






VARSITY SEASON RECAP

SEASON RECAP

The 2021 Fenwick Boys' Soccer Team finished the season with had a 3-1 run in the IHSA Championship Tournament to win the Regional Championship; the first in five seasons since 2016. We had wins over Schurz (7-0), Pritzker (5-1), Fenton (2-1) and lost 3-4 in the Sectional Finals against Notre Dame College Prep. The makeup of the 2021 team changed dramatically since the shortened 2021 Covid Spring Season that did not have an IHSA Playoff. The 2021 Spring Team graduated 17 Seniors that had won 15 games in 2019 including a 1-0 shutout at Oak Park and River Forest (first in 12 seasons) and went 10-3-1 in the Spring of 2021. Our 2021 Team consisted of: 12 seniors, 10 juniors and 7 sophomores. We were led by Senior, tri captains: Ryan Bero (8 goals, 10 assists), Luigi Mollo and Jack Powers. Powers was named an IHSA All Sectional Player and Chicago Catholic League All Star and was three times named Chicagoland Soccer Player of the Week for Weeks 8,9,10. Ryan was named IHSA Honorable Mention and All Academic Team, Chicago Catholic League All Star and named to the Chicagoland Soccer Player of the Week for Week 1. Sr. Goalkeeper Greg Price was named Chicagoland Soccer Player of the Week for Weeks 3 and 6 for a 2-1 win over Sectional Champ Washington High School and 0-0 Shutout at St. Ignatius. Individual Awards were presented to: Powers and Bero were named Team MVP's; Price was Defender of the Year; Ian Martinello was Newcomer of the Year; and Nick Nelligan was given the Friar Award. The coaches are most proud that this Team was able to show character and strength to manage various challenges to achieve some outstanding performances and victories. We wish our 12 Seniors all the best with their remaining time in 2021 through graduation in 2022 and beyond. They were all such important contributors in creating a successful, positive culture. We look forward to continuing the successful development of the Fenwick Boys Soccer Program to learn from the experiences of the 2021 Season.













My favorite Banua tradition is Banua News! It's such a fun skit that always makes me laugh.



What is your goal at Fenwick?



Your class was the first co-ed class. How did this affect your time at Fenwick? How did being in the first co-ed class prepare you for your future?




PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB




GERMAN CLUB








MATH COMPETITION






STAGE CREW




