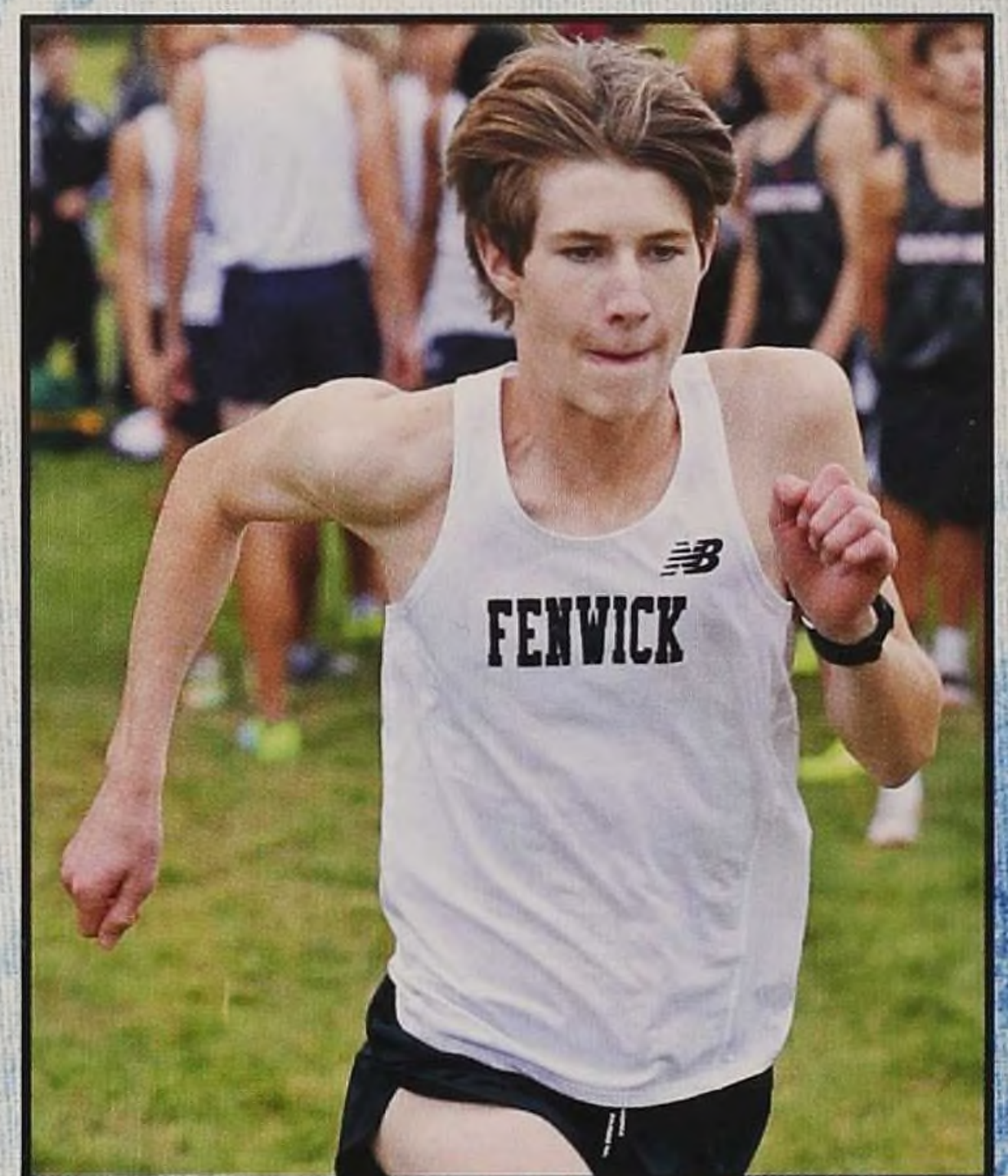

Season Summary

The results of the varsity's 2022 season were the best in team history; they placed 1st in state and Lily Brecknock was Fenwick's first ever state champion in singles! The team placed first at three of their five regular-season invites. In the GCAC Conference, the team went undefeated, losing only one match of 20 in the regular season and repeated the feat in the GCAC tournament, placing first in 4 of 5 flights and second in one. The team went on to win its first ever "perfect" sectional, with 1st and 2nd place finishes in both singles and doubles. At the IHSA State Tournament, the team tied the record for number of points scores, at 39, and was the first team ever to win the most points in both singles and doubles. All six of the Friars' state players finished in the top 8, led by 1st and 4th places in singles and 6th and 7th places in doubles.



The Friars' took home an enormous first place trophy at the IHSA State Tournament! This is the first tennis state championship ever won in Fenwick history. The Friars broke numerous records and had its first ever state champion, Lily Brecknock, who took first place in singles.

Season Summary

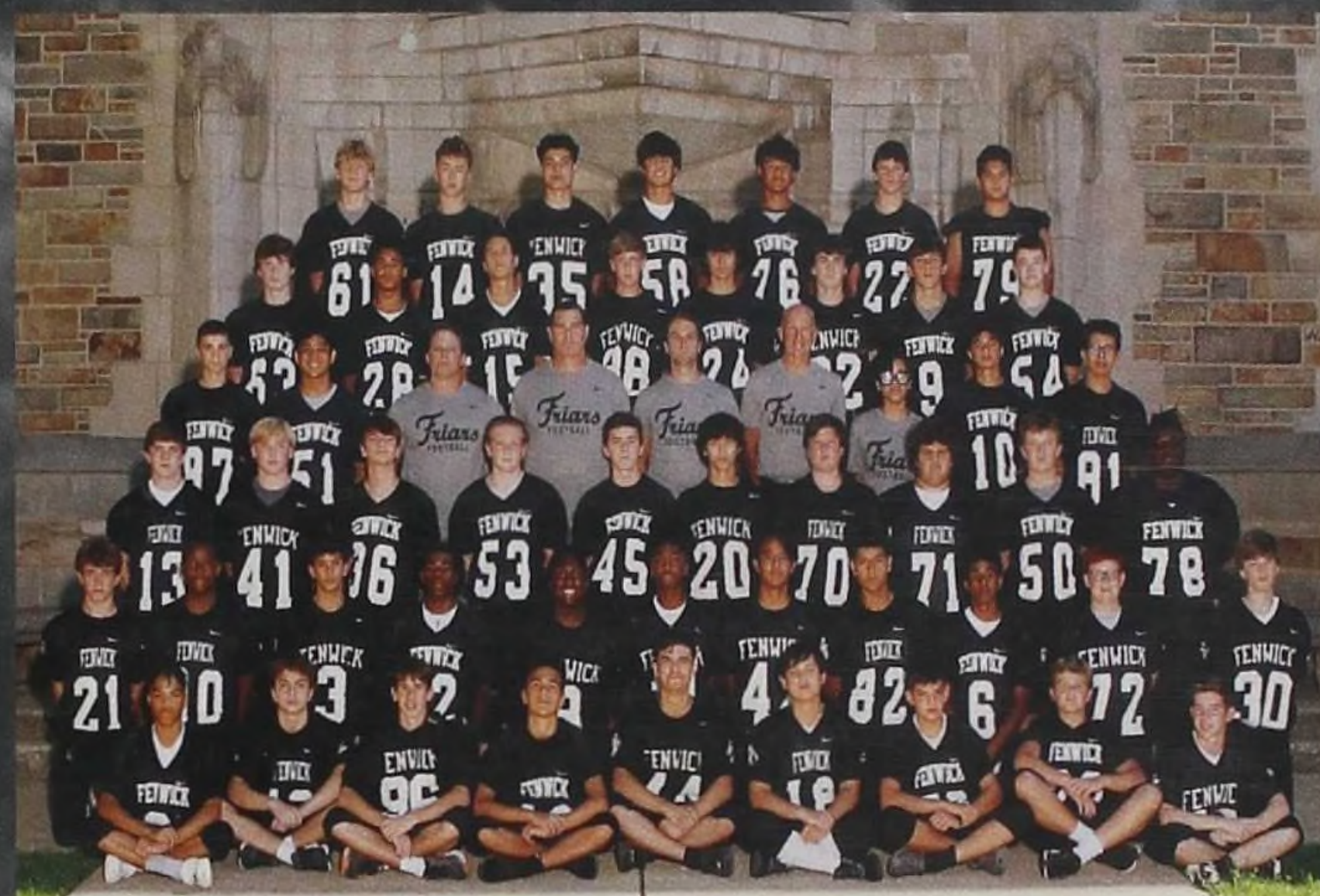
The Freshman and Sophomore Teams are both Chicago Catholic League White Division Champions. The Freshman Team finished 8-0-1, winning the league! The Sophomore Team won their division, finishing 7-2. The future is bright for Fenwick Football. 7 Friars were named Chicago Catholic League All-Conference Team: Lukas Mikuzis '23, Luke D'Alise '24, Patrick Durkin '23, Joep Engbers '23, Nate Marshall '25, and Aaron Johnson '23. Following the 2021 5A State Championship Season, the Varsity Football Team had high aspirations for the 2022 Football Season. There was buzz and energy around town as the crosstown rivalry with Oak Park River Forest High School was reborn with the first contest being played between the two schools in over 30 years. Things started slow with a tough defeat at SeatGeek Stadium to the local rivals but the team did not let that derail the season. Instead the 2022 Friars learned and grew as a team and a family throughout the year, playing with great effort, heart, and character that embodied the great tradition of Fenwick Football. The team "locked the doors" with big wins at the end of the season that gave them a chance to win the CCL/ESCC White Championship and another playoff berth. The IHSA Playoff run for the Friars ended with a 14-6 defeat to Morgan Park, ending the season with a 5-5 record, but Head Coach Matt Battaglia could not have been prouder of the way the team supported each other and never gave up. The Friars bounced back as a team and went on to compete in the 2022 Prep Bowl.

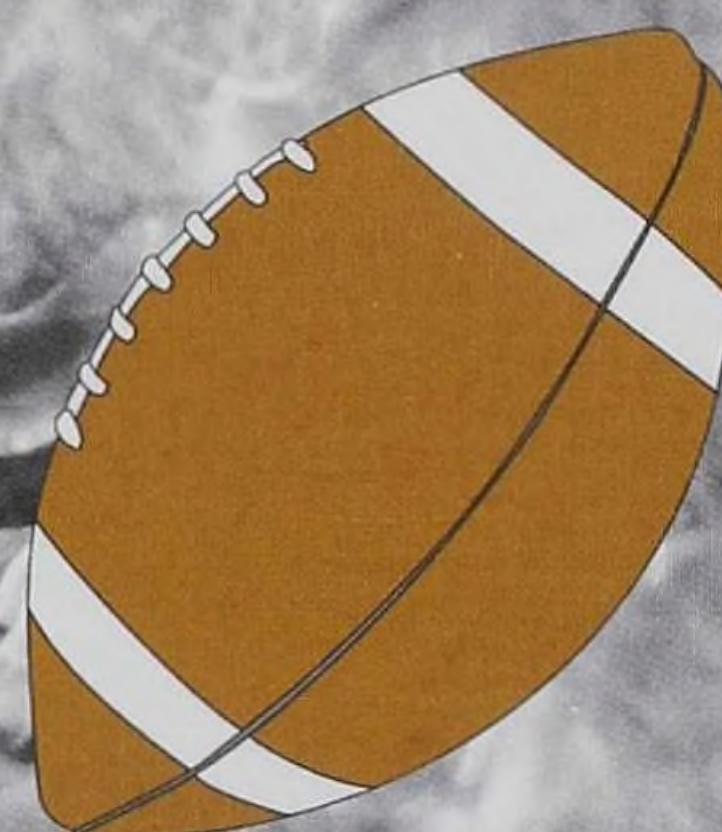

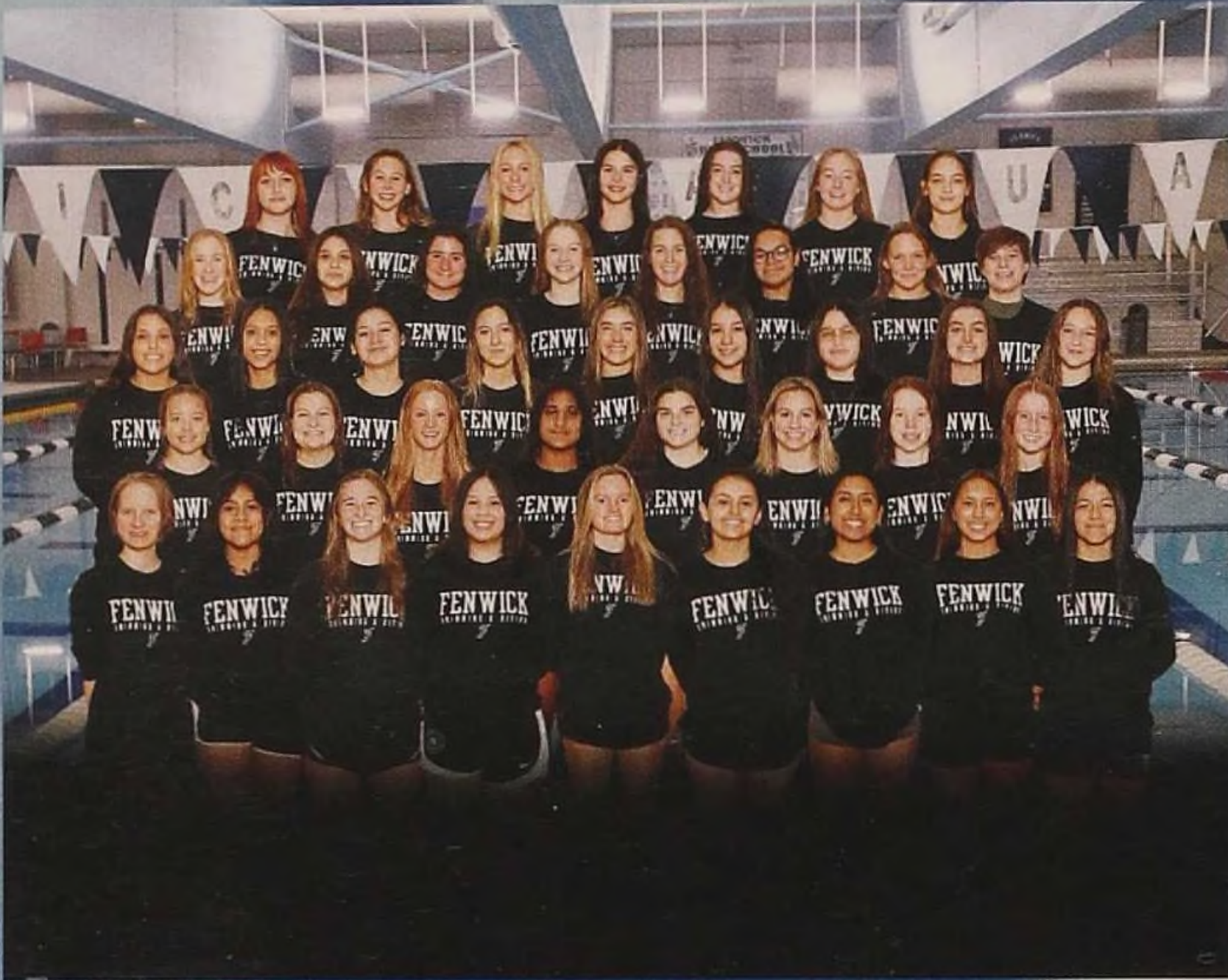

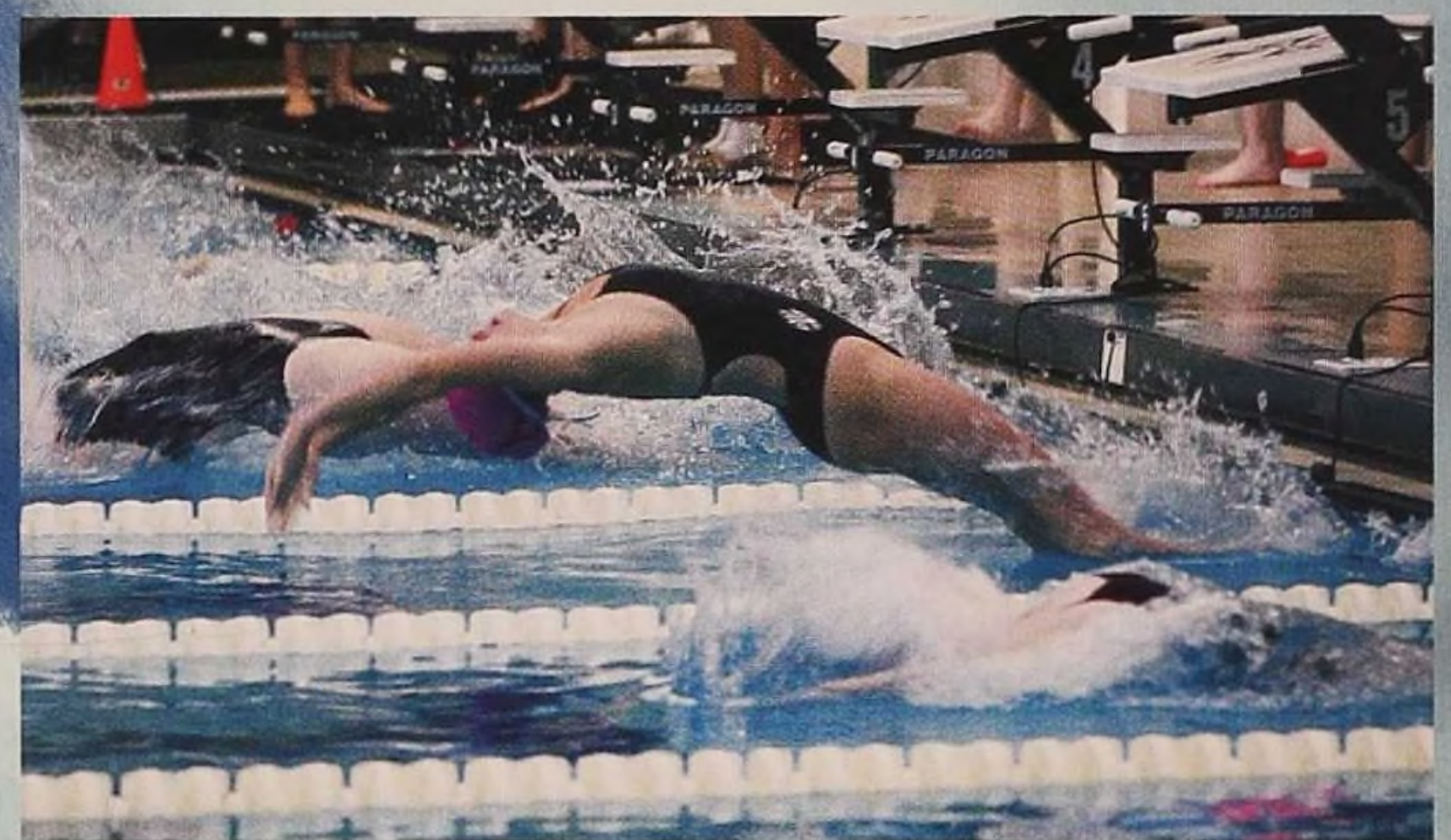
JV:

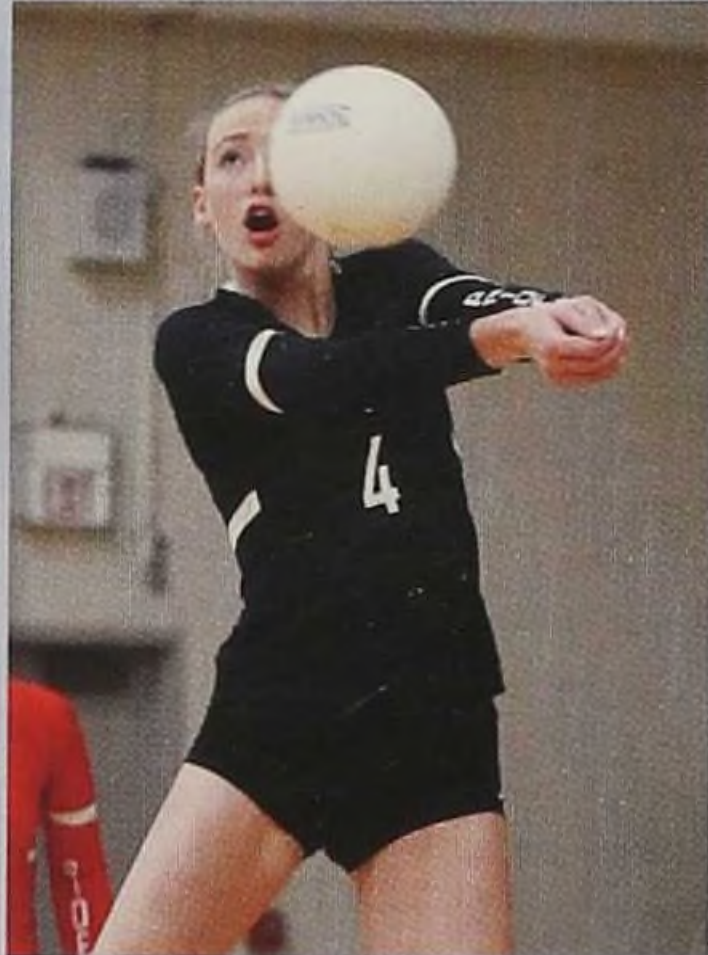
Season Summary

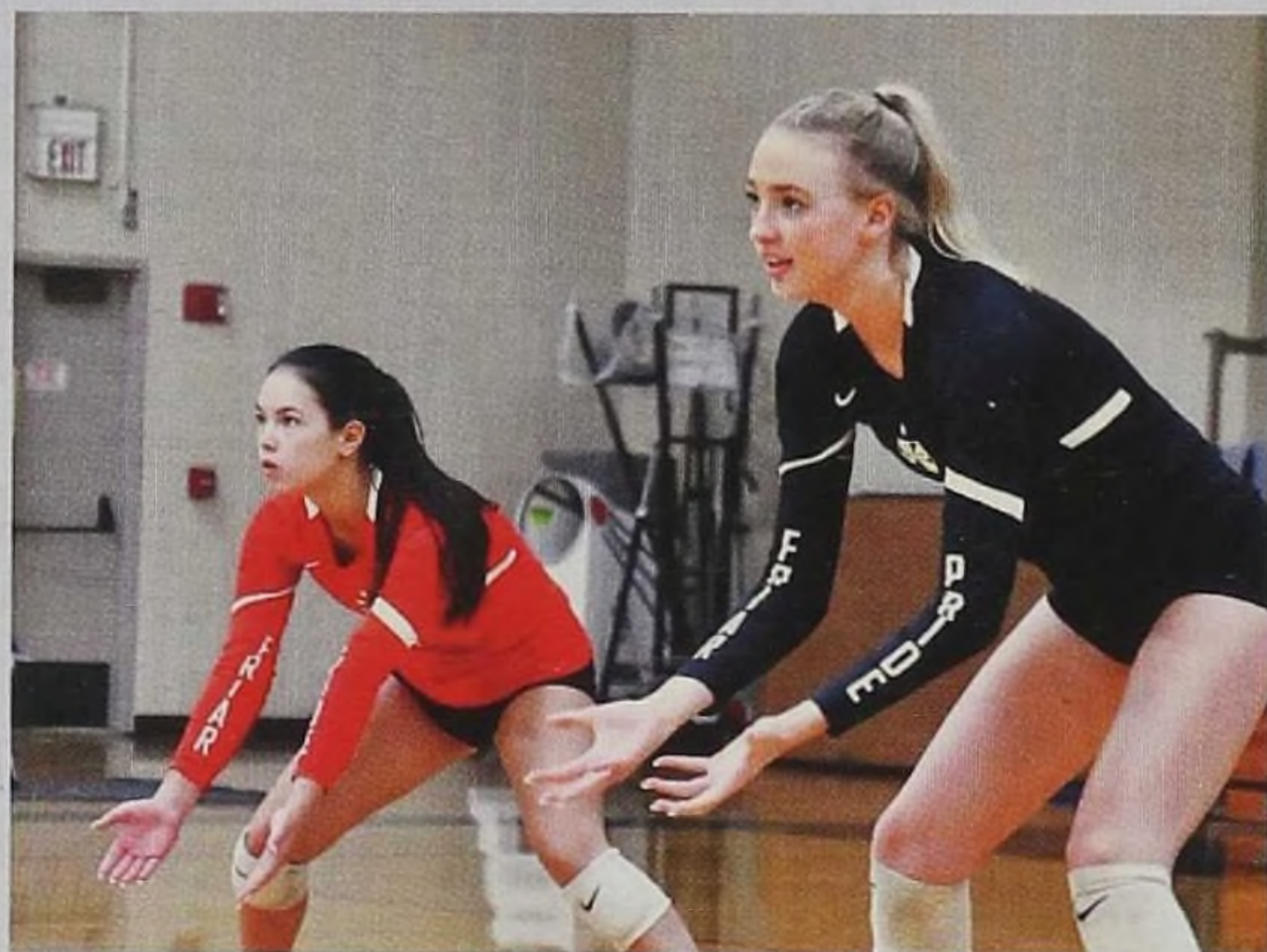
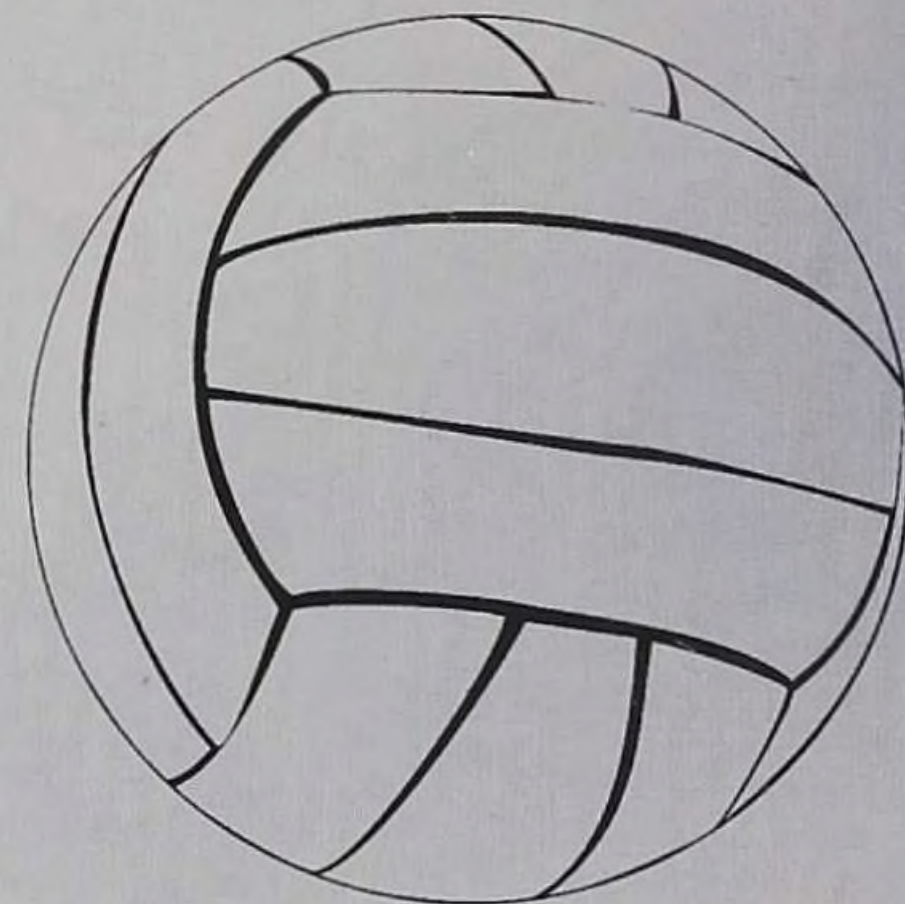

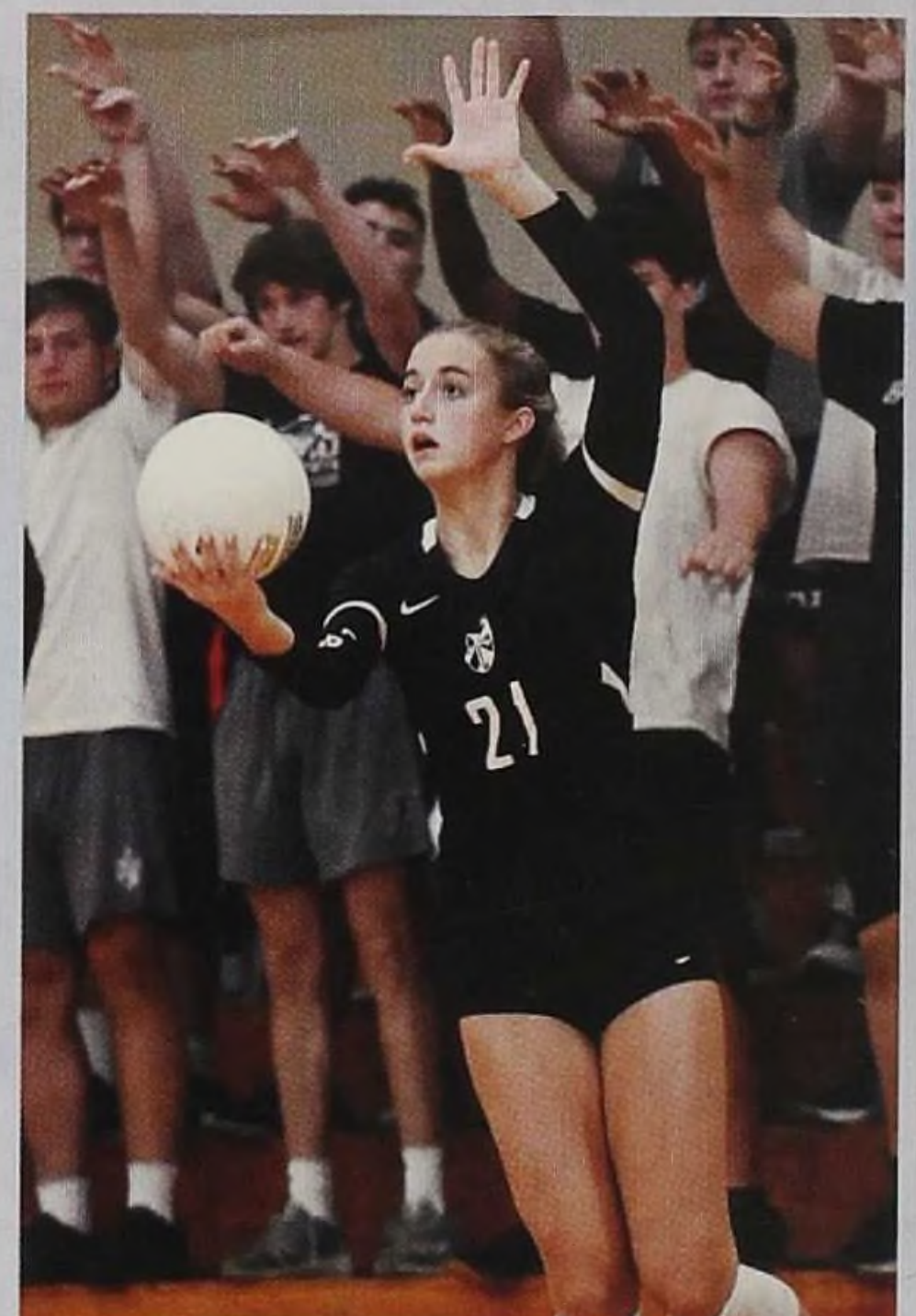

The Girls' Golf team finished the regular season with a 9-2 record. The girls defeated rivals OPRF and St. Ignatius College Prep not once, but twice this season!

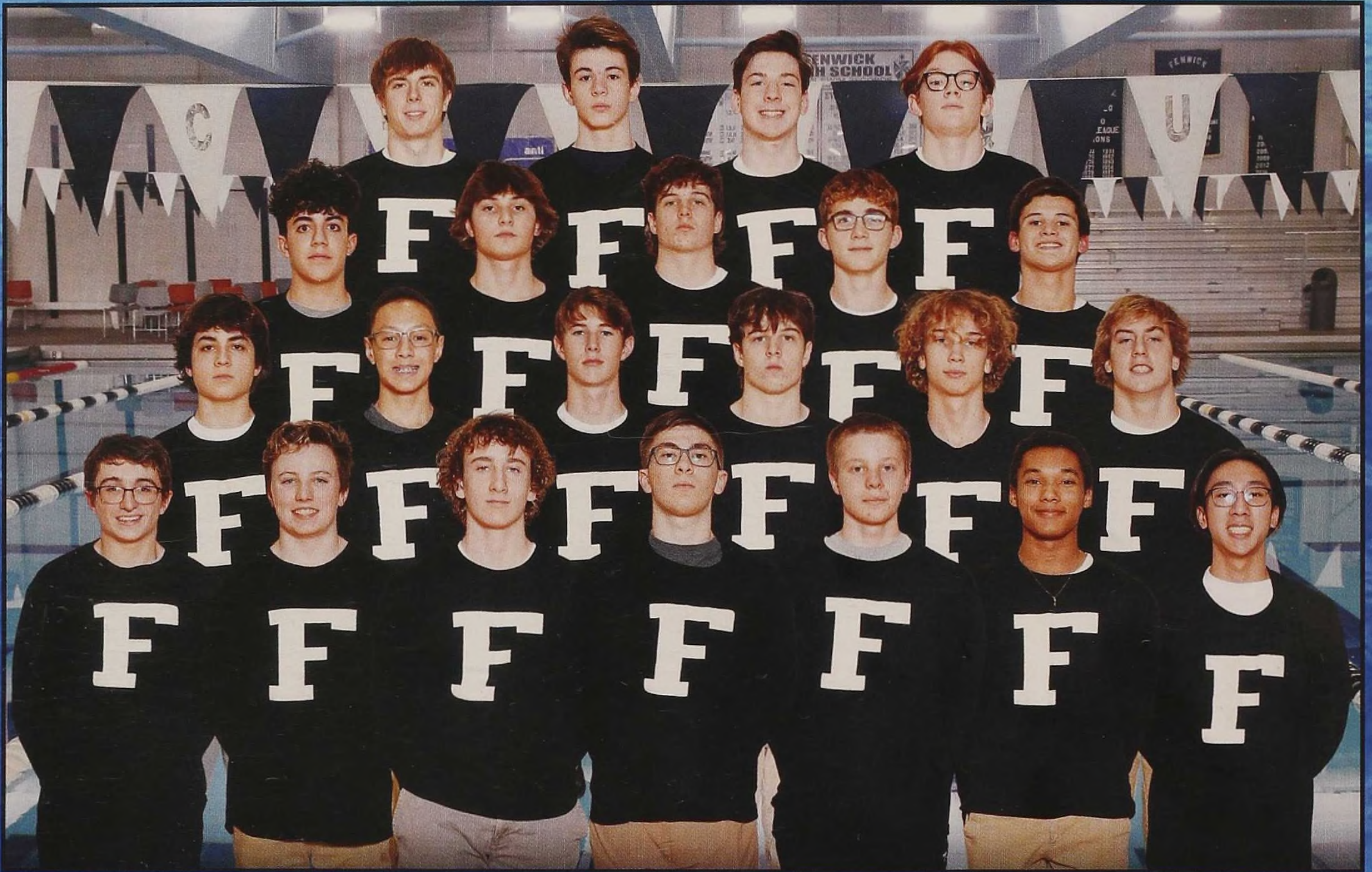

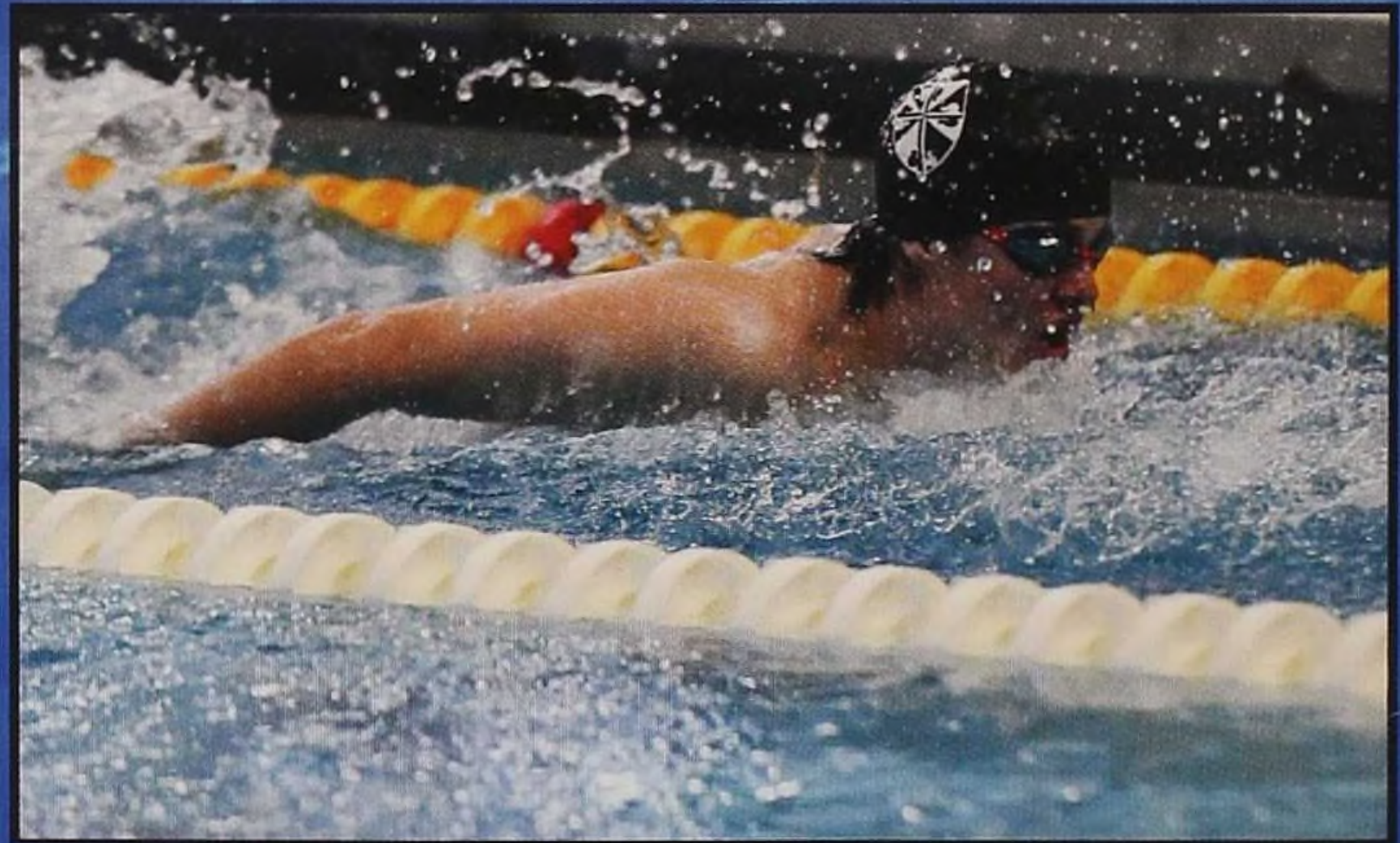

Season Summary:

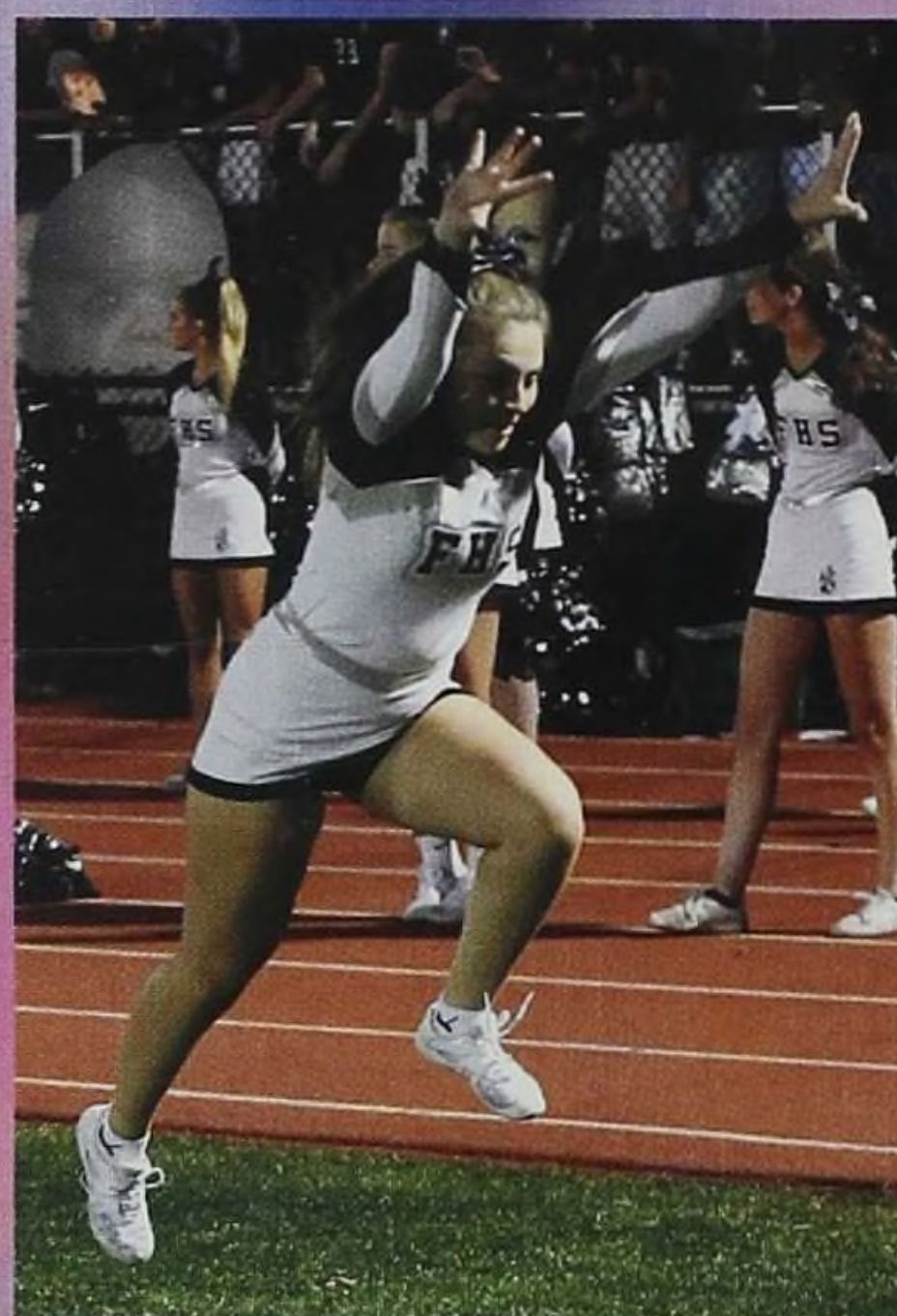

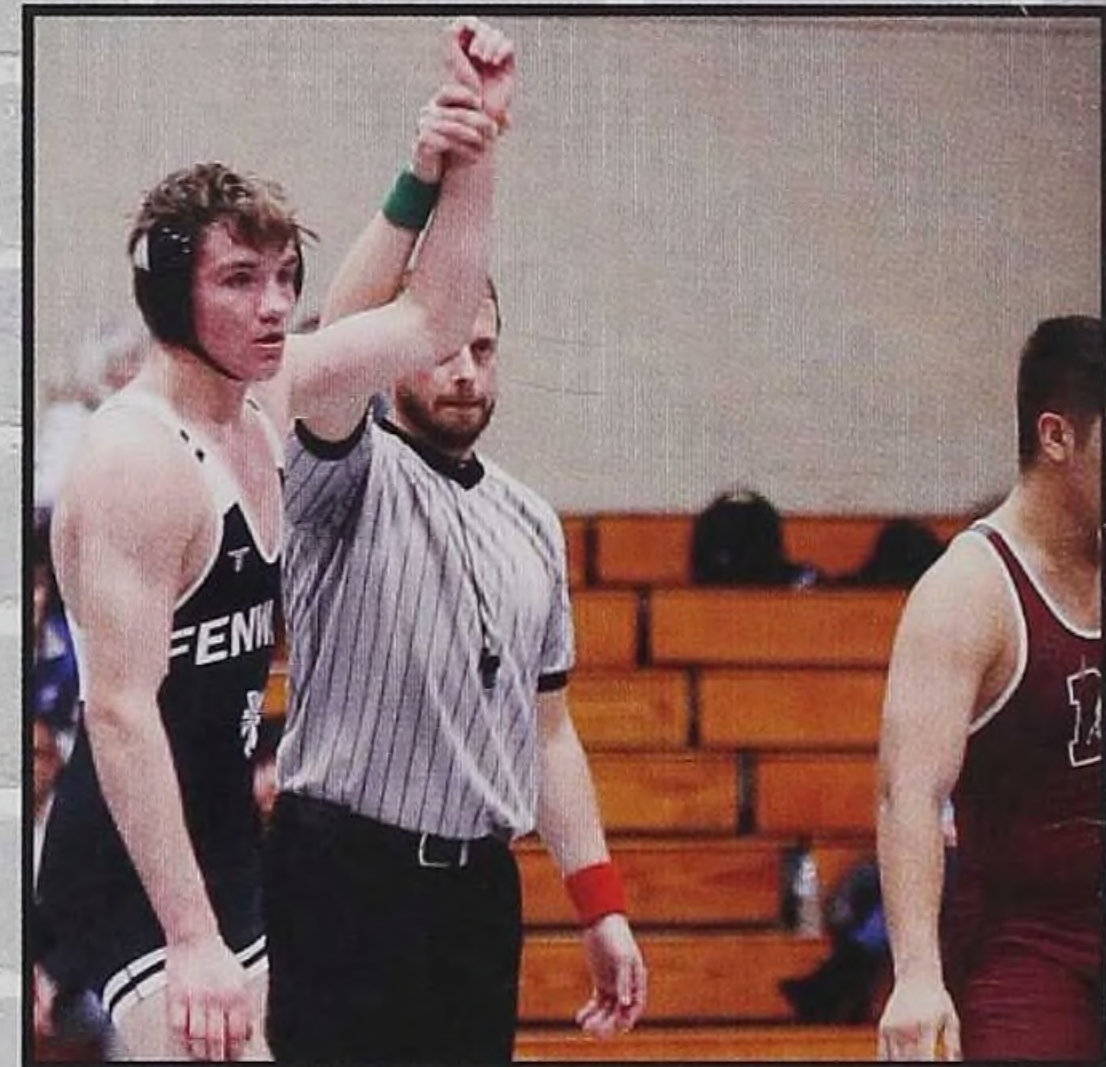

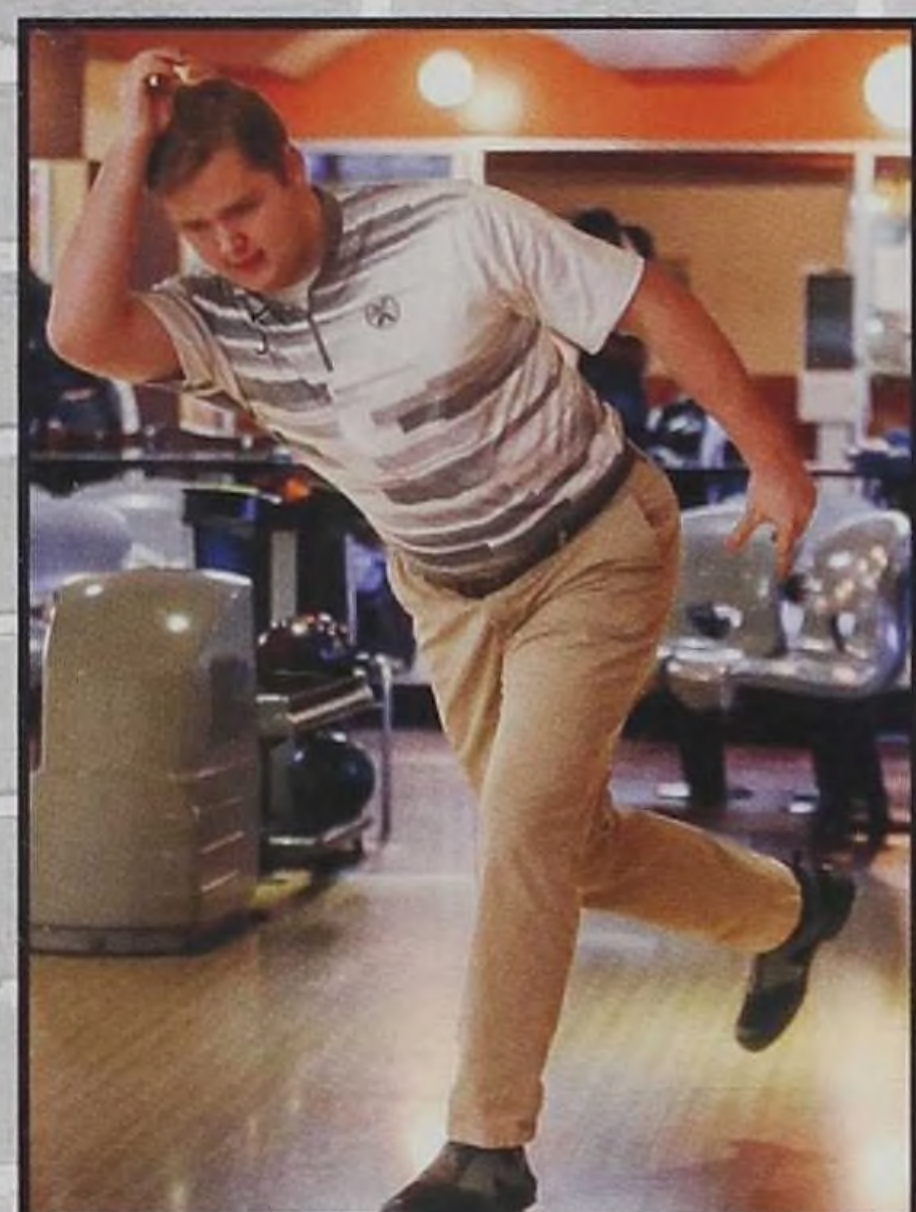

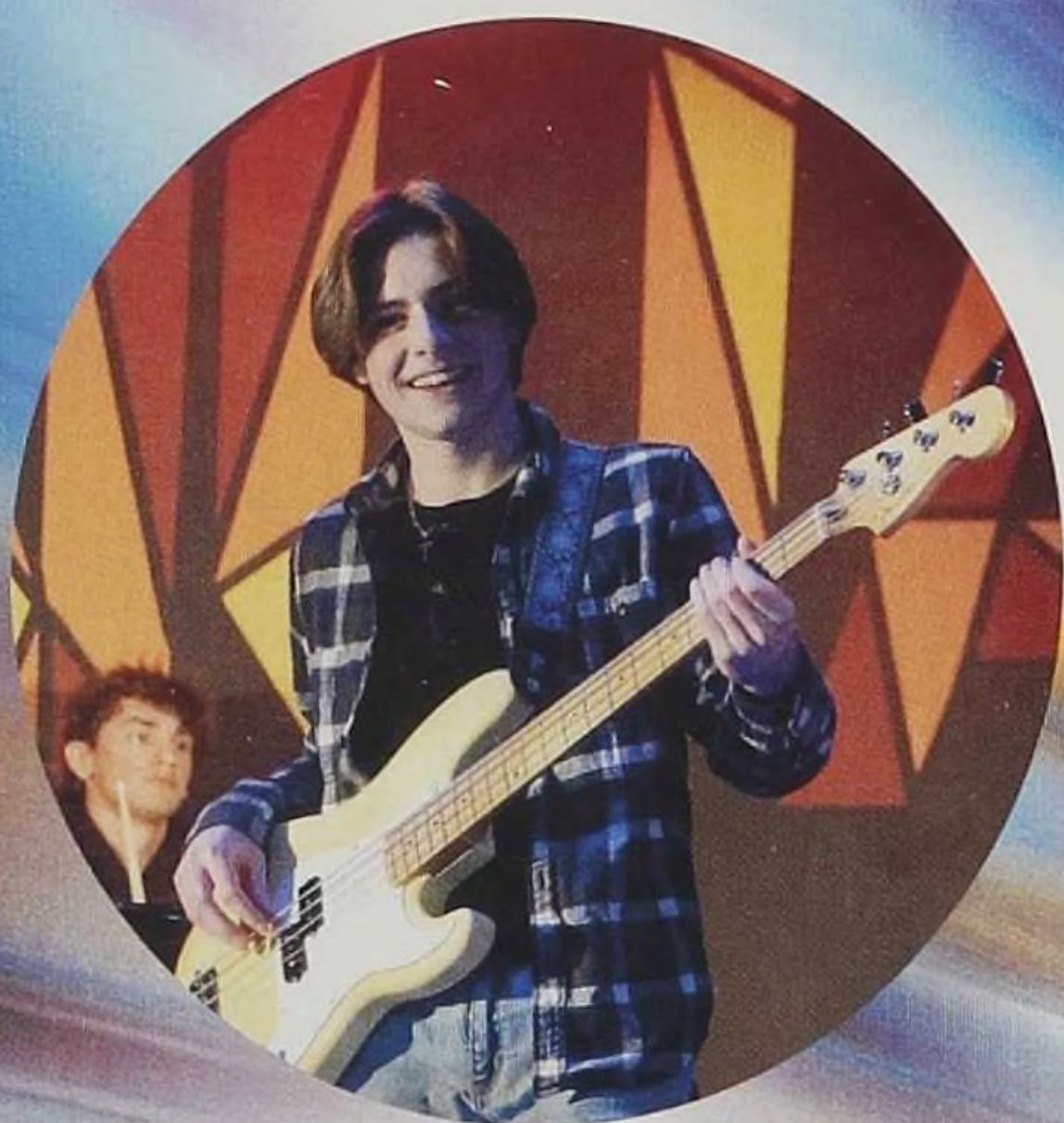

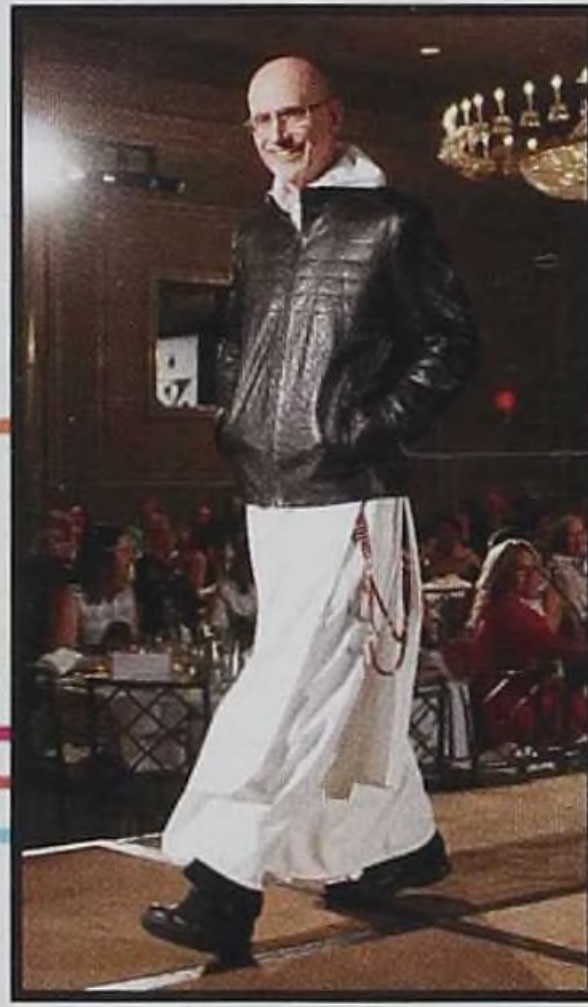


Photography Club

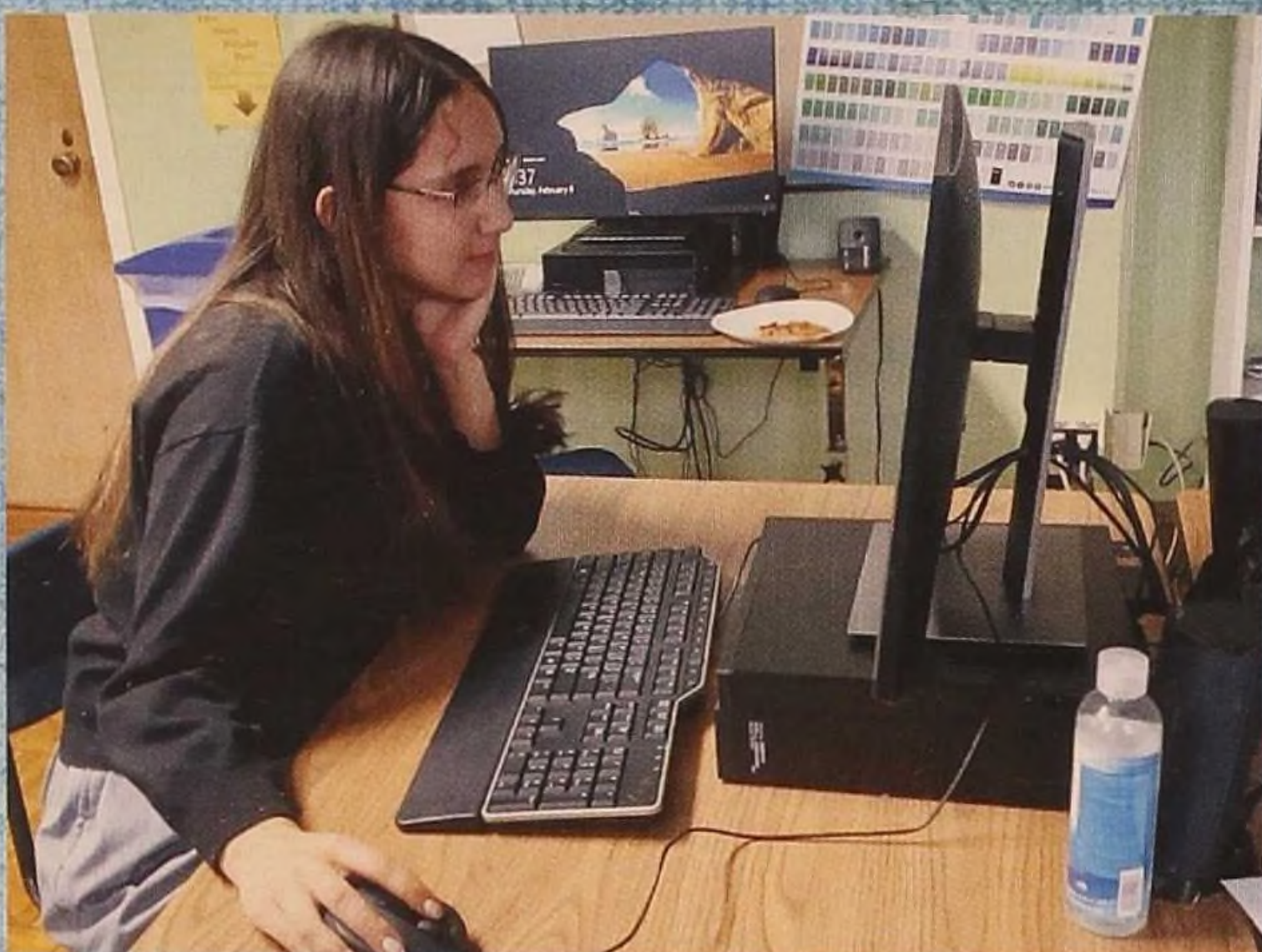


The Wick

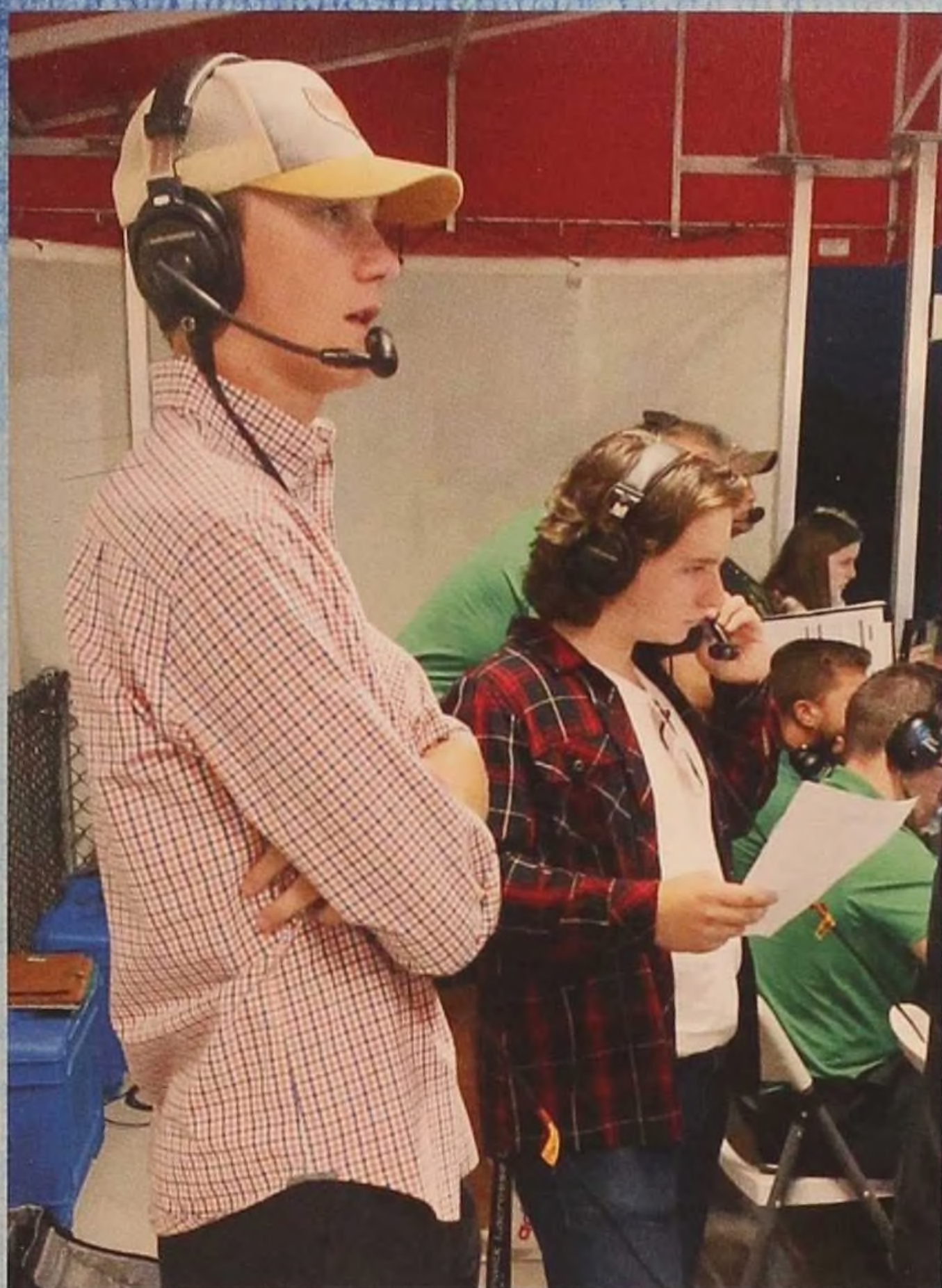

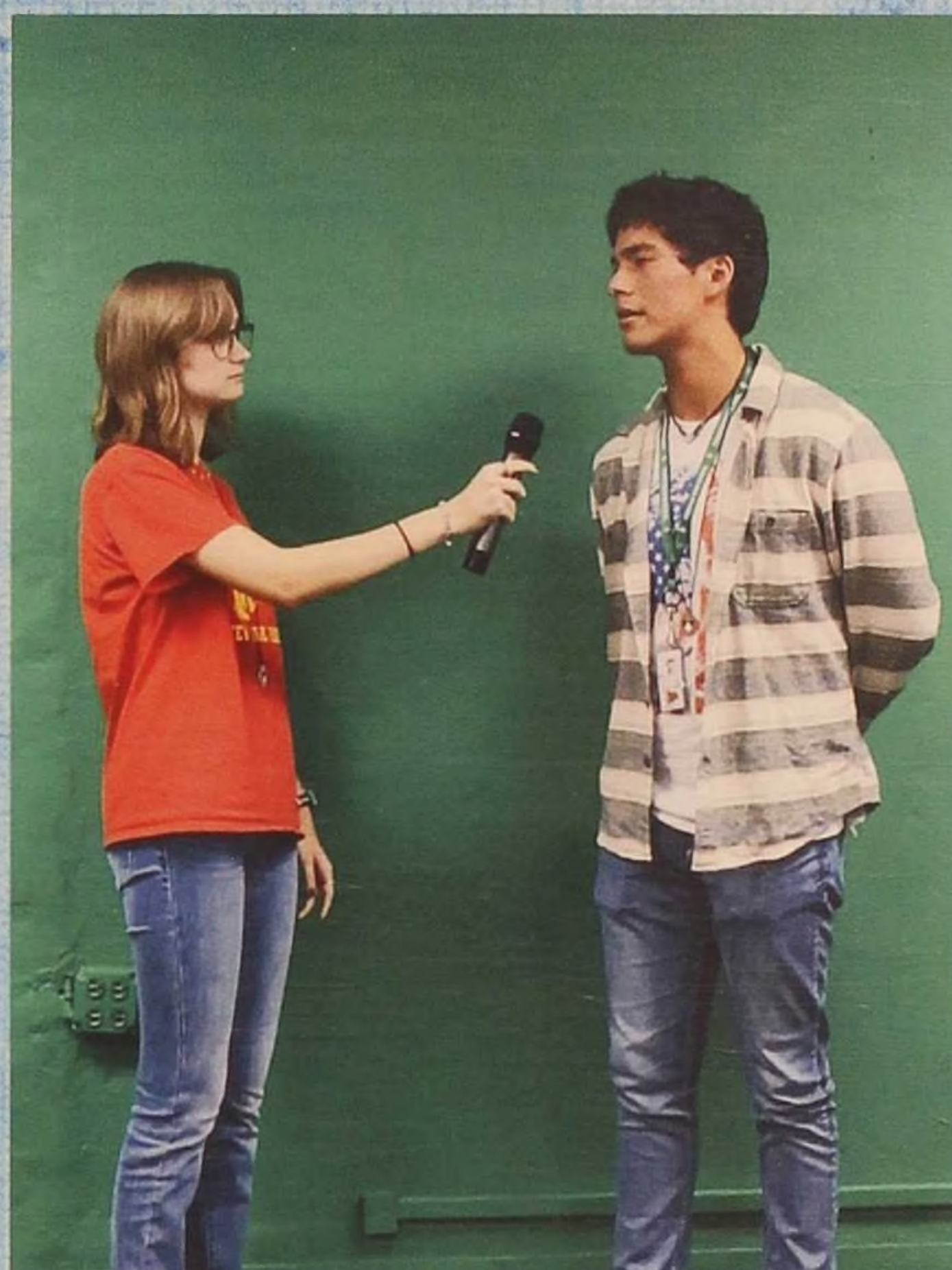

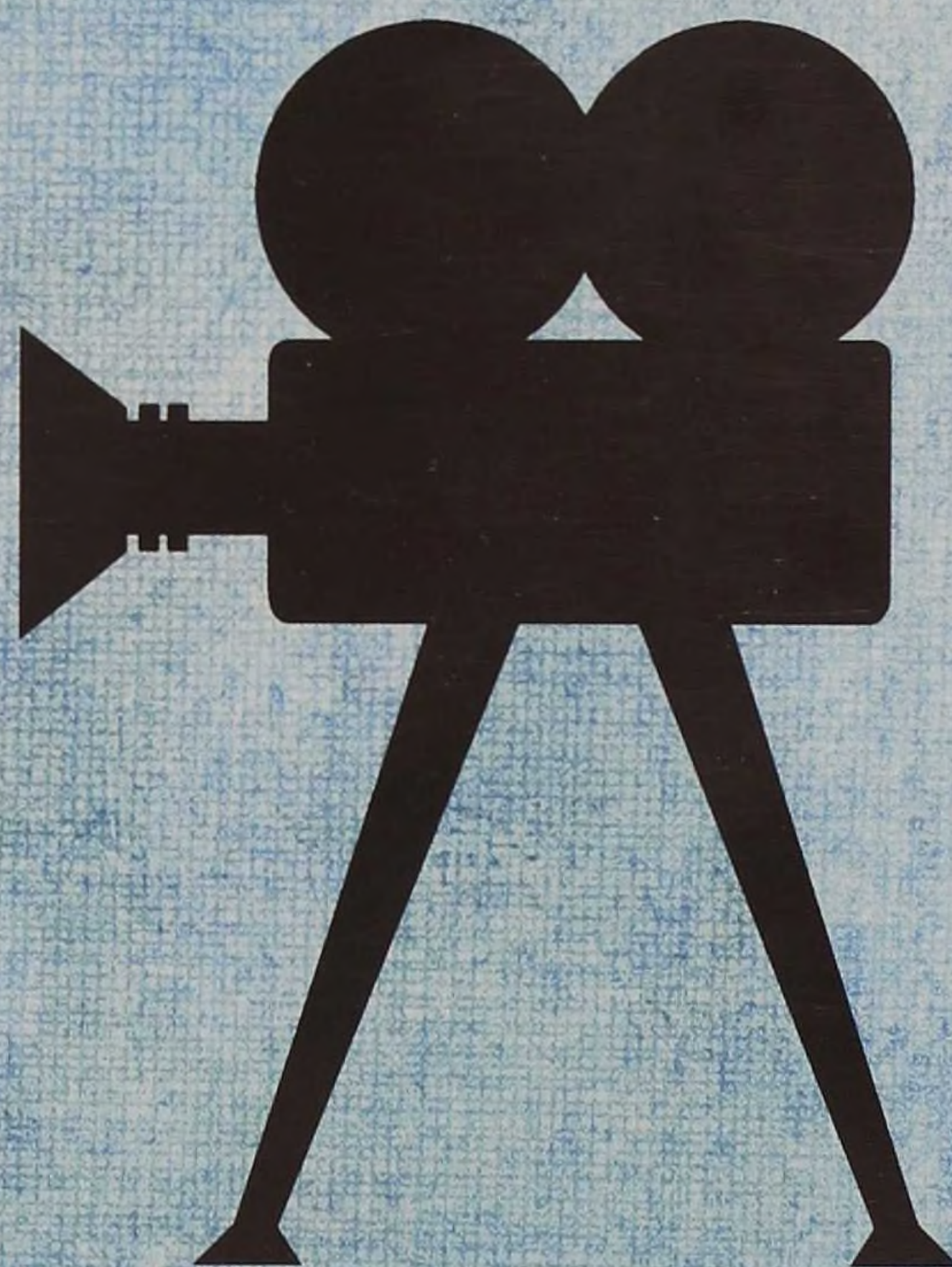

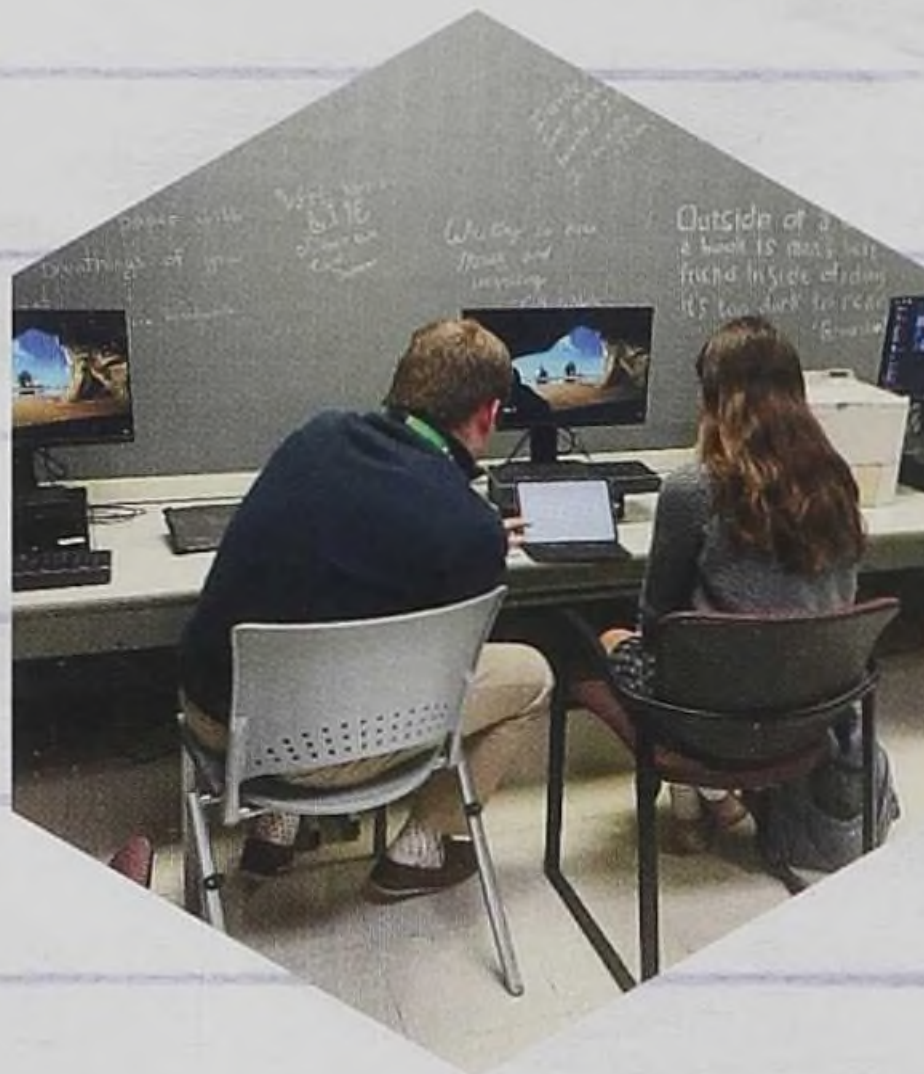
Best Buddies

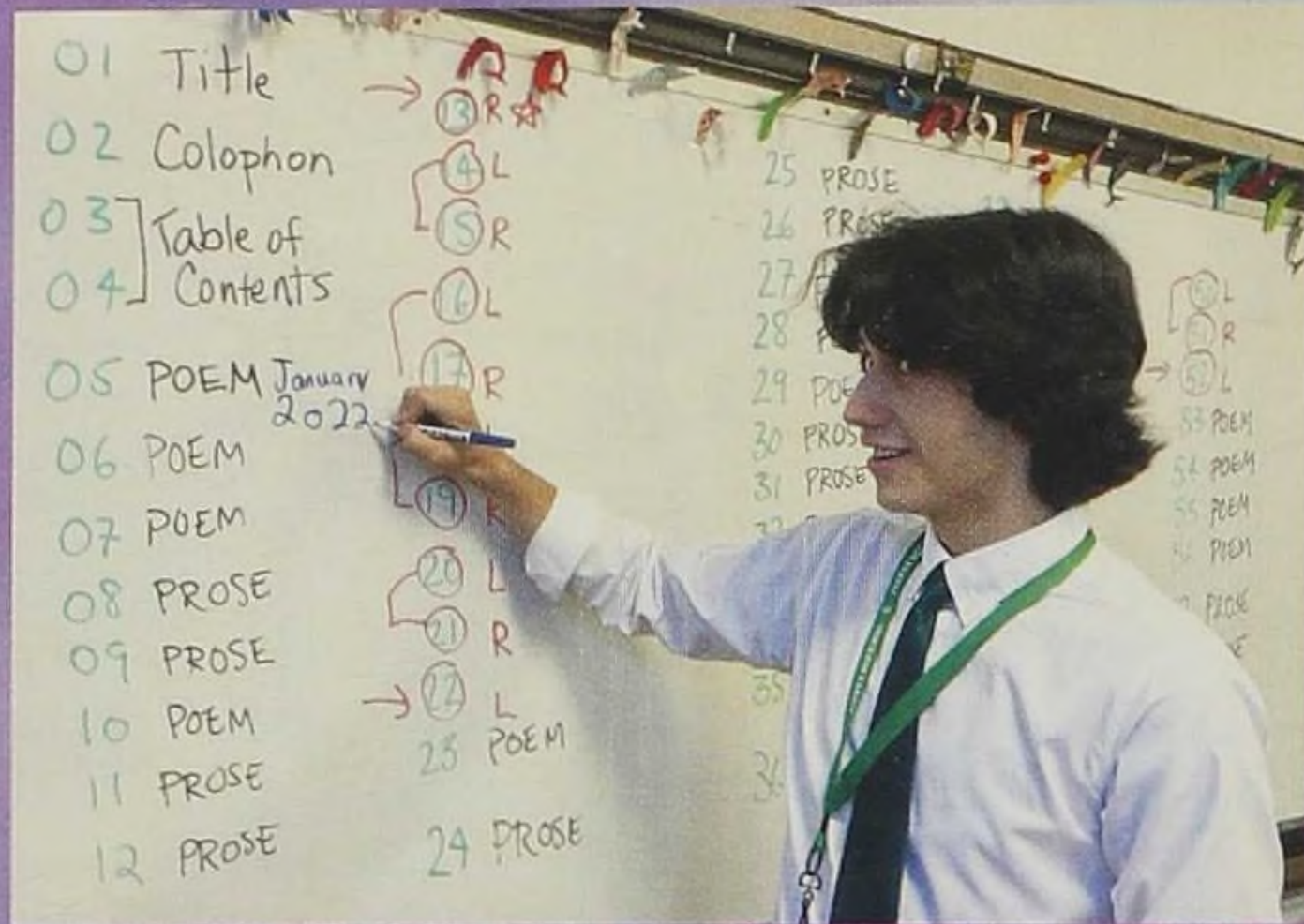

Leviathan Book Club

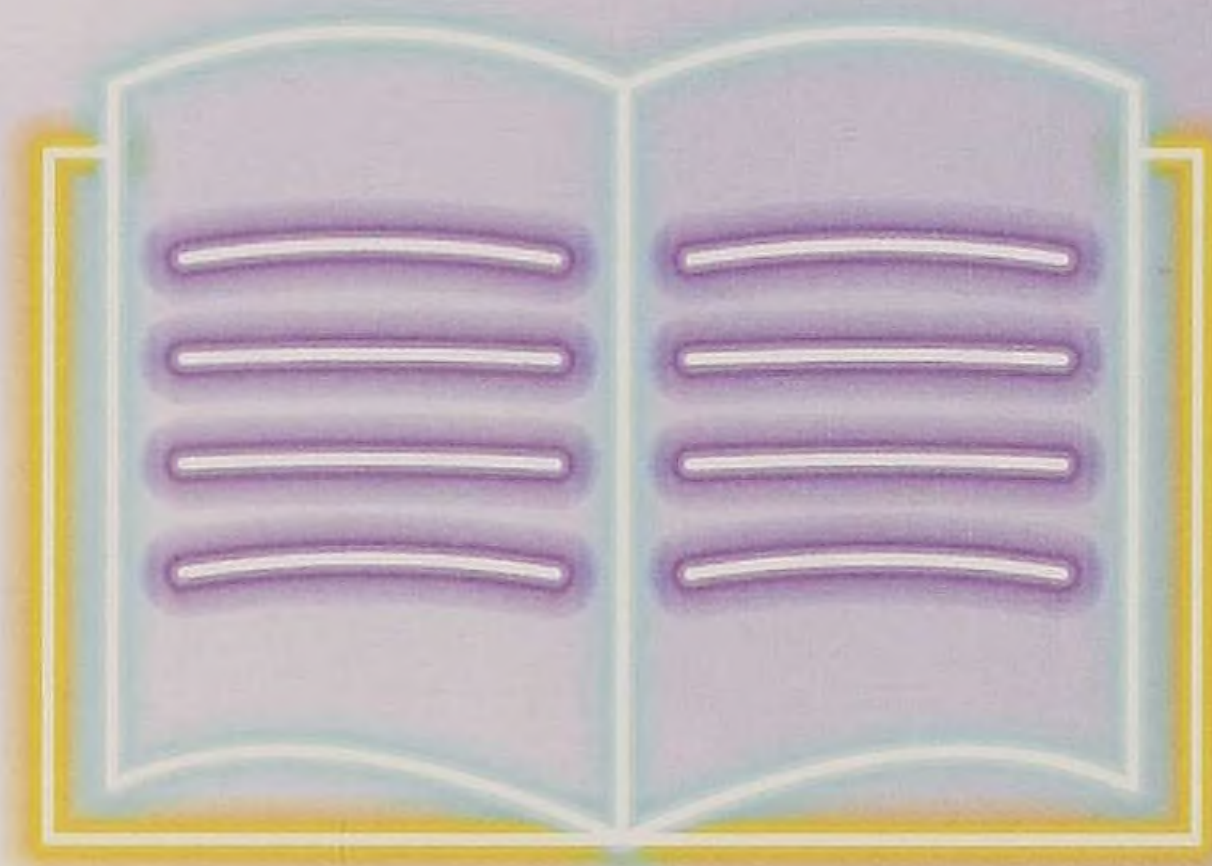

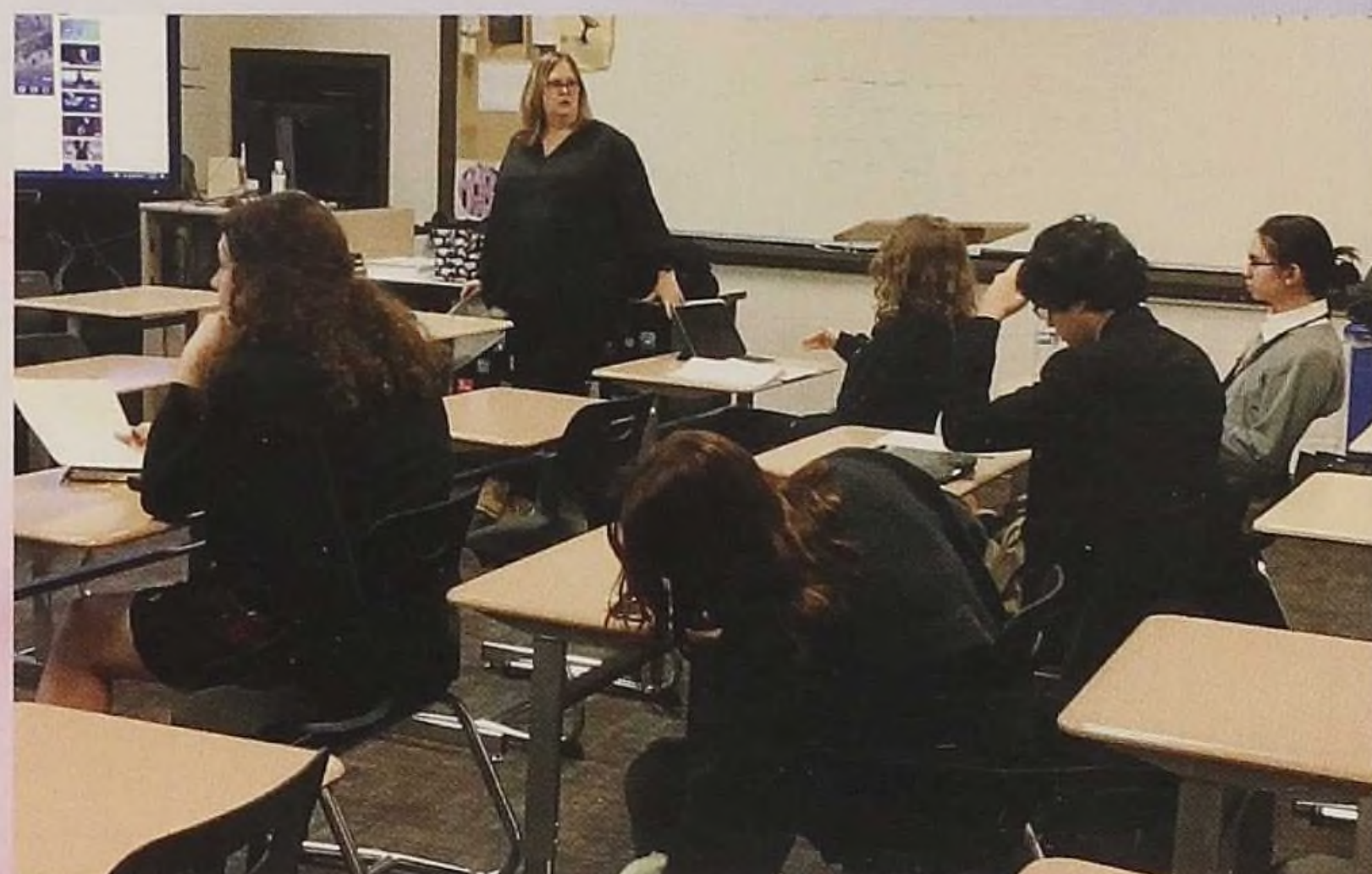

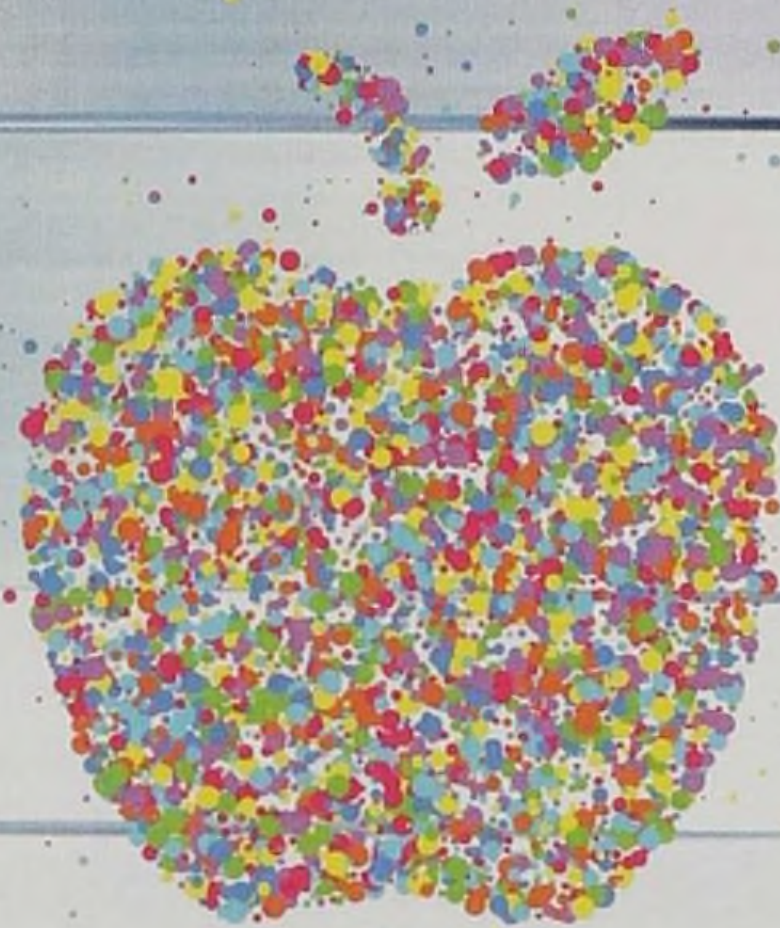

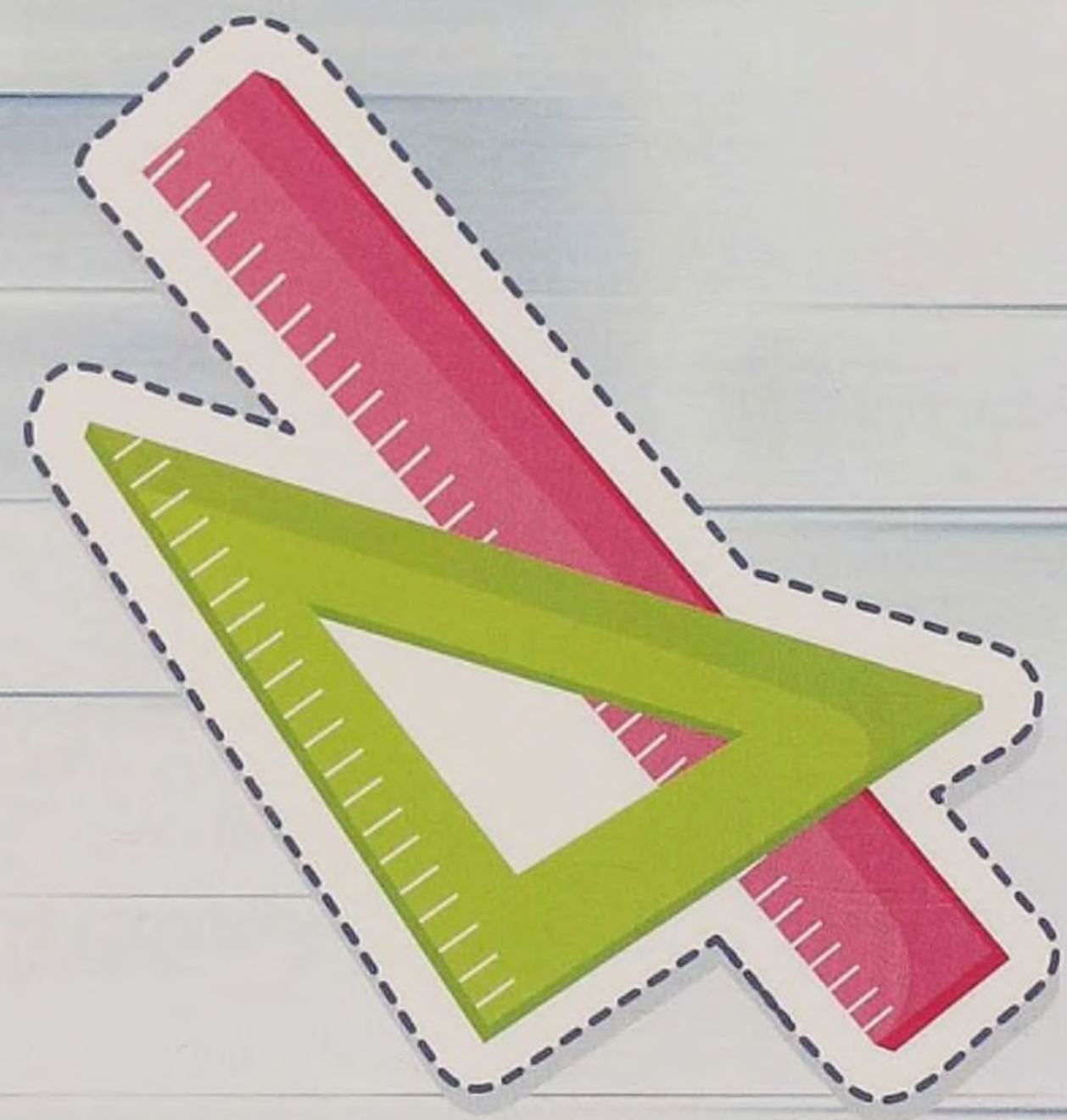

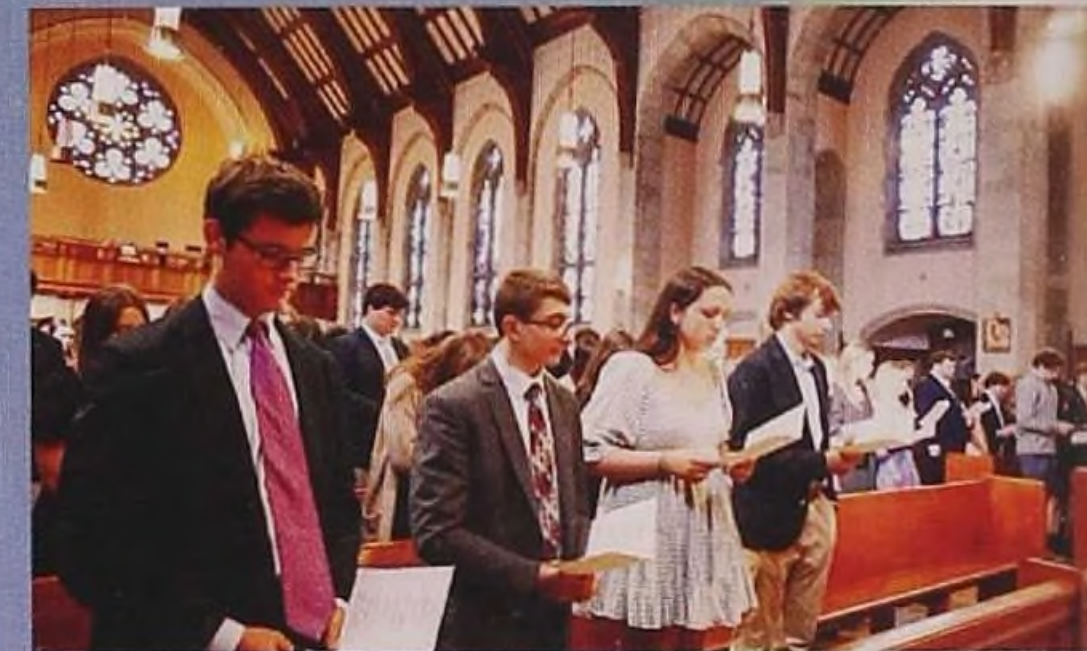
