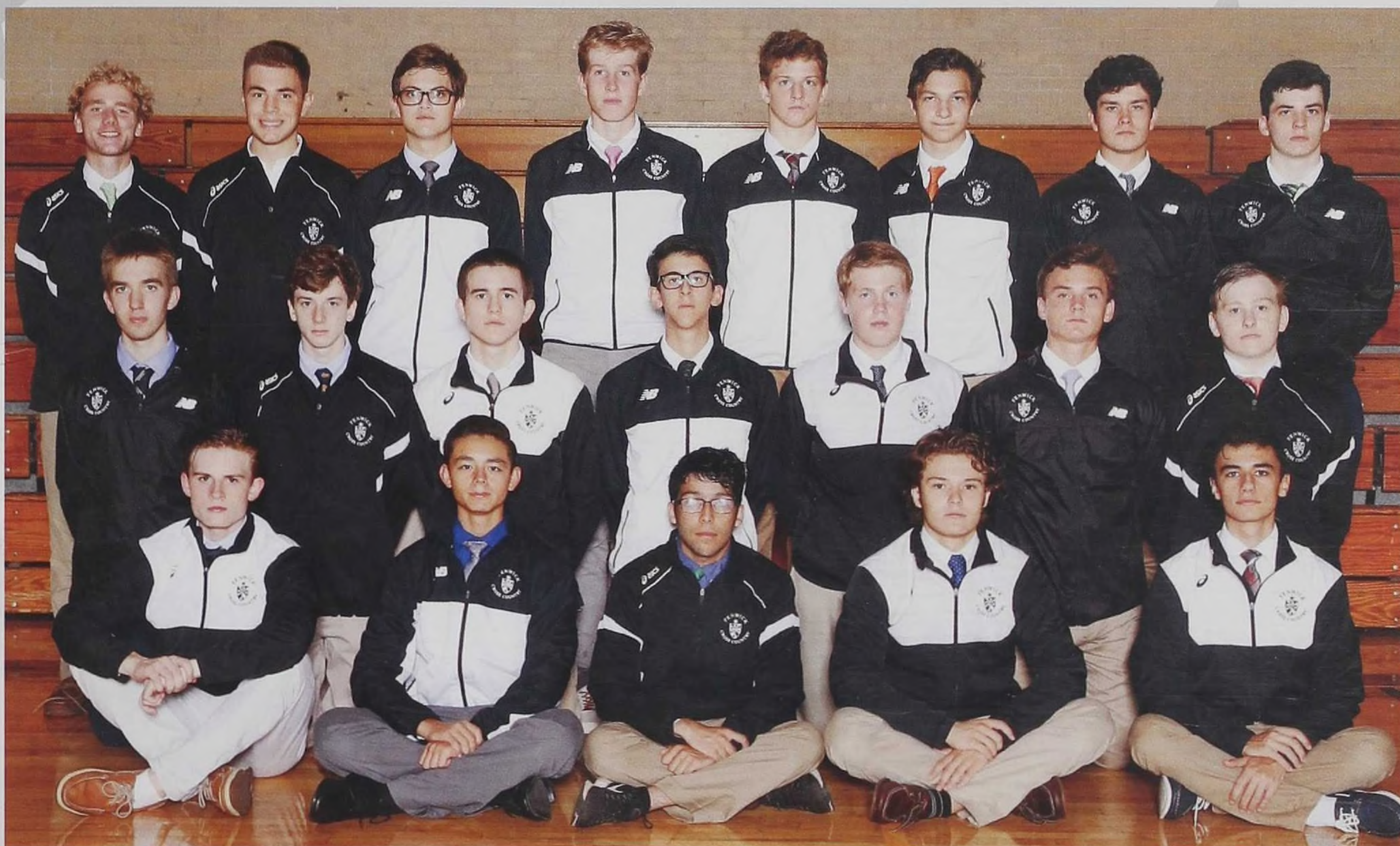

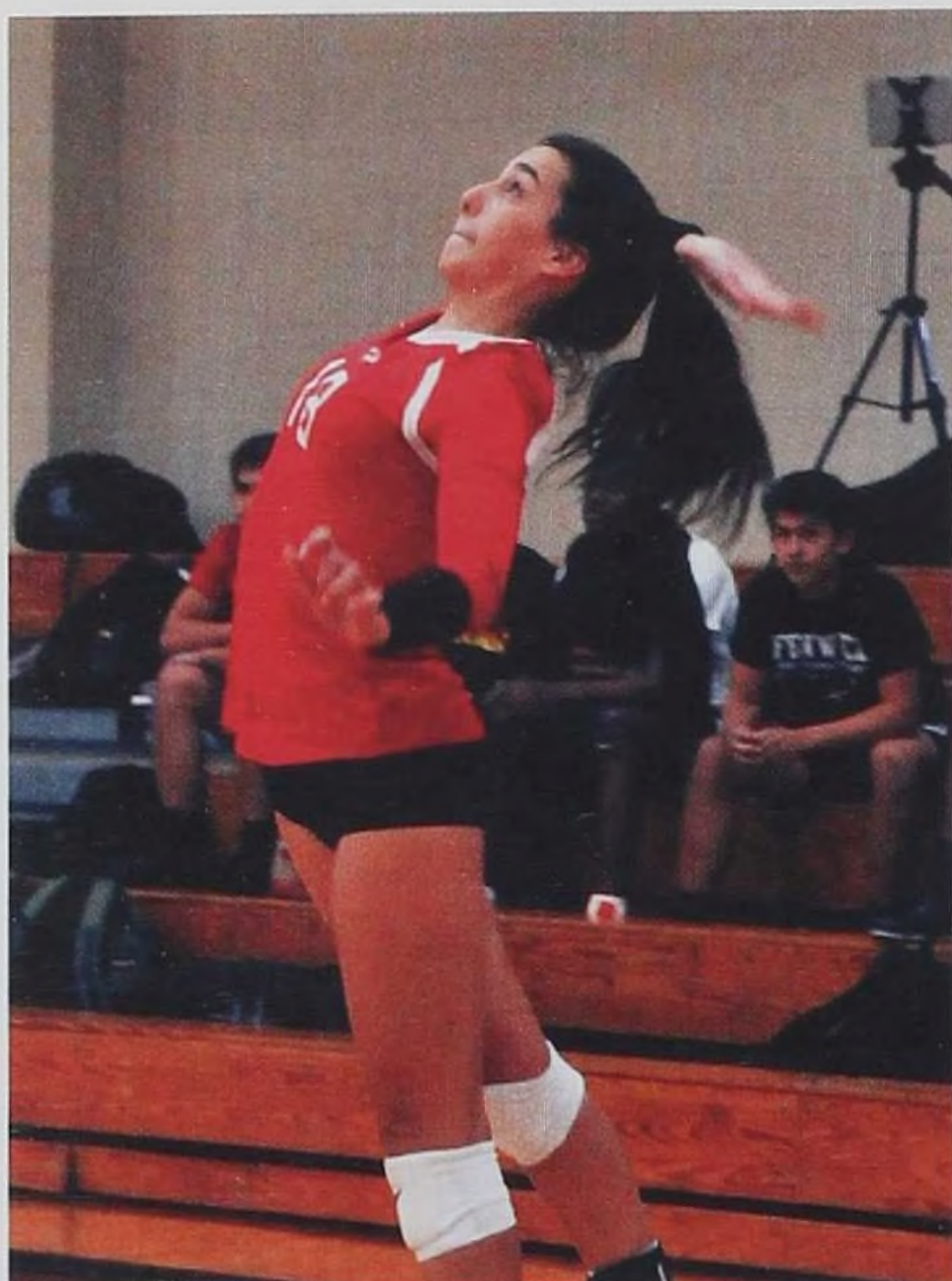

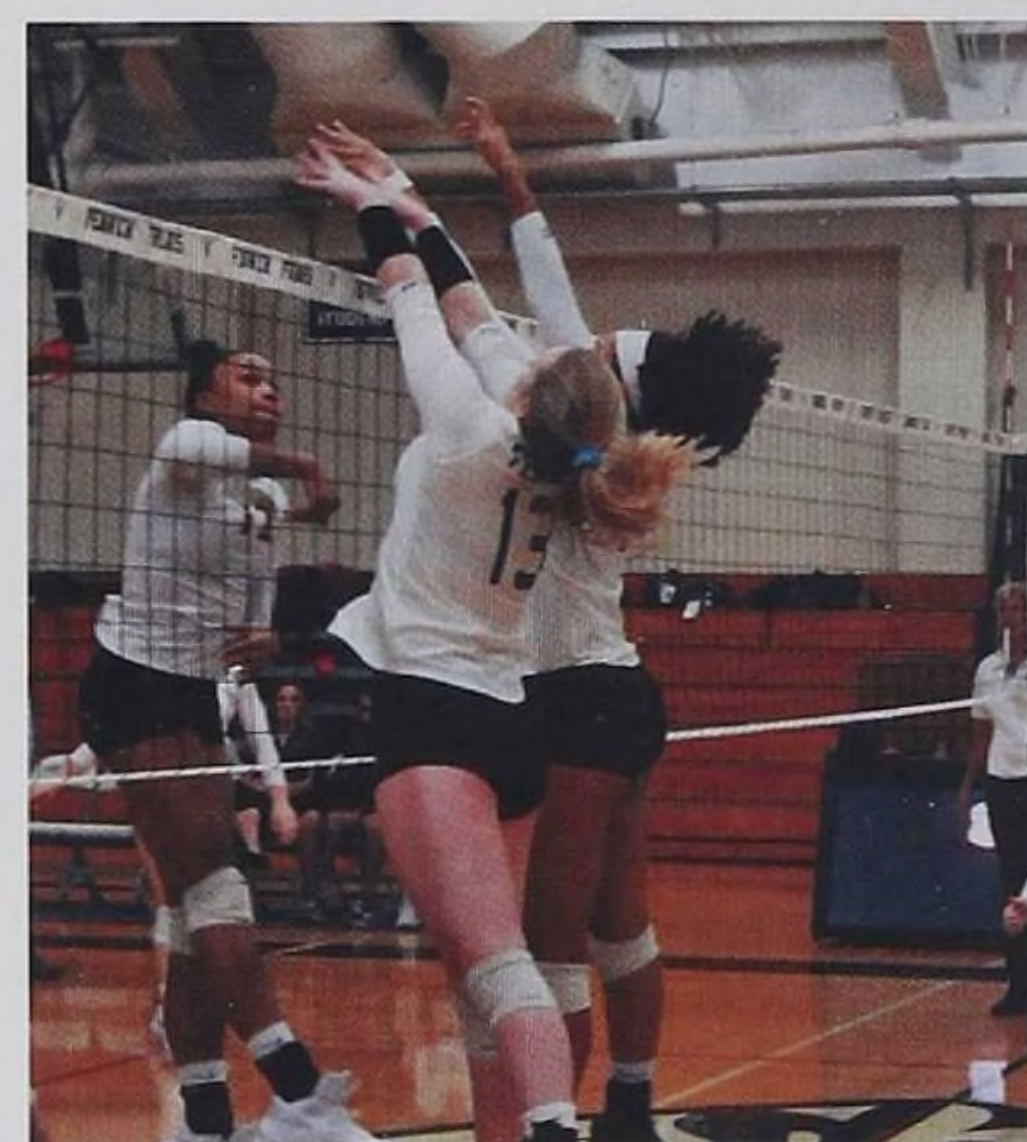

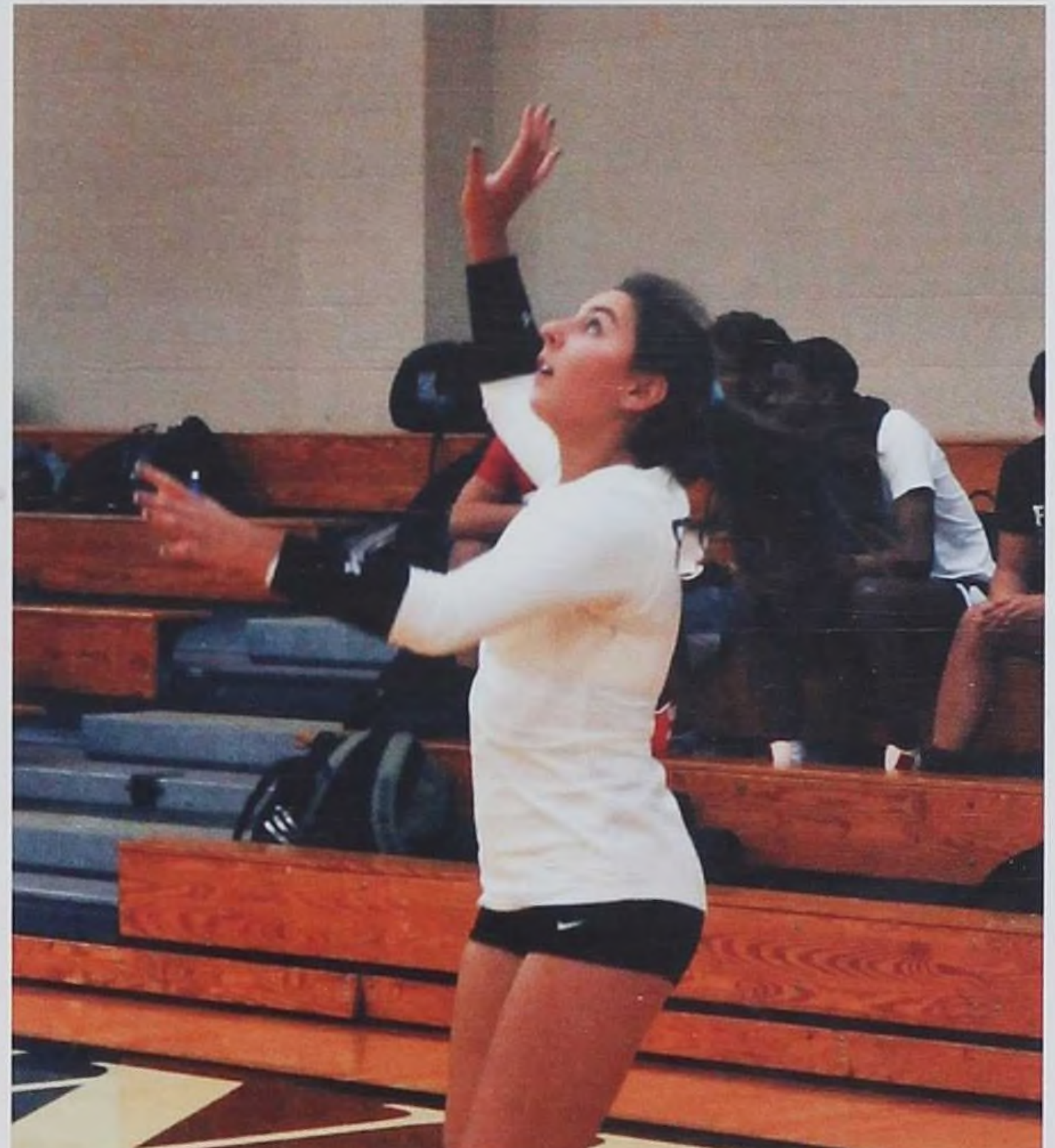

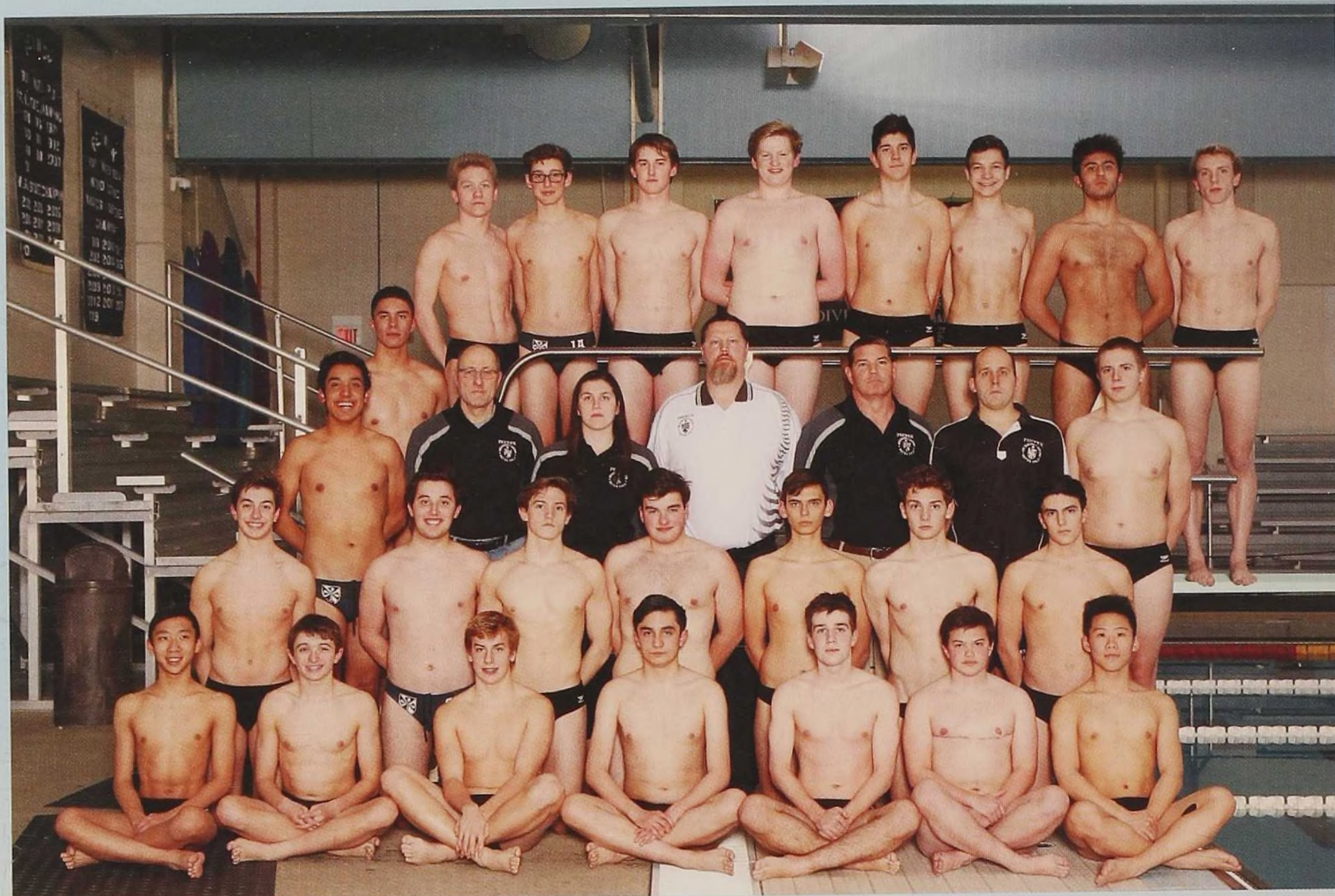

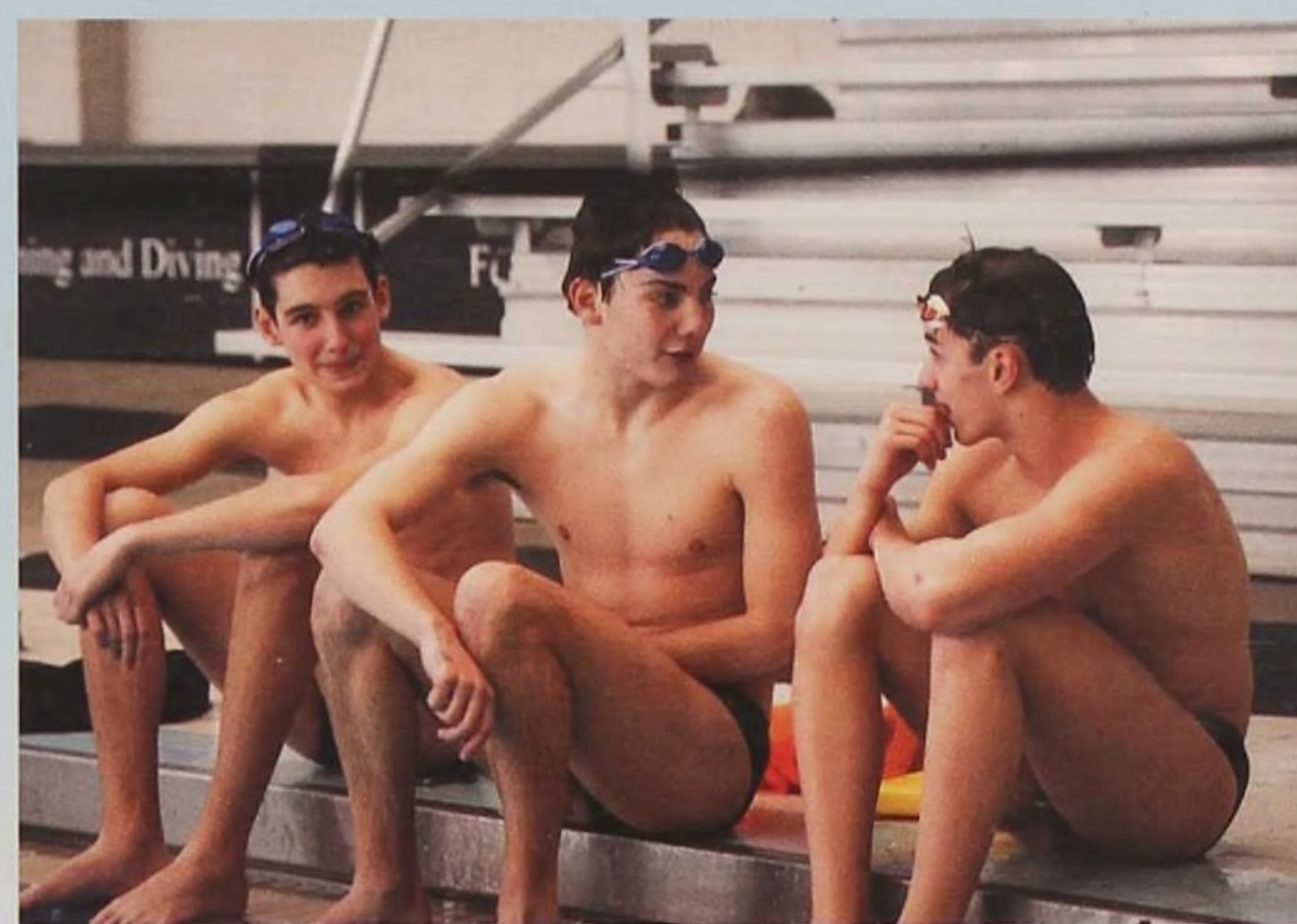

IHSA State Championship results:

- The 200 medley relay of Peter Buinauskas, Michael Flynn, Connor McCarthy, and Daniel Bajda took 12th place. They also set the team record for the medley relay in the preliminary event.
- Michael Flynn took 3rd place in the 500 Freestyle and 9th place in the 200 Freestyle.
- The 400 free relay (same swimmers as 200 relay) took 7th place, nearly missing a team record from their performance at state.
- The Boys' Swimming and Diving Team took 13th place overall!

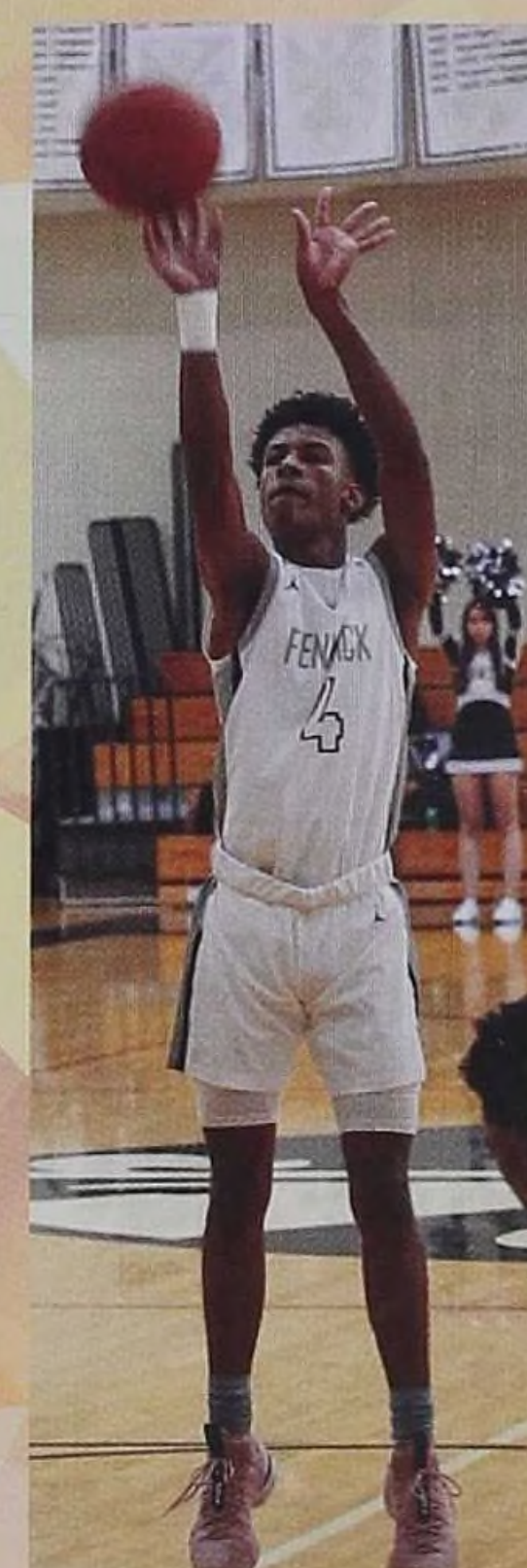

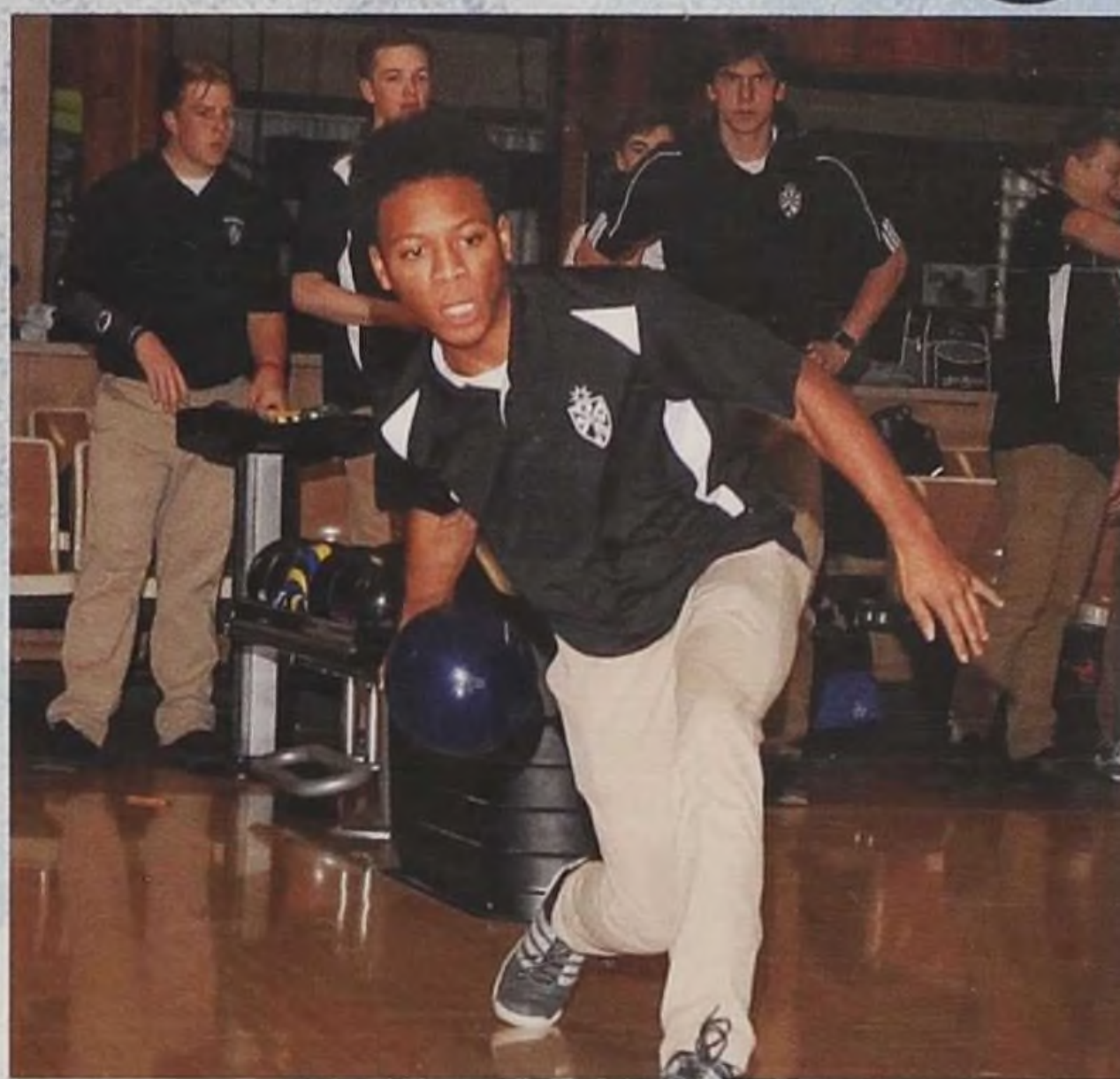

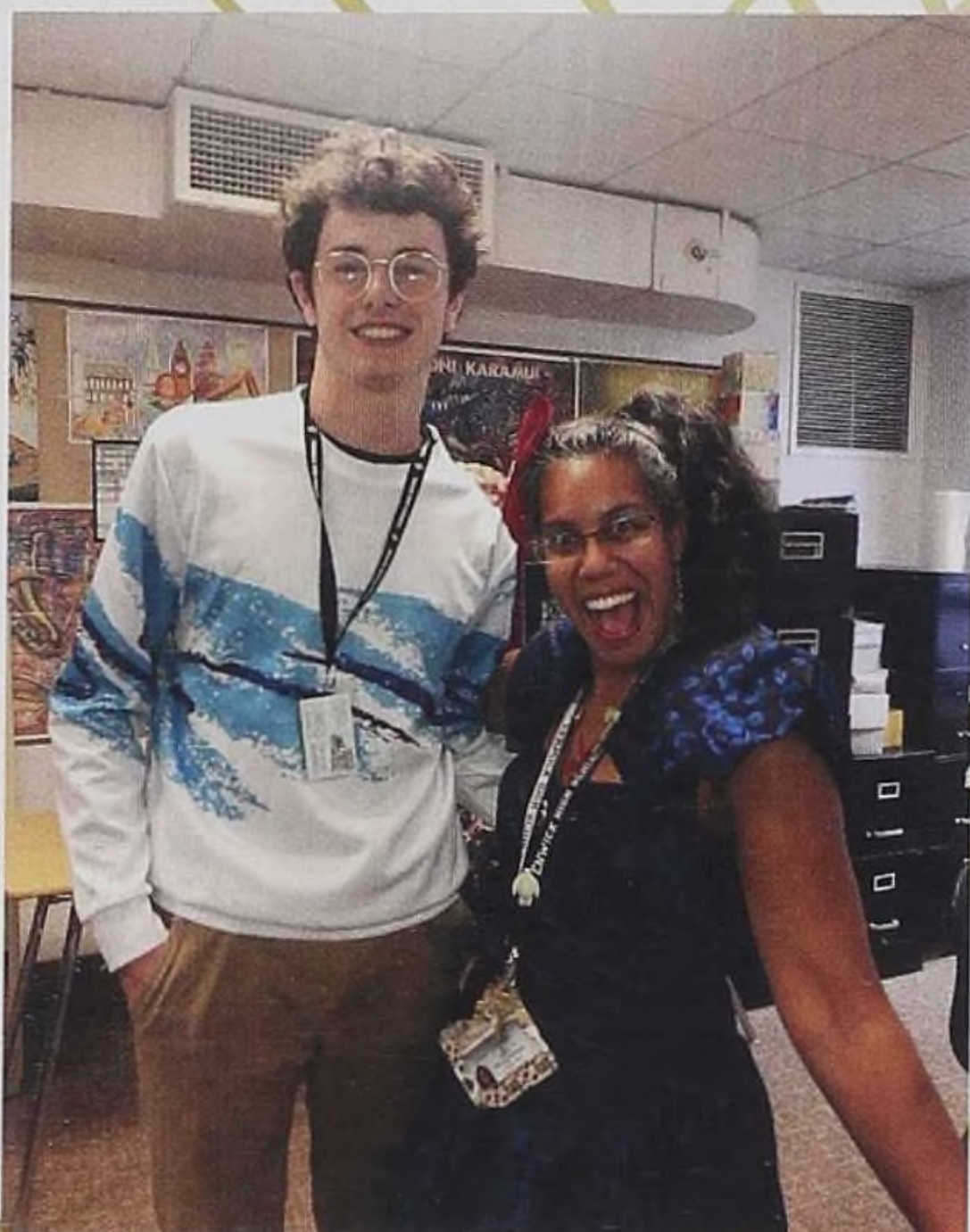

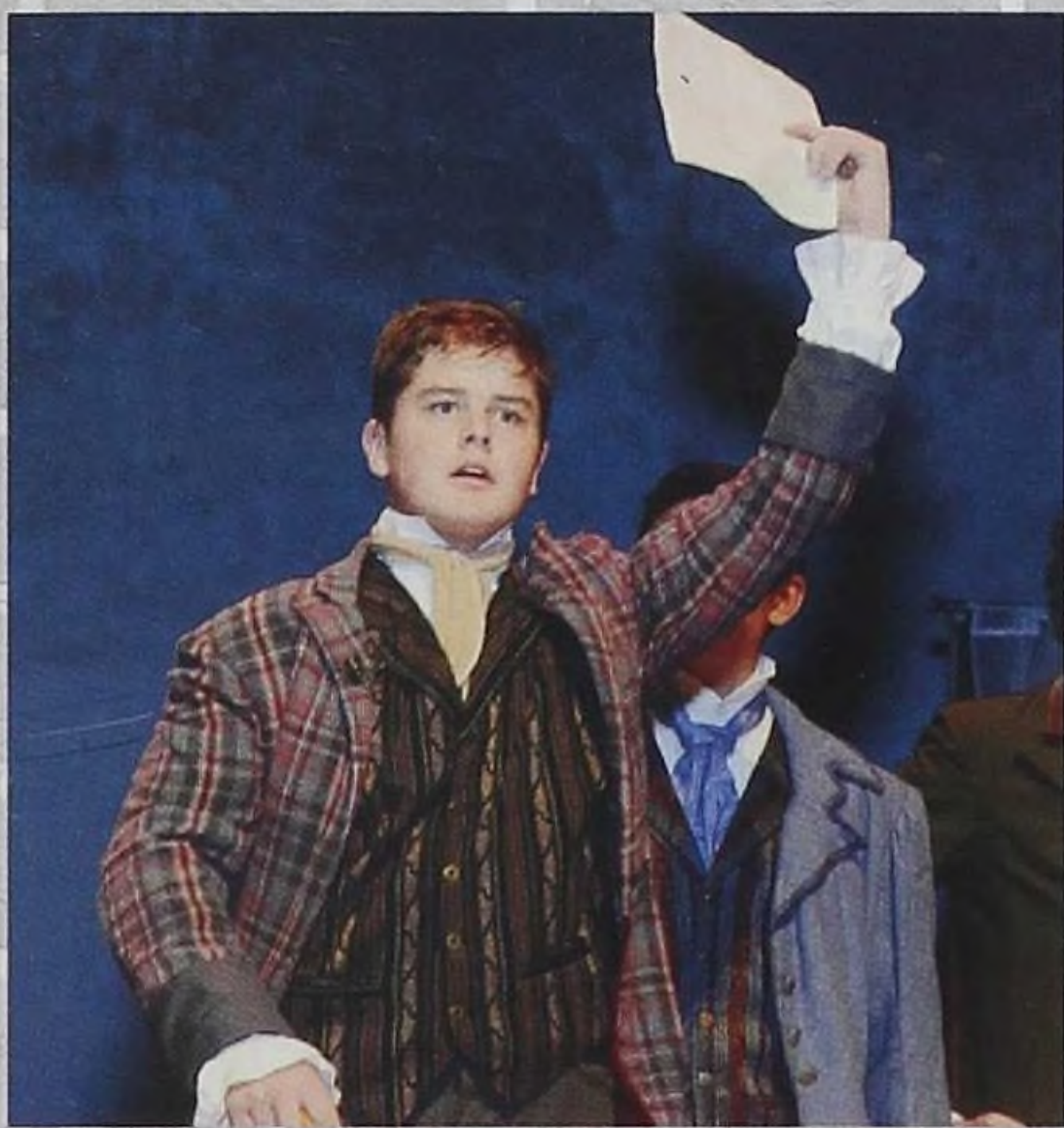

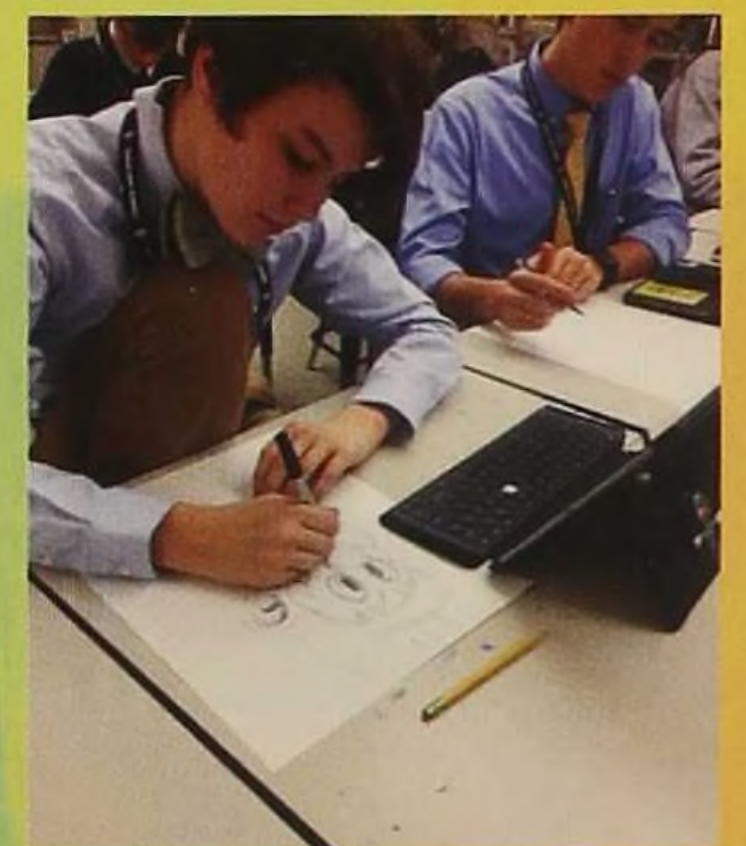

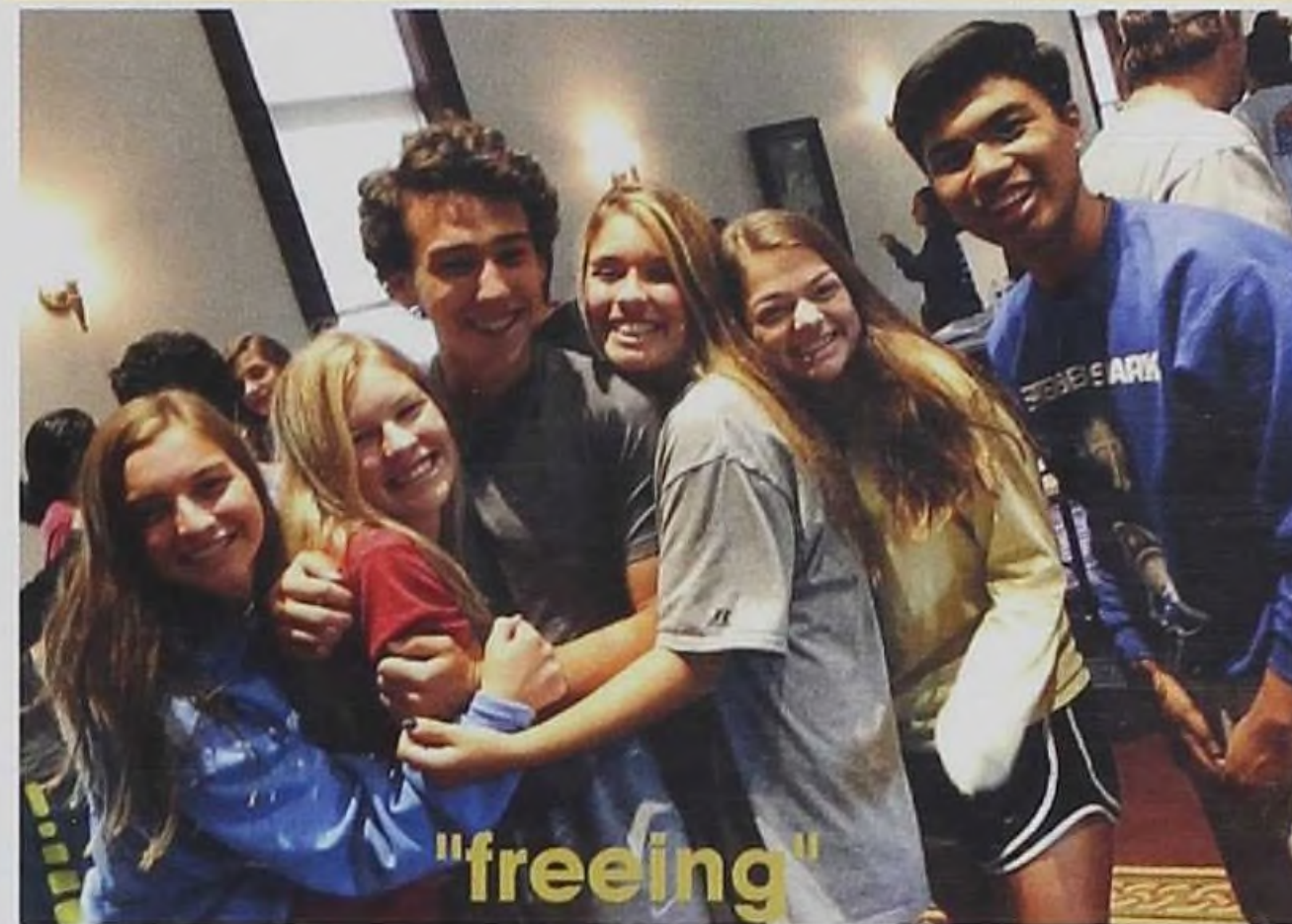

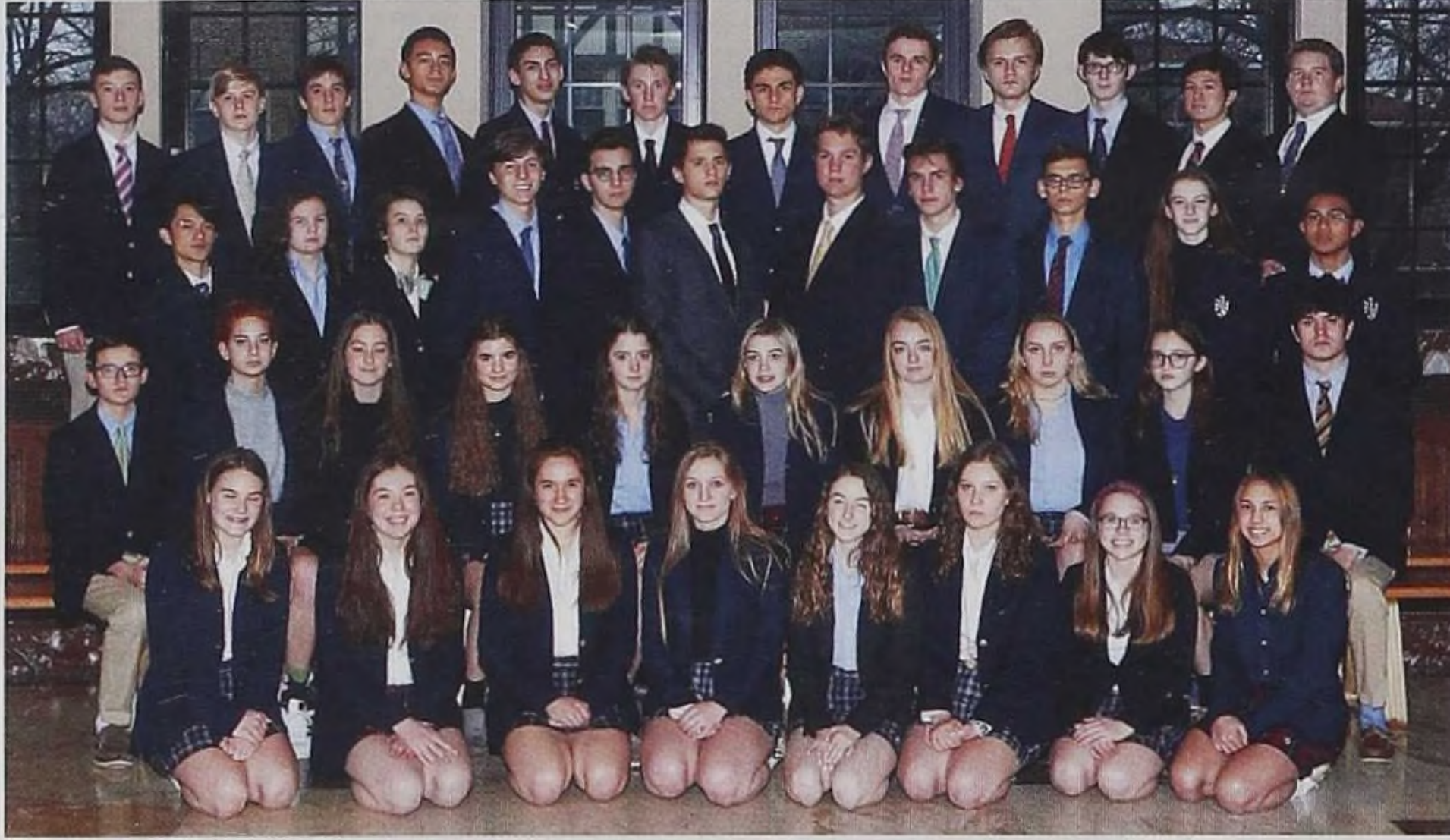

Academic Challenge (formerly WYSE) is a test-based competition hosted by the Physics Department and Pre-Engineering Program at Illinois Universities. Offered to high school students, subjects tested are biology, chemistry, computer science, engineering graphics, English, mathematics, and physics. More than 40 community colleges and universities in Illinois and Missouri provide sites for the tests. The tests are designed to present a challenge to the brightest high school students, and are drawn from high school senior and college freshman curricula to present a bridge between secondary and higher education.

The goal of Academic Challenge is to acquaint high school students with the course content and the level of competition that they will experience upon entering a science or engineering curriculum at the college or university level.

STATE MATH



Students are able to qualify for the State Math Teams if they participate in math competitions. Throughout September and October, there are four contests using practice problems to prepare for the PSAT. From October to March, there are six half-hour contests in Illinois Math League. From November to April there are six half-hour contests. From November to March there are five half-hour contests in the National Freshmen Algebra League.

On February 5th, 242 students participated in the American Mathematic Competition 10 and 12. The point standings list from the year's competitions is frequently updated and from these point standings, ten students are invited to be on the State Math Team every year. After the State Math Regionals, the team will then practice to prepare for the State Math Constest Finals in Champaign, Illinois at UIUC.

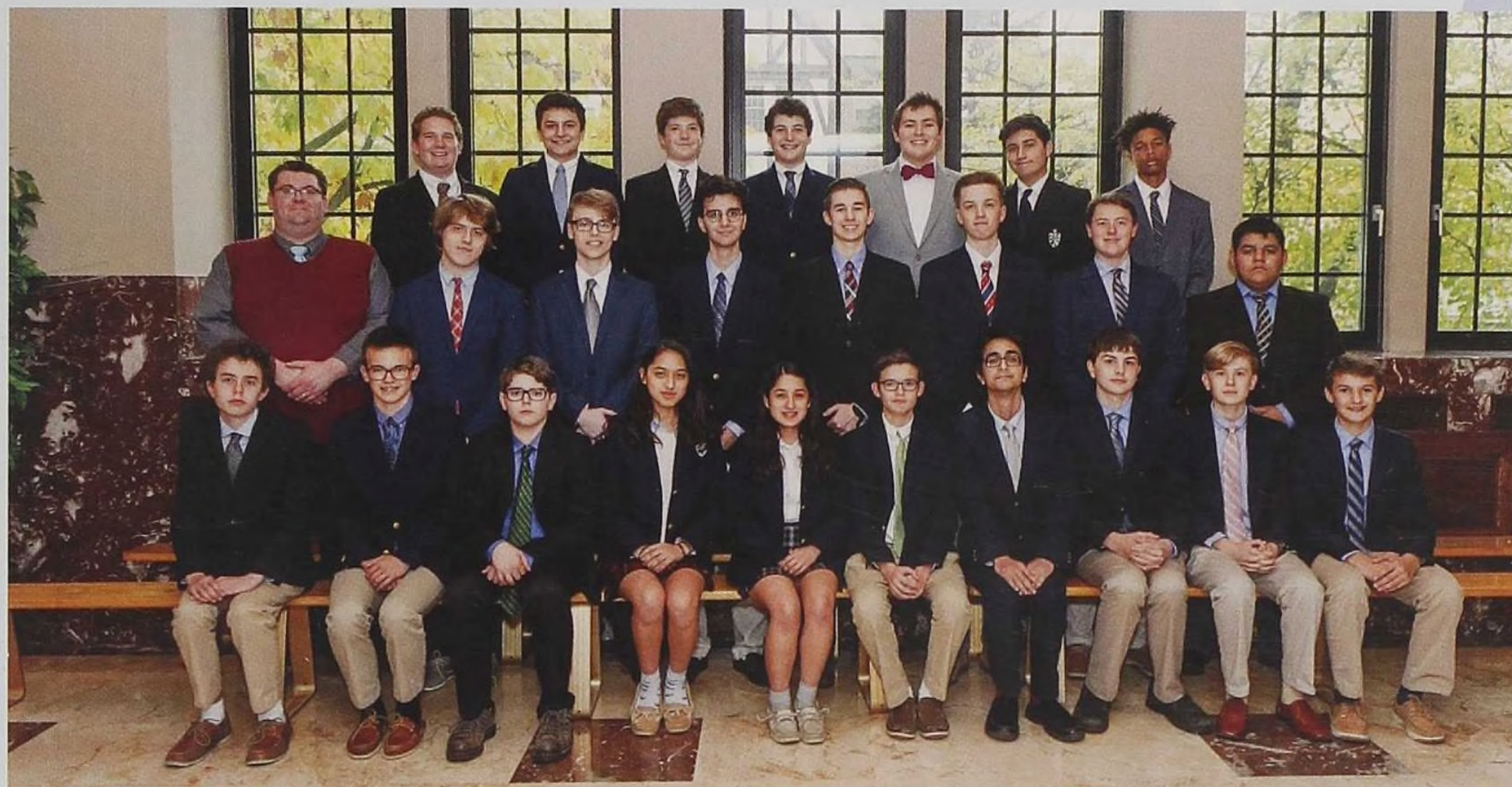

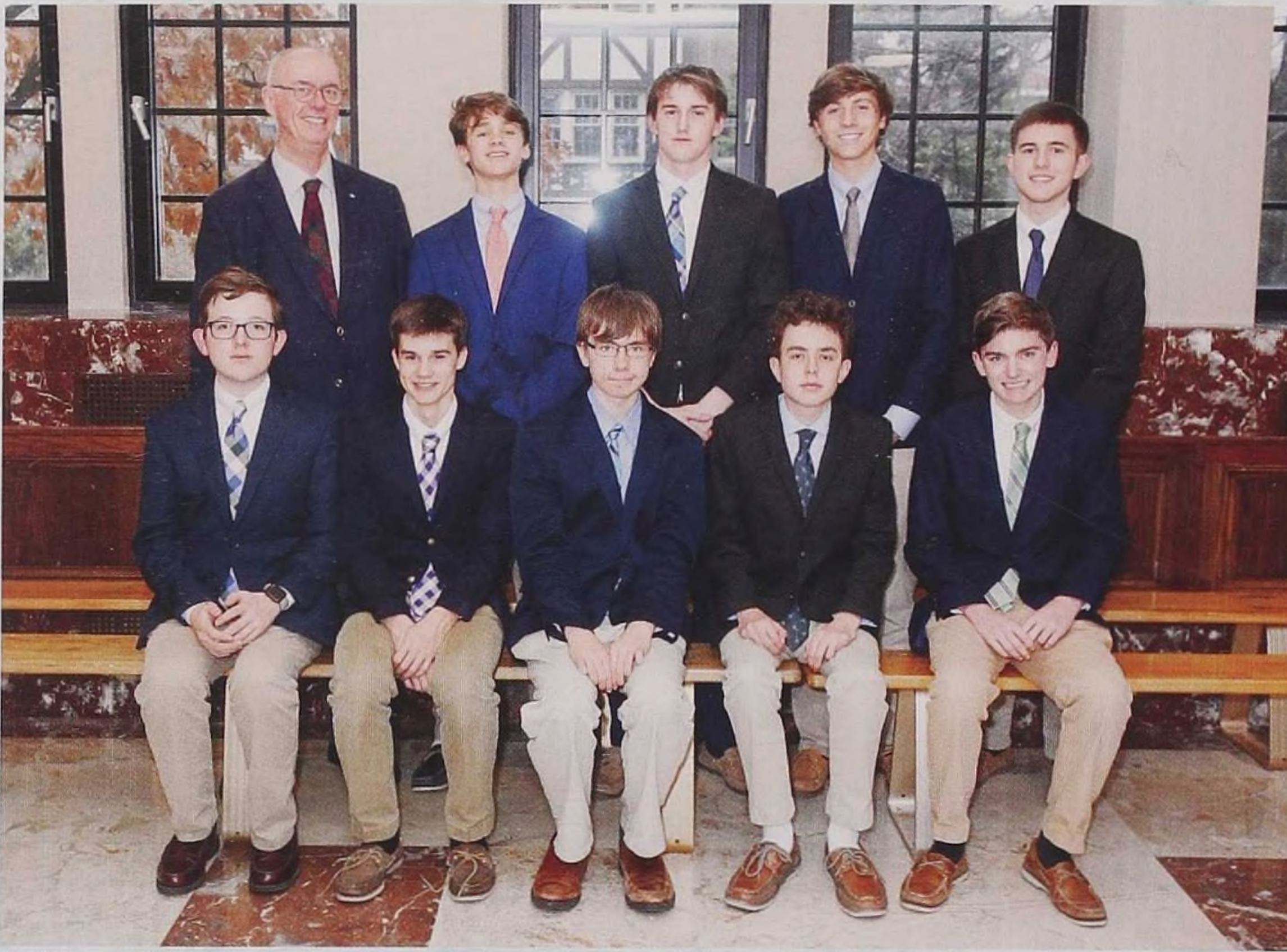
ROBOTICS CLUB

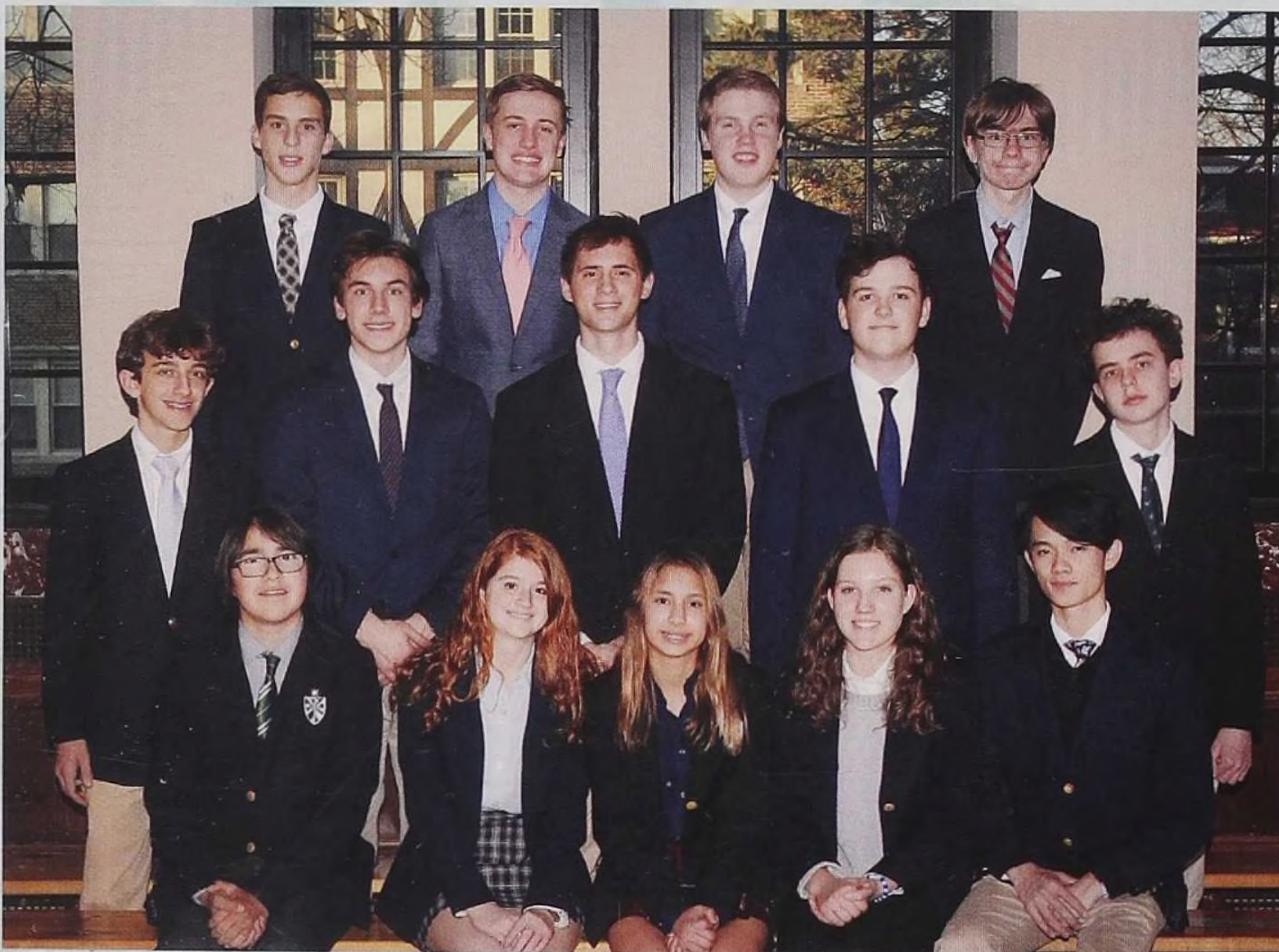
