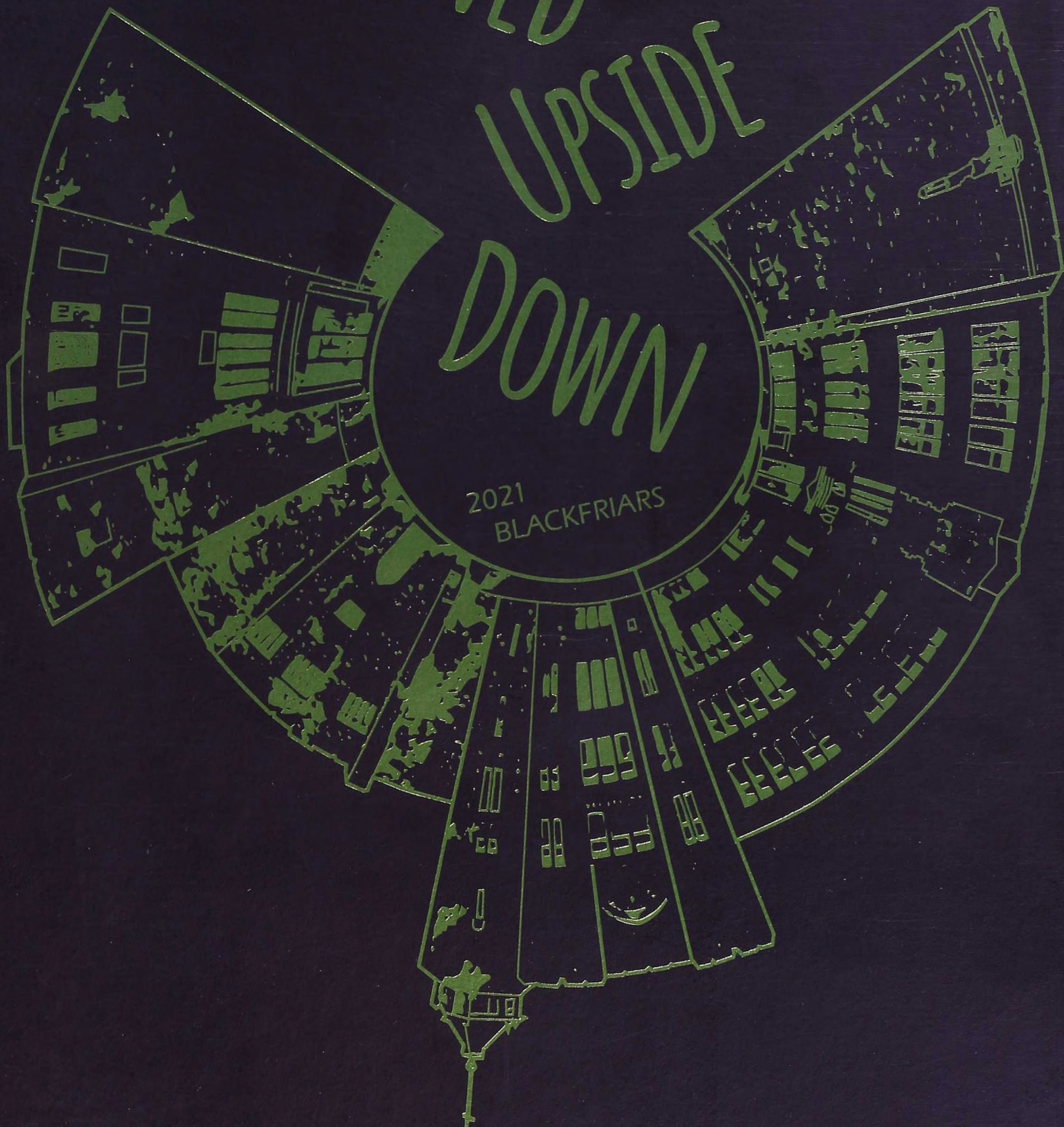

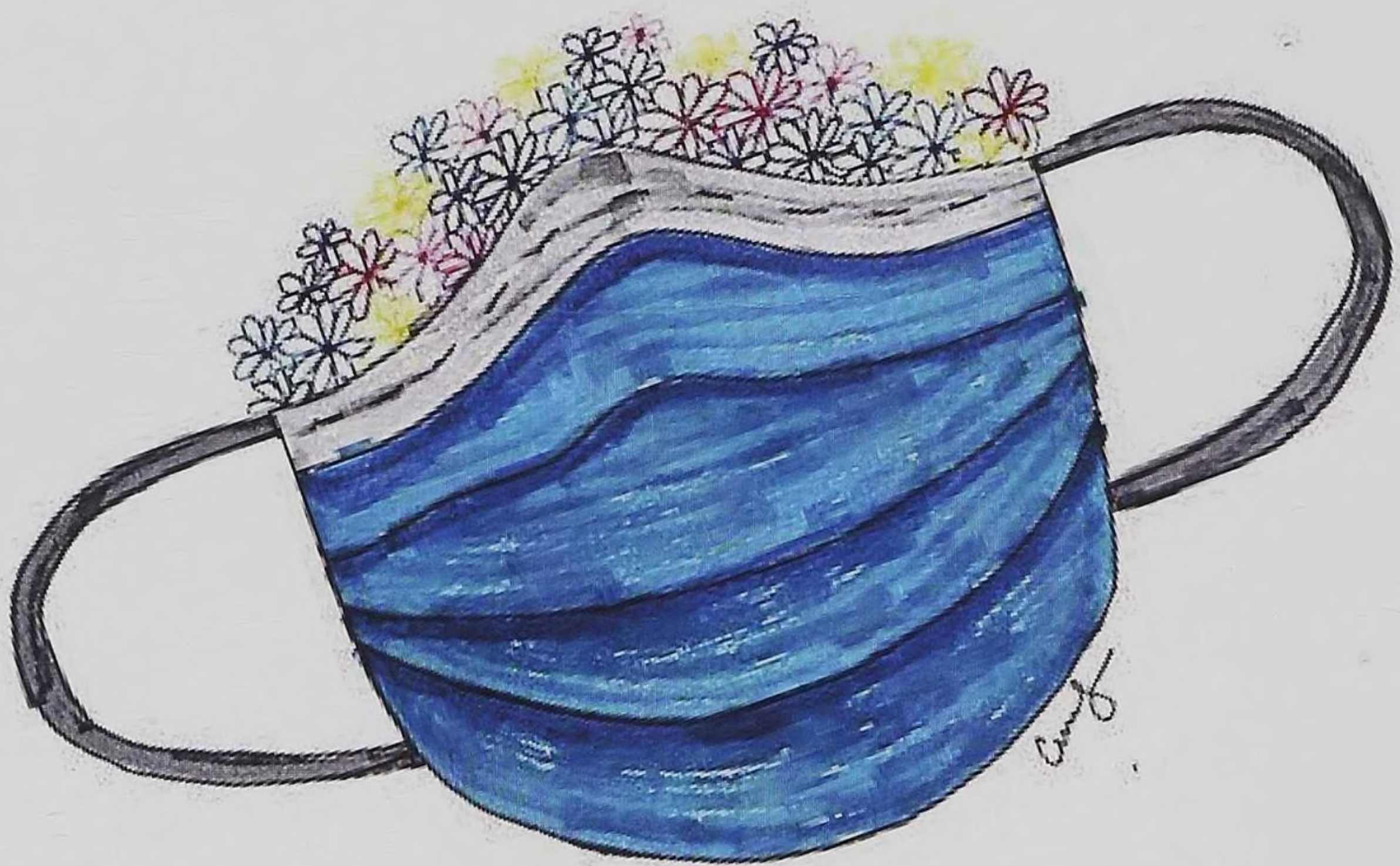

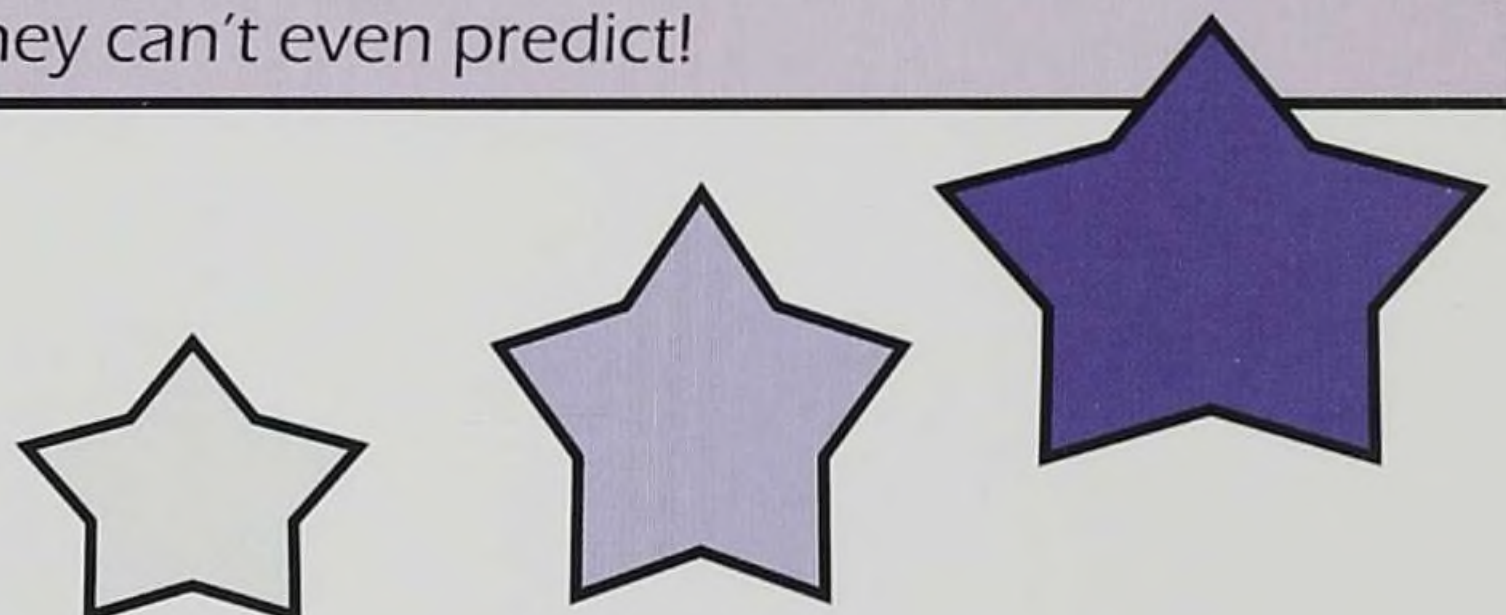
What is your biggest piece of advice for the Freshmen?

Remember this and also be patient and be kind to yourself and others!

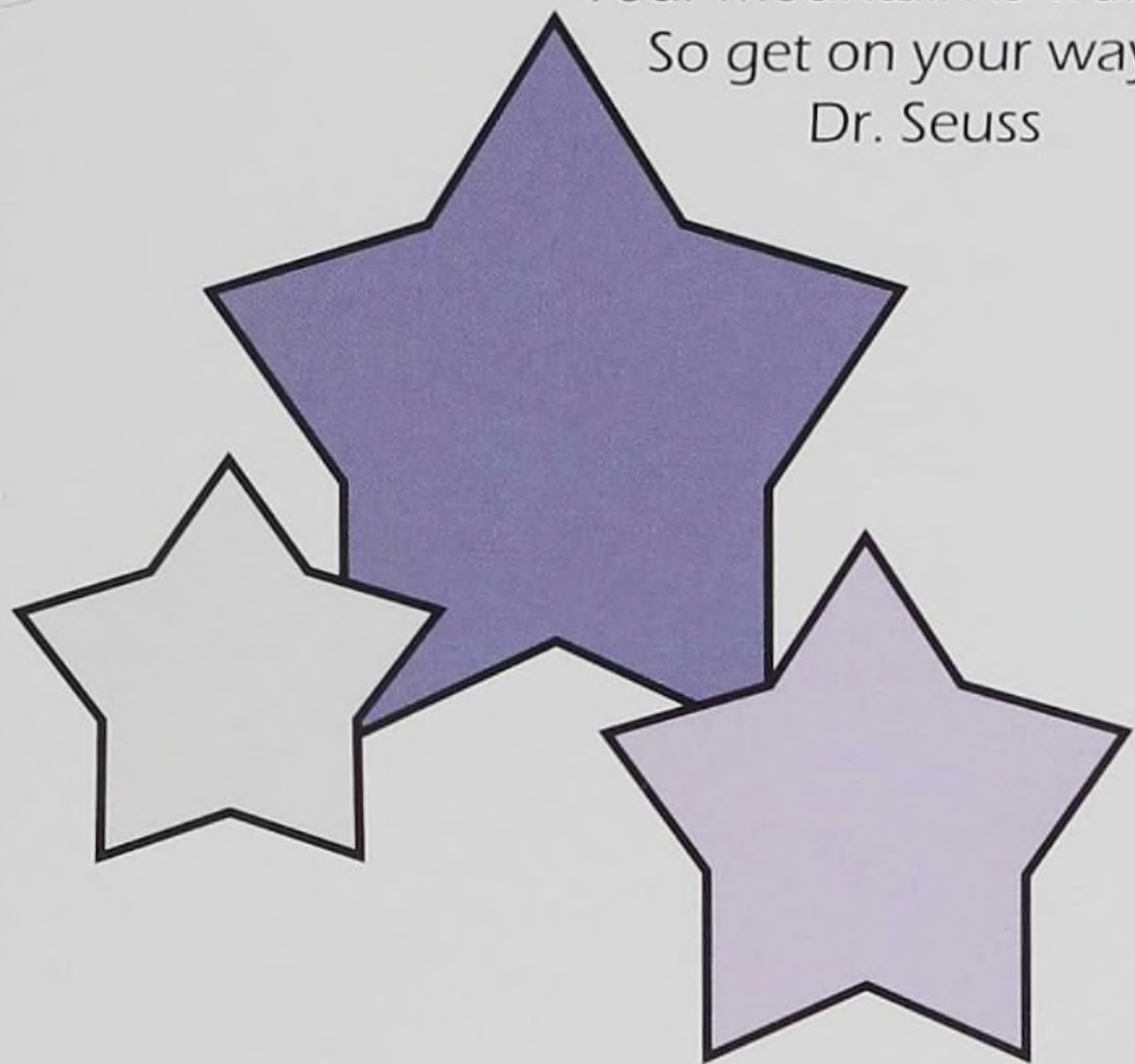
How do you think the Freshmen are handling new rules regarding Covid-19?

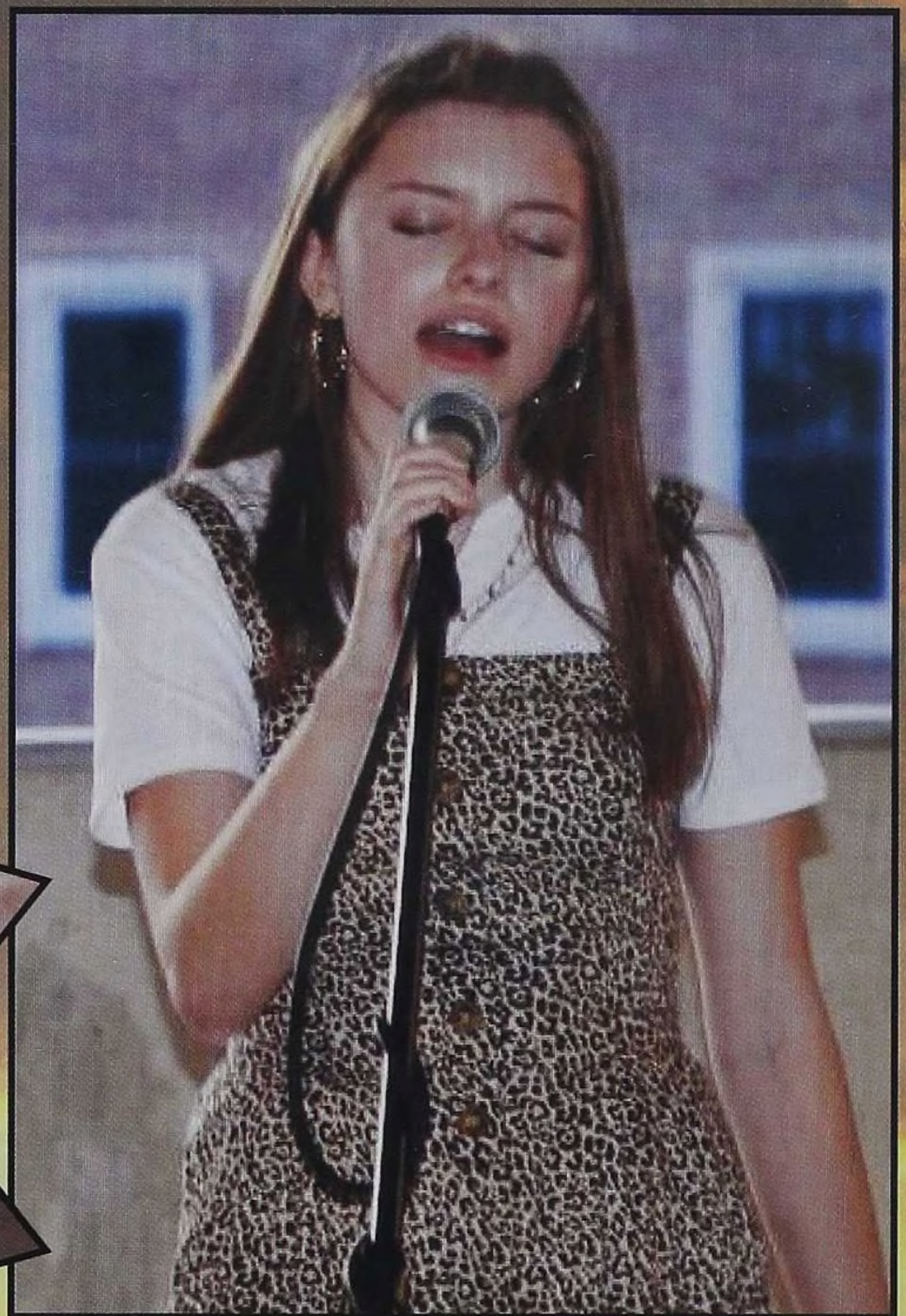

The Fenwick Girls' Golf team had one of its most successful seasons in recent years thanks to an enthusiastic, and very young roster. The team was led by its junior captain Lillian Bateman, who had the lowest average score per 9 holes at 42.4. She had her season-low of 38 twice, against Loyola and again against Mother McAuley. Sophomore Jojo Wiktor had a great season with a 43.1 average; scoring her best rounds of 39 against Latin and Trinity. Freshman Kathryn Sweeney had an impressive rookie year with a 43.9 average. Kathryn had the team low score of the season with a stellar 35 against Latin School of Chicago. And sophomore Charlotte Bateman rounds out the full-time varsity team with a 47.4 average. Charlotte had her season low score against Latin School of Chicago shooting an impressive 42.

Junior Maeve McEnery, senior Blair Lepore, and junior Mimi Attard each spent a good amount of time on the varsity team, making some very solid contributions to the success of the team.

Team success was as strong this year as it has been in recent history. They were tested with one of the busiest schedules in the conference. 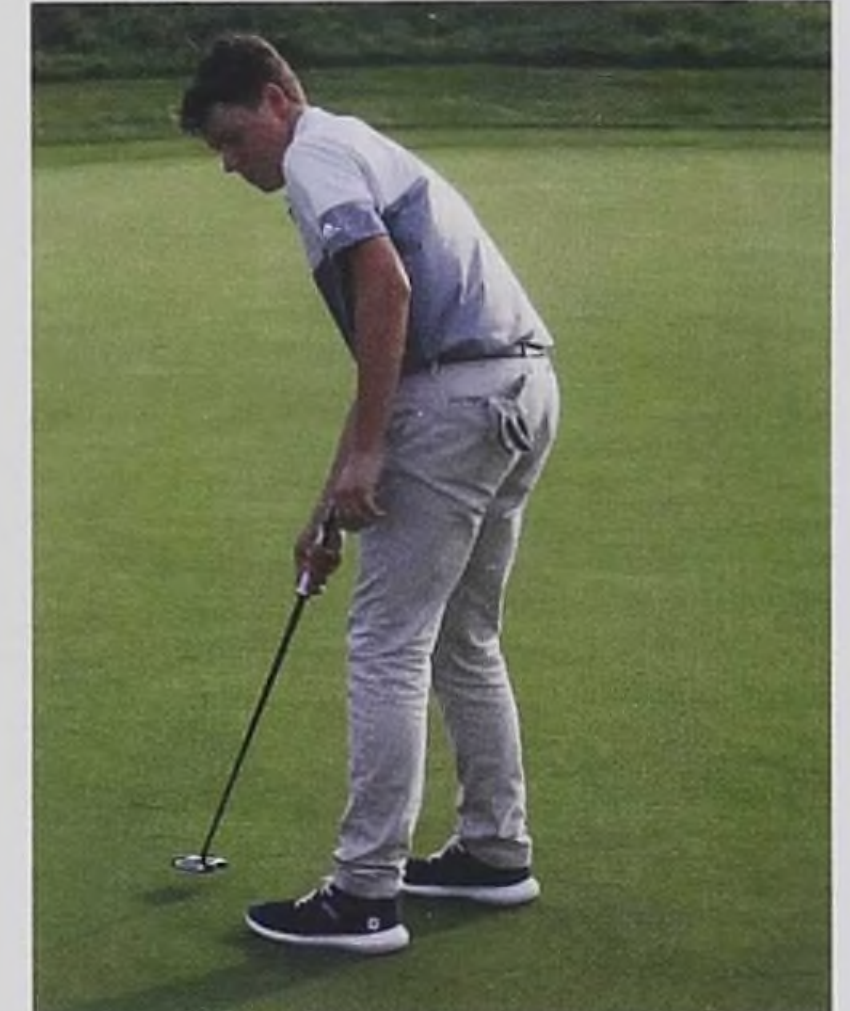

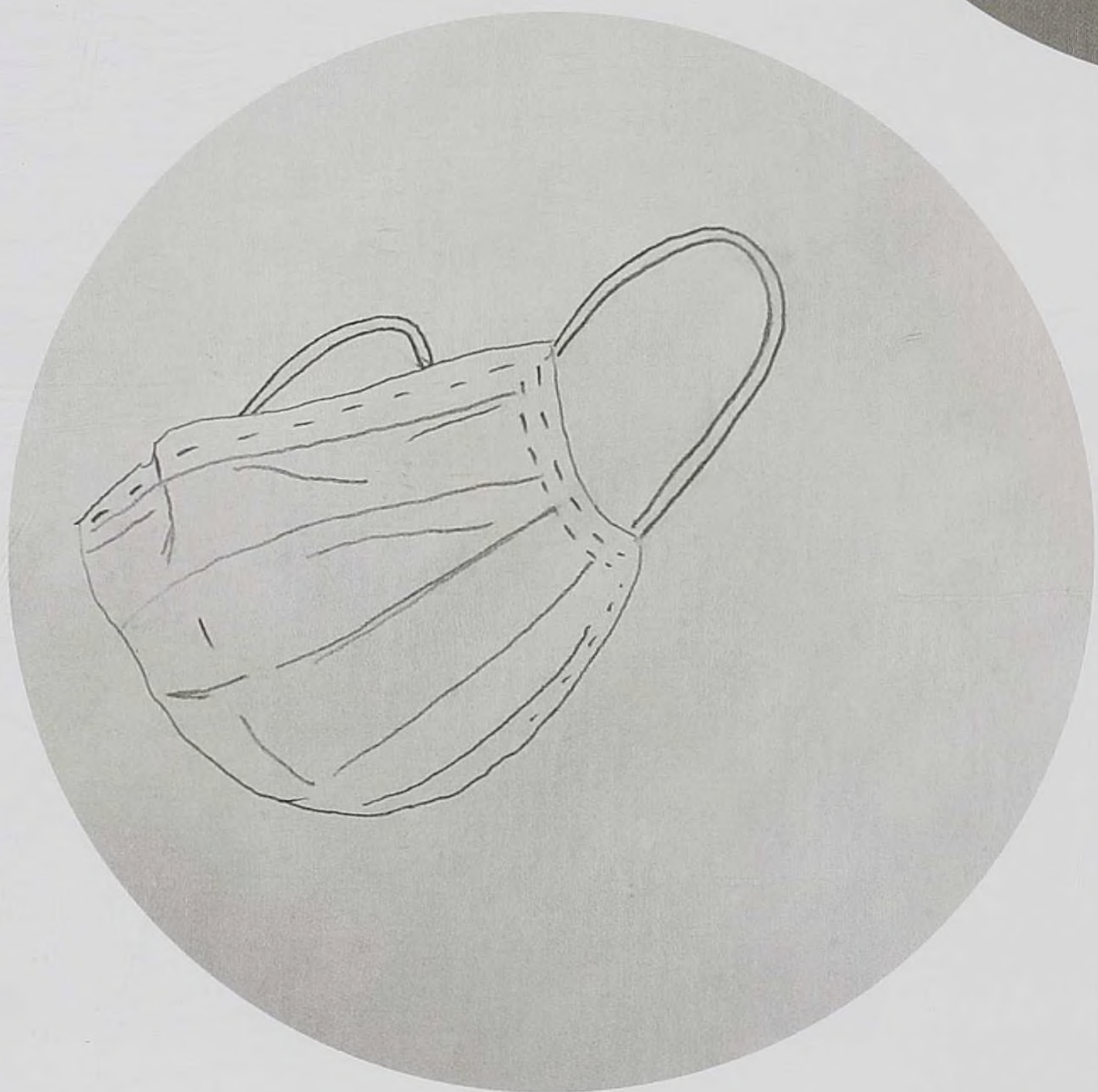

How do you think the sophomores will do this year in speech?

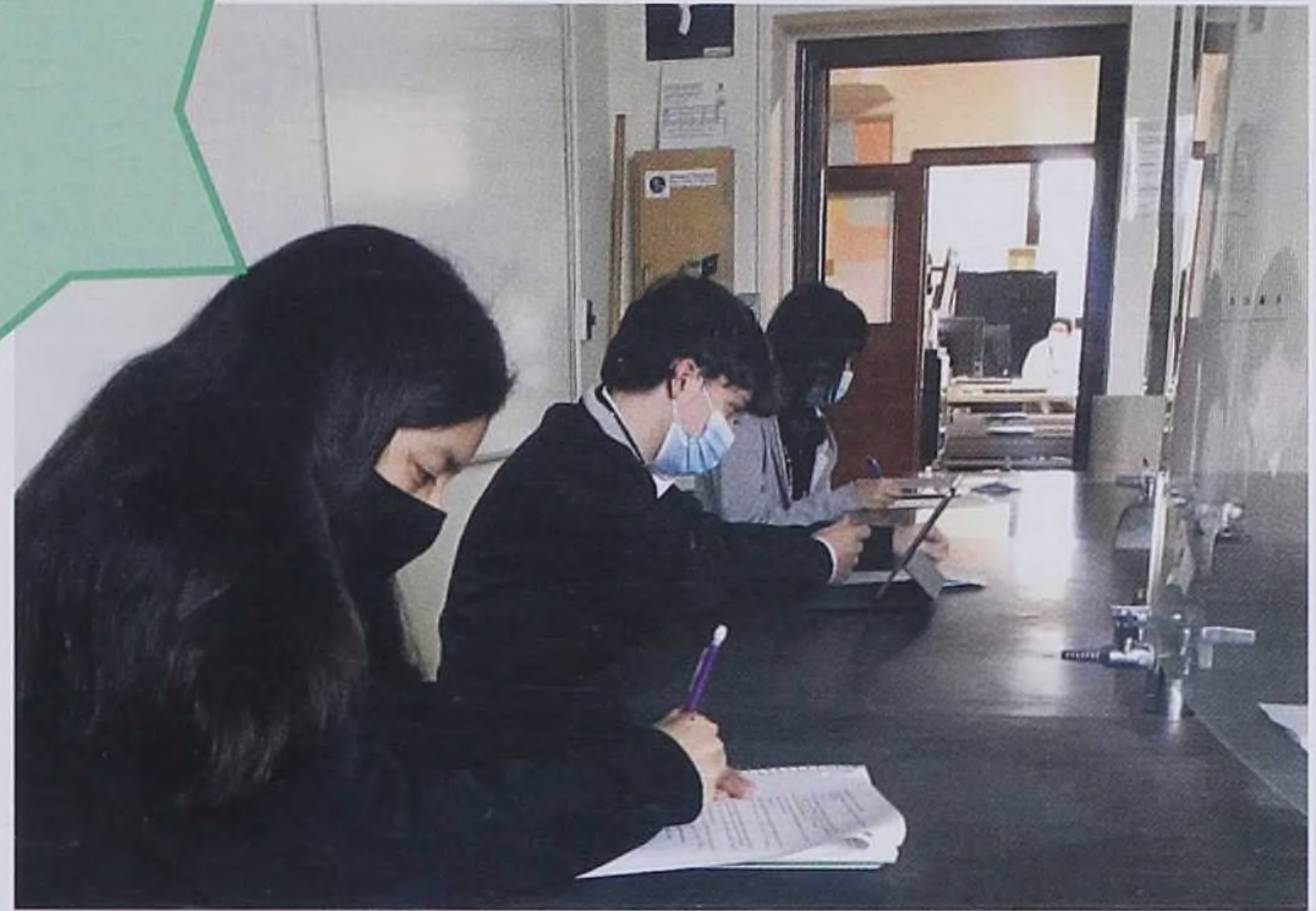
Fantastic! Ms. Magrady is an honest and fair teacher who will focus on the small things that will help our students progress into young adults.

SAFE & QSA Clubs

SAFE: For an outsider, what do you as a club do to get more people involved?

SAFE: How do you as a club give out to communities around us?

"If there is a community service opportunity, we do our best to serve. In December, the SAFE club organized the SIDS Drive. SIDS stands for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, and unfortunately 1,800+ babies pass away due to SIDS. Items that were collected were either baby products or self care products for mothers. It was a huge success thanks to everyone (members and non club members) who donated and filled a van full of supplies." -Lizeth Vargas '21

SAFE: If there was one message that this club follows/is centralized around, what would it be? Why?

"There's 2: Intersectionality and Love. Intersectionality acknowledges that everyone has their own unique and different experiences of discrimination and oppression. Therefore, the club takes into account everything (gender, race, class, sexual orientation, physical ability, etc.) instead of simplifying it to one sole issue. SAFE is meant to promote open discussion and awareness about social issues, especially the complexities of them. Love is essential in every mission, activity, and discussion the club does. QSA: How was this club started? What was the motive to start it?

"A number of students felt it was time to have a club where students of all gender and sexual identities can freely discuss and share their experiences, thoughts, and feelings without judgment or fear." -Ms. Visteen

QSA: What is your mission as a club and what do you do as a whole to make sure it gets completed?

"QSA is called the Fenwick Pride Alliance or the FPA. Our mission is to provide a safe place for all." -Ms. Visteen

QSA: Outside of the club walls, what do members do to represent your club? How do they usually leave a footprint in the Fenwick community?

"There have consistently been over twenty-five members at each meeting. We have 100 students in our schoology group. Outside of the IRC, I would argue that the FPA has the next highest membership. You do not have to be LGBTQIA+ to be a member of the club. You simply have to be an ally- a person who is willing to act with and for others in pursuit of ending oppression and creating equality." -Ms. Visteen



What are the main focal points for the BSU over the course of the year?

"The vision of BSU is to provide Black students with peer support during their high school years at Fenwick High School; encourage Black students to pursue their goals of college enrollment at the universities they want to attend, foster a mentoring program for students entering as freshmen, maximize the participation of Black Student Union in the Fenwick Community and at Fenwick sponsored events, and provide youth outreach and increase recruitment efforts to predominantly Black middle schools and grade schools and neighborhoods surrounding Fenwick High School." -Mr. Moland

What is the purpose of the BSU? How do you fulfill the purpose?

"Fenwick High School's BSU inclusively works to bring cultural awareness and positive racial relations by promoting a mutual respect for all cultures. BSU will provide panel discussions, guest speakers, and community service opportunities. BSU is open to all students, regardless of racial or cultural differences. BSU welcomes diversity as it provides a table for rich discussion, understanding and acceptance." -Mr. Moland

How has BSU made its mark on the school?

"First by being involved. Our members are involved in several other activities including athletics and other clubs that are offered. Second by voicing our concerns when we need. Finally, by being a voice for student diversity, equity and inclusion when issues arise, or it is not happening for black students." -Mr. Moland

What is the main goal of the DEI Friars? What would cause someone to feel encouraged to join it?

"The DEI Friars, first, is not a club. It is important to make this distinction. This is a group that will be part of the school moving forward. Currently, this group is a partner in forming the DEI path of Fenwick with me, as the Director of DEI, and the DEI Committee of the Board of Directors. The DEI Friars have a very important piece in this, because they are the voice of the students. This student input will be essential in addressing the culture of how students are sometimes treated at Fenwick." -Mr. Moland

How would you describe the DEI Friars to someone who is interested?

"This group will provide a voice and some direction based on student perspectives in the building. They will also help in presenting DEI topics or DEI student perspectives for Mr. Moland or the DEI Committee. They have established themselves as a safe place for all students facing any kind of discrimination and will continue doing so. It is important that Fenwick has a culture and an environment where students can feel comfortable to learn and value Fenwick as their own. 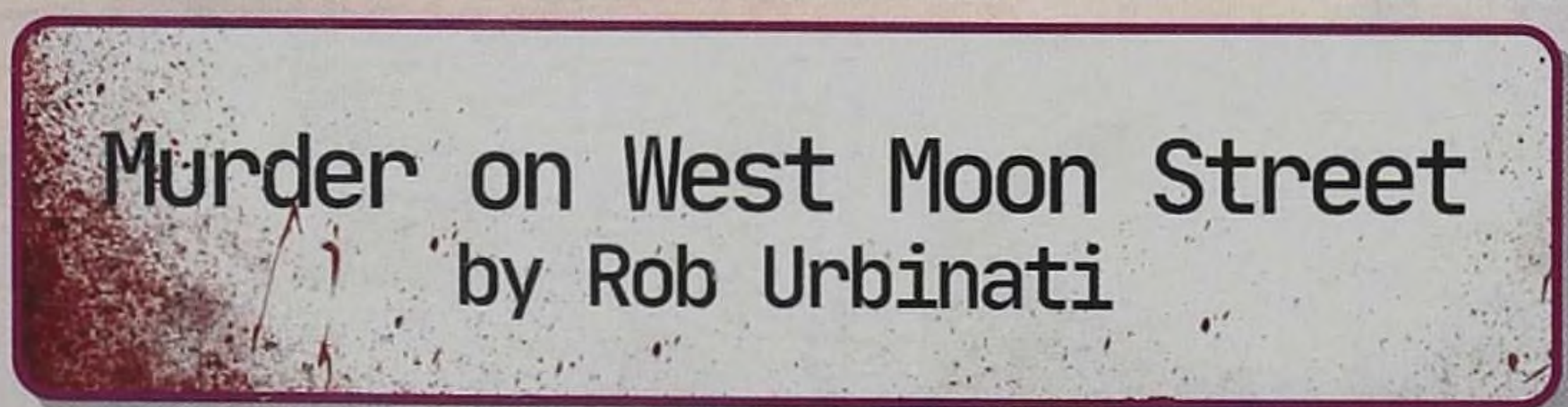
2020-2021 BLACKFRIARS GUILD PERFORMANCES

SENIOR DAY

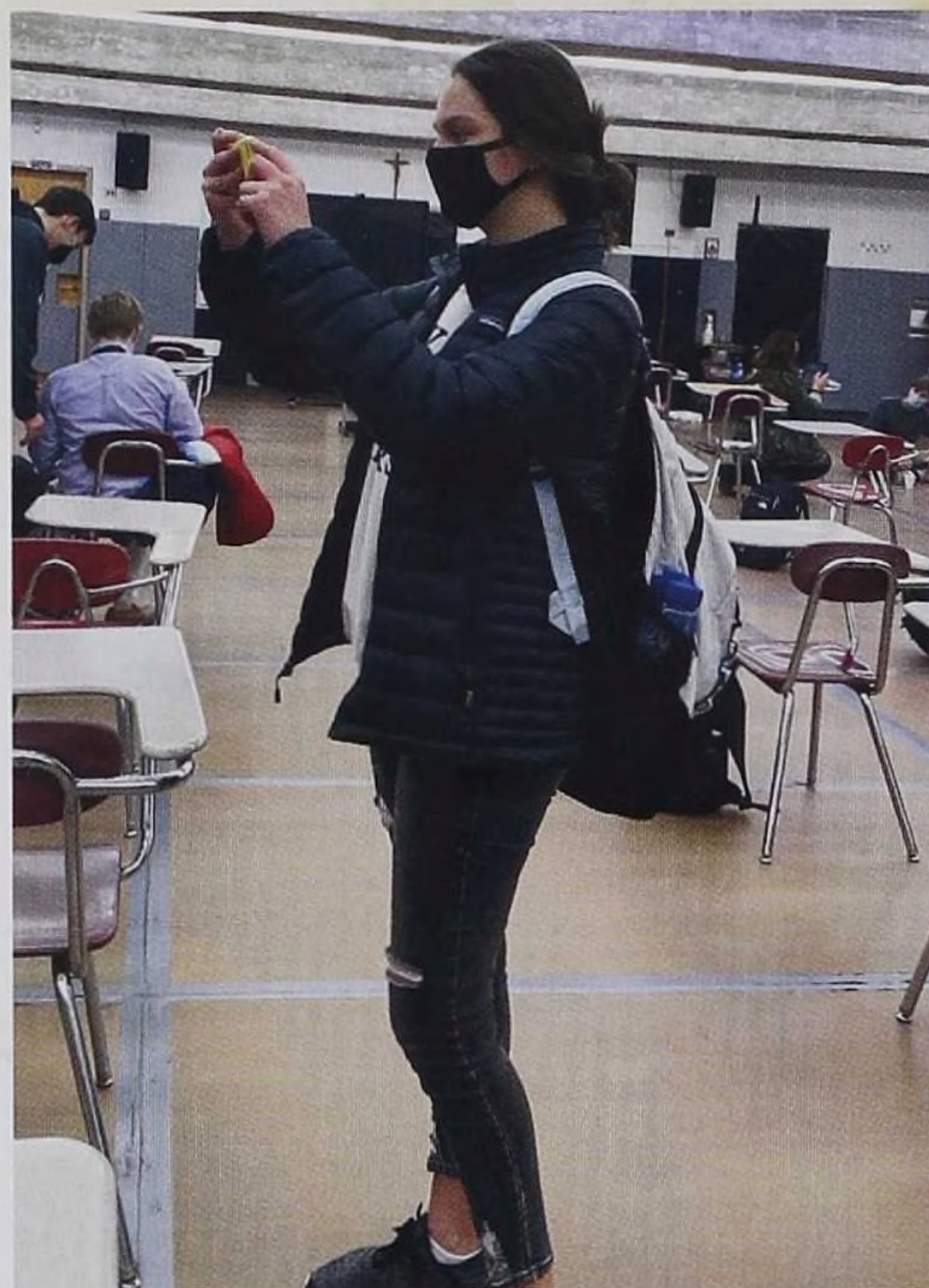


Senior Day has this group jumping for joy!
